- 5. It is the expectation of the Board that communications between participants and the Board will remain positive and focused around the best interest of the student(s) and the district as a whole. All communications from all stakeholders shall be conducted with mutual respect and civility. The Board will not condone communications and interactions that can be perceived as harassing, insulting, threatening, or lacking in respect or civility.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Garibay reported:

- The NJSBA Steam Tank Challenge is a Statewide innovation, creative, entrepreneurship challenge which is embedded in our Fifth grade curriculum. The projects that are created are put forward with the permission of the parents to the competition. Twenty-two (22) Colts Neck teams submitted projects in the fall and Excited to announce that ten (10) of them have been chosen to go on to the second round. The second round will be virtual in May and if teams move forward from the second round, they will compete at the NJSBA Annual Workshop in the Fall. Congratulations to Mr. Capasso, Mrs. Rogers and all of the teams for making it.
- Congratulations to Dr. Reynolds, Administration, and staff for a successful professional development day on Monday. Staff volunteered and collaborated to facilitate sessions on student engagement, which is very important. The main session for staff was using Student Voice to Move from Engagement to

Empowerment; this was a very meaningful session. In the Fall 2022 Sandy Jenkins, representative from the Schlechty Center, conducted student interviews, 10 students from every school and provided their responses to the teachers.

- Attended our mid-year budget review with SBA Mr. Marasco on January 12th with NJDOE County Superintendent, Educational Specialist and County Business Administrator. As part of this meeting, we were required to prepare and submit responses to questions and information to be included within the review of efficiency standards in accordance with statutory code. Will share this information with the Finance Committee at the next meeting.
- This year Dr. Reynolds and Dr. Beck will be facilitating a district report card committee for grades K-5. The committee will discuss standard based report cards. This is a way to develop a more meaningful communication tool for parents.
- We are continuing to monitor the Opt-Out, which is available to parents on specific • health lessons. With respect to Grade 8, out of 52 total students, only one (1) opted out. Will continue to report out on this throughout the course of the year.
- March 23rd at 4pm at Brookdale, there is a joint venture between the Monmouth • County Superintendents Roundtable and the Monmouth County NJEA; panel discussion for school leaders and teacher union leaders that is titled "Mental Health in our Schools and Community." This was put together due to the tragic loss of life from suicide of two (2) educators that occurred in the fall.
- February 23rd symposium with Monmouth County Superintendents partnership for Wellness; this is available for students in grades 6-12, parents, and any community members. More information will be shared with the school community.
- Working with Dr. Beck and Merri Milano for the coordination of the first meeting of • the District Wellness Committee; an invitation to participate in the committee will be emailed to the school community on Monday. The first meeting is scheduled for February 7th. The goals of the committee are outlined in Policy 8530. By the end of this week will be sending out a mid-year lunch menu survey to the community.
