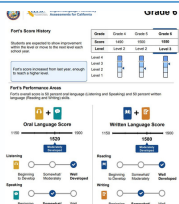

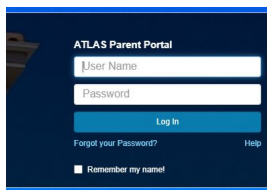
What is ELPAC?

ELPAC stands for the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California. It's a set of assessments used to evaluate how well students who are learning English as a second language are acquiring English language skills.



What is reported on ELPAC Student Score Reports?

Your child's individualized results from the annual ELPAC assessments.



How to access your child's ELPAC Score Reports?

Parents can access their child's report by logging onto the ATLAS Parent Portal. If you do not have access to the portal, please contact your child's school.



How are my child's results used for learning?

Students who speak multiple languages have many strengths, but they may also need extra support in the classroom while learning in English. Your child's score report is broken down into different skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English. This information is used to identify where your child is doing well and where they may need more support.



How can I help my child?

- Practice English together.
- Continue literacy and language development in your home language.
- Instead of asking your child to translate school documents or conversations, ask the school for a staff member to translate.
- Find out about your child's school English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC) meetings.
