



Bystanders are individuals who observe events without actively participating or intervening. By contrast, upstanders are individuals who actively intervene or speak out against injustice, oppression, or wrongdoing. Which characters are bystanders in *Fahrenheit 451* and which characters are upstanders? What is Ray Bradbury trying to say about going along with the crowd versus standing up for yourself and what's right?




1. Define liberty in your own words.

Purpose: During the first week of school, students will be working on an in-class project about the book.



Honor Code




