How Cold is Too Cold to Go Outside?

Students are outside for recess unless the temperature falls below 22 degrees (21 degrees or below), according to our school weather station Weatherbug. You might consider downloading the WeatherBug app so you can check the latest conditions at our school in real time.

As quoted on page 12 in our Lincoln Academy Family Handbook:

"Please send students dressed appropriately for the weather. Students will go outside on cold days, so please send your child prepared for these conditions. Students remain outside unless the temperature goes below 22 degrees, there is excessive precipitation or extreme heat.

Lincoln Academy will close if weather-related conditions close the Jefferson County Public Schools. In addition to the Jeffco automated phone calls regarding weather closures, this notification will be broadcast over the radio (KOA 850) and major local television stations ABC, CBS, and NBC. Updates can also be found on the <u>Jefferson County School's</u> website."

If there is a call for a 2 Hour Delay due to weather, there will be no breakfast served at school. We will only do our regular lunch service on delayed start days.


