PTO is looking to fill some leadership roles for the next school year. If you're excited about getting more involved, please check out the following positions on Track It Forward:

Community Night Organizer (can be more than 1 person): PTO is looking for a new Community Night Organizer. This volunteer position takes approx 5-6 hours in June/July to contact local restaurants (all contacts provided) and then 1 hr each month to confirm details and coordinate payment to school.

Watch DOGS leads (can be more than 1 person): approx 1-2 hr per month, depending on number of volunteers. This volunteer serves as a contact for anyone who signs up for Watch DOGS; coordinates volunteers with the front office; helps lead a kick-off meeting in September; and emails Watch DOGS volunteers when the school has specific needs (Grandparents' Day, Fall Fest, shoveling, etc.)
