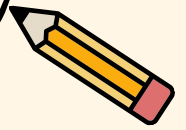

Dear Piney Ridge Families,

In March, we honor Youth Art Month and Music in Our Schools Month. We want to take this time to celebrate the work our students do to express themselves artistically and musically. We also want to thank our Art teachers, Ms. Evans and Ms. Midkiff, as well as our Music teachers, Ms. Thomas and Mr. Dundore for their work to inspire our students.

During the remaining weeks of the school year, most students will participate in a field trip. Field trips are opportunities for students to visit, view, and experience in-person learning opportunities that are connected to the curriculum. In order for a student to be marked present in school and to participate on a field trip, the student must ride the bus to and from the venue with their class and teachers. Depending on the location and nature of the trip, teachers may request volunteer chaperones to assist with supervision. Any chaperone must have completed the CCPS volunteer training module, and pass a background check prior to the date chaperones are chosen. Please keep in mind that the training and background check process can take up to 7 school days, and teachers often choose chaperones several days before a trip. Details about each field trip are shared on the permission slip that teachers will send home.

Our Lost & Found is growing. Several students have left behind jackets, hats, gloves, lunch bags, water bottles, and more. If you believe your child has lost an item at school, please encourage the child to check out the Lost & Found rack in the cafeteria. If items are labeled with a student's name, then staff will attempt to reunite the item with that student. Otherwise, when the Lost & Found becomes too full, the items will be donated or discarded.

A Note from the Nurse



National Poison Prevention Education is during the Month of March.

The Maryland Poison Center provides emergency assessment of poison exposures, treatment recommendations, education and prevention. The Maryland Poison Center is the first place to call in the event of a suspected poisoning.

What you need to know about Poison Proofing

Each year, thousands of children and adults in Maryland experience potentially toxic exposures to common household products such as medicines, insect sprays, cleaners, paints, garden products, car products and personal care products. The Maryland Poison Center, a division of the University Of Maryland School Of Pharmacy, is a 24-hour telephone service available to help if a poisoning occurs in your home. Many of these poisonings can be prevented.

Here are some ideas to poison-proof your home and keep you and your children safe:

- Read and follow directions on the label before using drugs and household products.
- Store all drugs, poisons and harmful household products out of the sight and reach of children; preferably in a locked cabinet.
- Keep all household products and drugs in their original containers. Never put chemicals or cleaning products in empty food or drink containers.
- Always ask for medicine in child-resistant containers (safety-lock tops), but remember that these are not child-proof. Given enough time, children can often open safety caps.
 - Don't take medicine in front of children and never tell children that medicine is candy.
- Remove poisonous plants from the house and yard. Know the names of plants in and around your home.
- Teach small children never to touch or put anything in their mouth unless they ask a grown-up.
- Put medicines away in their proper place after each dose even if it will be given again in a few hours.
 - Never mix household cleaning products together.
- Program the number in your cell phone...you can reach a poison center anywhere in the US by dialing 1-800-222-1222.

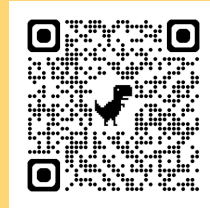

Information on Pre-K
Registration Below!

Kindergarten Registration March 24-28, 2025

Kindergarten is mandatory in the State of Maryland. Your child must be 5 years of age by September 1, 2025. If your child is in Pre-K at PRE this year, documentation will roll over. No further action necessary at this time.

Parents are required to provide:

- Photo ID of parent
- Proof of birth—birth certificate, hospital certificate, baptismal certificate, birth registration, or passport/visa
- Verification of residence such as a current utility bill (ex: gas, electric, water, cable all of which must include the service address) a current lease agreement or settlement document.
- Current Immunization Record- Immunizations are also required at the time registration. Please contact your pediatrician for a copy or print from your healthcare portal. State vaccination records can also be retrieved from <https://md.myir.com/> and create an account. You will also receive a health inventory, dental and lead form during registration.

CAR RIDER FAQ



Why are we asked not to arrive before 8:45 AM?

When the drop-off line forms before 8:45 AM, then staff are unable to access parking spaces in the lot. If staff cannot park and get into the building, then it may delay our ability to open the doors for students to enter.

Why do we form two lines, then merge into one line?

Forming two lines allows more cars to get into the lot and reduces the backup of traffic on Freedom Avenue. Vehicles merge into one line before drop-off and pick-up so that students do not need to cross in front of other cars.

Why does the door at the car rider area close at 9:10 AM each morning?

Instruction begins at 9:15 AM each day. Students are expected to be unpacked and ready to learn by that time. Students who enter after 9:10 are often late to get started. Also, the staff who monitor the door need to get to their classrooms to begin teaching and supporting students by 9:15. Any vehicle that arrives after 9:10 should pull around to the front of the building to drop off at the main entrance. Any student arriving after the 9:15 bell is marked "tardy" and needs to be signed in at the office by a parent or guardian.

I pick up my child every day. Why am I sometimes asked to provide ID?

When staff become familiar with you, they may stop asking for ID. If a different staff member is on duty on a given day, then they may not know you as well. As a general rule, you should always be prepared to show ID when picking up your child. We want to ensure that students go home with the right adults.

We live close to the school. Can my child walk home?

We allow students to walk home, but they must do with an adult. We do not release elementary students to go home on their own.

The drop-off and pick-up process takes a long time. Is there a way to make things go faster?

We have a large number of families who utilize the car drop-off and pick-up process. We all have the same goal to dismiss students to their parents safely, while also doing so in a timely manner. The best way is for us to work together.

Some ways to help include the following:

- *Pull up to the first available numbered cone to drop off or pick up. This allows us to handle four cars at a time.*
- *During drop-off, please refrain from long "goodbyes." Have students ready to exit the car promptly when you stop at the drop-off area.*
- *When picking up, please have your red number card or ID ready to show the staff member on duty. Remind your child to listen for their name to be called in the gym to be dismissed.*
- *Avoid trying to take "short cuts" around the process. This just makes things slow down for everyone. It is also not a great way to make friends in the community.*

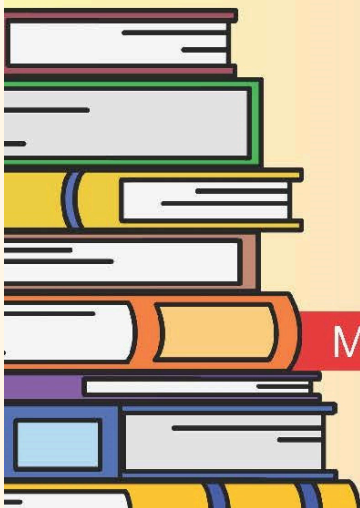

PRE-KINDERGARTEN 2025-2026 ENROLLMENT

A child who will turn 4 years of age **on or before September 1, 2025** may be eligible for enrollment into CCPS PreK Program

1 COMPLETE APPLICATION

All families who are interested in being considered must complete a CCPS Pre-Kindergarten application & provide necessary documentation.

2 ENROLLMENT DETERMINED

Enrollment determined based on Federal Poverty Level guidelines, foster care, and/or homeless status.

Should space be available, children who have an IEP and/or Multi-language Learner status may be given priority. Due to limited availability families are encouraged to consider private Pre-K options as well.
