INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION PLAN

- When a student has an IEP in middle school:
 - All teachers have the IEP at a glance prior to school starting, including goals and accommodations
 - All teachers and staff support goals and accommodations in a variety of settings and ways.



IEP MINUTES

Middle School IEP minutes can be confusing.

Students are supported two ways:

1. Placed in special education class (Math, ELA, Academic lab)
2. General Education with Para support (Math, ELA, History, Science)
3. There may be a Co-Taught Class option available in the General Education setting

Enrollment in these classes is depending on the student's individual needs and IEP minutes.

STUDENTS ARE SEEN AS INDIVIDUALS AND MAY NEED A COMBINATION OF DIFFERENT LEVELS OF SUPPORT THROUGH THE YEAR AND THROUGH THEIR MIDDLE SCHOOL CAREER. THE IEP TEAM WILL DECIDE THE COMBINATION OF CLASSES AND SUPPORTS THAT WILL BEST MEET THE NEEDS OF EACH STUDENT.



ACADEMIC LAB

Academic lab:

1. Fulfills an elective class spot, can take for half or whole year depending on IEP team decision and student need
2. Most students in 6th grade it is recommended that they take this class
3. Class Goals:
 - a. IEP goals
 - b. Calendar planning
 - c. Work on study skills (organization, time management, self advocacy, creating and using systems for success)
 - d. Study for tests/retakes
 - e. Work on homework/missing assignments



ELECTIVES

- 6th Graders on the elective wheel (every quarter) which to a new class.
- All 6th graders will have one elective (of the two) be a semester of PE
- Some students may have music (orchestra, or band). That is a year long course.
- Academic lab fulfills an elective class



LOCKERS

- 6th Grade Hallway has all the lockers for students to store backpacks and other school supplies
- ALL students are required to use a locker to store backpacks, bags, coats, lunches, etc. *There are weeks of teaching and learning and grace for time in case there's struggle or stress.
- Students can bring a pencil pouch, their district computer case, or small bag that fits in the desk.



BLOCK SCHEDULE

- The Block schedule is Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday
 - Mon/Thursday Periods : 1, 2, 3
 - Tues/Friday Periods: 4, 5, 6
- Wednesday is all 6 classes and early release
