The Feast of the Ascension of the Lord

Each year, forty days after Easter Sunday, the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord—a pivotal moment in our liturgical calendar that marks Jesus’ return to the Father in Heaven. For many, it may seem like a quiet or passing event between Easter and Pentecost, but for our parish community, the Ascension holds deep spiritual meaning and practical implications for how we live our faith today.

The Ascension is not merely the end of Jesus’ earthly ministry—it is the fulfillment of His mission. After His resurrection, Jesus spent forty days with His disciples, offering final teachings and strengthening their faith. Then, He was “lifted up” before their eyes (Acts 1:9), returning to the Father to take His place at the right hand of God. This moment reveals the glory of Christ and His victory over sin and death. It reminds us of that Jesus, both fully human and fully divine, has opened the gates of Heaven for all who believe in Him.

A CALL TO MISSION

But the Ascension is not only about Jesus going up; it’s also about sending us out. Just before He ascended, Jesus gave His disciples the Great Commission:

“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations...” (Matthew 28:19)

He entrusts His mission to the Church—to us. This is a powerful reminder to our parish community that we are not passive observers of the faith, but active participants in God’s plan for the world. We are called to be His witnesses, not just in church but in our homes, workplaces, schools, and neighborhoods.

Ascension also gives us hope. It assures us that where Christ has gone, we hope to follow. As Jesus ascended to Heaven, He did not abandon us. Instead, He promised the coming of the Holy Spirit—our Advocate, Guide, and Comforter—who empowers us to live as faithful disciples. In a world often marked by uncertainty, suffering, and fear, the Ascension lifts our eyes to the promise of eternal life and the unshakable presence of Christ in our midst.

ASUNCIÓN DEL SEÑOR


“VAYAN, HAGAN DISCÍPULOS EN TODAS LAS NACIONES.”

Perspectiva Salesiana:

Hablando del misterio de la Asunción de Nuestro Señor, Francisco de Sales escribió: “Nosotros traicionamos nuestra vida humana para poder vivir una vida que está por encima de nosotros. Escondemos esta nueva vida en Dios con Jesucristo quien es el único que puede verla, la conoce y la otorga. Nuestra nueva vida es el amor celestial, que aviva y anima nuestra alma y este amor está completamente escondido en Dios y en las cosas de Dios con Jesucristo. Como las palabras sagradas del Evangelio dicen, después que Jesús se había mostrado por un tiempo ante sus discípulos, el ascendió al cielo, y una nube lo rodeó, lo tomó y lo escondió de sus ojos. Jesucristo entonces, está oculto en el cielo, en Dios. Jesucristo es nuestro amor, y nuestro amor es la vida de nuestra alma. Por consiguiente, nuestra vida está oculta en Dios con Jesucristo, y cuando Jesús que es nuestro amor y nuestra vida espiritual, aparezca en el Día del Juicio, nosotros también apareceremos junto con él en la gloria. Esto significa que, Jesucristo, nuestro amor, nos glorificara comunicándonos su propia dicha y esplendor.” (Tratado del Amor de Dios, Libro VII, Capitulo 6)

Nuestra vida está ciertamente oculta en Dios. La realidad más profunda de quienes somos sólo es conocida por Dios. Aun así, para Francisco de Sales, vivir una vida

escondida en Dios no es lo mismo que mantener esa vida en secreto: se trata de dar testimonio de nuestra verdad más profunda, de quienes somos – y quien es Dios— a través de la calidad de nuestras relaciones con los demás. Por lo tanto, es apropiado que Francisco de Sales nos llama a practicar las virtudes ocultas, “esas virtudes pequeñas y humildes que crecen como flores al pie de la cruz: ayudar al pobre, visitar a los enfermos, cuidar de tu familia, desempeñando todas las tareas que esto incluye, y con esa diligencia que no te permitirá distraerte.” (Introducción a la Vida Devota, Parte III, Capitulo 35)



A través de la Asunción, Jesús ha sido removido de nuestra vista: más bien, del alcance de nuestra vista a nivel físico. Aun así, la misma autoridad que Jesús reclamó del Padre ha sido otorgada a nosotros en virtud de nuestra creación y confirmada en nuestro bautismo.




THE TREE

While I was riding a bus recently, aimlessly looking out of the window, we passed a large forest filled with newly leafed trees, proclaiming the promise of Spring. What captured my attention though was not the lush greenery, but rather a single dead tree standing alone in a small clearing like a sentinel of beauty. It was of medium size, perfectly formed with branches reaching out, seemingly intact, its bark silvery gray and peeling. It was gorgeous, a work of art whose image has stayed with me.

In the midst of nature, I've always felt a sense of awe in God's creation. While hiking in the silent woods, and especially when in the mountains and at the seashore, I've found myself in a contemplative state. However, I find that as I age, I spend more time thinking about the

significance of the things I see. What are the life lessons there not immediately apparent? Perhaps it's a gift of aging that you we're able to do this, having lived many years, seen and experienced much, and now have time to ponder life's mysteries.

That dead tree took on new life through the message it was sending, and I'm still trying to figure out what that might be. Is it about legacy, or tribute? Endurance, perhaps? Or memories? Is it confirming, yet again, that after the difficulties of death a mysterious and beautiful resurrection awaits?

This tree had provided shade and probably delighted passersby with bright colors in Fall and blossomed in Spring. In death, it continues to grab our attention. Like us, it probably lived a long time, endured harsh winters, served as a home for nesting birds, welcomed visitors, and perhaps even fed them. If it could talk, it probably would have a lot to say. But even in its silence I think it's inviting us to search, to learn, to remember.

I'm grateful for this time in my life when I can thoughtfully process the meaning of the things I see in God's creation. At times I may not be able to find the words to describe them but still experience comfort, wonder and yes, even courage. Who ever thought that on that sunny day on the bus I would have seen beauty in death, an image I won't soon forget, and whose unfolding message continues to inspire?

JUNE 2025-A MONTH OF SOLEMNITIES!

This month is very special by virtue of the fact that each Sunday we celebrate a Solemnity: June 1-Ascension, June 8-Pentecost, June 15-Most Holy Trinity, June 22-Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and June 29-Sts. Peter and Paul, Apostles.

We usually use the word 'feast' to cover all levels of celebration, even though the word has a precise meaning in the hierarchy of celebrations. The three basic classes of celebrations are memorial, feast and solemnity. Let's explore solemnities!

Solemnities are of the highest degree and reserved for the most important mysteries of faith. These include Easter, Pentecost and the Immaculate Conception; and the principal titles of Our Lord, such as Trinity and Sacred Heart and celebrations that honor some saints of particular importance, such as Sts. Peter and Paul.

Solemnities have the same basic elements as a Sunday: three readings, prayer of the faithful, the Creed or Gloria, which is recited or sung even when the solemnity occurs during Advent or Lent. In most cases it also has a particular preface. A solemnity is celebrated if it falls on a Sunday of ordinary time or Christmastide. But it is transferred to the following Monday if it falls on a Sunday of Advent, Lent or Easter, or during Holy Week or the Easter octave. Most likely this is more than you ever wanted or needed to know about Solemnities. We will just rejoice in our June of Solemnities!!


FROM LIGHT TO GLORY— THE MEANING OF THE PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal candle, first lit at the Easter Vigil, symbolizes the Paschal Mystery—the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus—which is at the center of our Catholic faith. It remains lit throughout the Easter season as a sign of the risen Christ. Pentecost marks the end of the Easter season and a return to Ordinary Time, so you will see the candle extinguished.

The Paschal candle remains in the church and is lit again for important sacraments like baptisms and funerals, reminding us of Christ's ongoing presence in the life of the Church.



SAINT OF THE WEEK SAINT CHARLES LWANGA AND HIS COMPANIONS (MARTYRED 1886-87)



"Master of Pages," reputedly the handsomest man in all Uganda, Charles Lwanga, lay catechist, courageously led about forty teenaged boys, Catholics and Anglicans, on a forty-mile forced march to martyrdom for their common Christian faith. Teaching each other the hymns of their different churches, they strengthened one another for the ordeal ahead. King Mwanga, himself barely twenty, had ordered them executed for being "those who pray." But these royal pages were the king's male harem, who, now Christians, refused what pious accounts demurely describe as his "unreasonable demands." Some were clubbed to death, most burned alive; the youngest, thirteen-year old Saint Kizito, whom Charles had often shielded from the King's lust; the most tragic, Saint Mbagwa, whose father was his executioner! In 1964, Paul VI canonized the young Catholics and praised their Anglican companions, recalling the heroism of early Christianity's African martyrs, which we modern Christians of far less faith never expected to see repeated. Forty years after the pope's words, what does our faith cost us? Heroism aside, how generous is our response?




