

Frequently Asked Questions

- What do I do if I think my child may have a disability?
 - For next steps, contact the Student Intervention Coordinator for Preschool or Elementary students, or the school counselor for Middle and High School students.
- What is the difference between a Section 504 Plan and an IEP?
 - A 504 Plan provides accommodations to support access to the general education curriculum without altering the curriculum itself. An IEP (Individualized Education Program) includes specialized instruction, goals, and services under IDEA for students who meet specific eligibility criteria.
- Who should I contact if I have a question about my child's IEP or 504 Plan?
 - Start with your child's case manager, then the school principal, then the coordinator for your child's grade.
