STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GOALS

The Sumner County Board of Education has set goals for the entire district. The goals for the 2024-2025 school year are as follows:



READING



The number of 4th and 5th grade students scoring on track or mastered in the ELA portion of the TN Ready Assessment will increase from 54.8% to 57.6%.



MATH



The number of students scoring on track or mastered in the math portion of the TN Ready Assessment will increase from 56% to 58.8% in grades 3rd-5th.

The following are Watt Hardison Elementary's 2024-2025 achievement goals:



READING



The number of 3rd-5th grade students scoring on track or mastered in the ELA portion of the TN Ready Assessment will increase from 46.2% to 49.8%.



MATH



The number of 3rd-5th grade students scoring on track or mastered in the math portion of the TN Ready Assessment will increase from 49.1% to 52.3%.
