What is a Family Engagement Plan? This is a plan that describes how Clinch Middle will provide opportunities to improve family engagement in our school and support student learning. Clinch Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of the improving student achievement. How is this Revised? Clinch Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Clinch County Middle School administrators & teachers have studied our student performance data to find the most important areas of improvement for our school. The school goals for 2024-2025 are:

- Increase the number of students scoring in the Accelerated Learning category in the writing and language domain of GMAS by 5%
- Increase the number of students scoring on grade level or above on ELA GMAS by 10%
- Increase the number of students scoring in levels 3 & 4 by 5% on the Math portion of GMAS
- Fully implement an effective PLC that focuses on social-emotional learning. All faculty & staff will actively participate in a minimum of 90% of scheduled SEL PLC meetings
