Course Descriptions

ART 1C Modern and Contemporary Art History - 3 Units

This course is designed to provide a survey of the visual arts from the mid-nineteenth century to the present with an emphasis on Europe and North America. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID ARTH 150)

DANCE 32 Dance Cultures - 3 Units

This course will survey the development of various world dance forms and vernacular dances in the United States applying theoretical models to analyze dance. This course investigates the relationship of dance in the humanities and social sciences field. It places an emphasis on the role of dance as a carrier of cultural and aesthetics values, a tool for social justice and a witness to history. The impact of political, economic and religious forces shaping dance will also be examined. The course looks at dances originating from Africa, Asia, Native America and Latin America, and their contemporary presence in the United States. (HBCU, UC, CSU)

ENGL 1B College Composition and Literature - 3 Units

Prerequisites: ENG 1A or ENG 2A with a grade of "C" or better.

This course is designed to help transfer students develop their critical thinking skills and read and write with college-level sophistication through writing analytical essays based on reading and discussing a culturally diverse literature. (HBCU, UC, CSU)

ENGL C1000 Academic Reading and Writing - 3 Units

Prerequisite: Cumulative high school GPA of ≥ 2.6 . Submit ENGL clearance form to enroll.

In this course, students receive instruction in academic reading and writing, including writing processes, effective use of language, analytical thinking, and the foundations of academic research. (Cal-GETC Area 1A)

HIST 37 California History - 3 Units

Advisories: Ability to read at 12th grade level.

This course is a survey of California history from the period of European exploration and discovery to the present within an international and national comparative context. Emphasis is on native cultures, Spanish and Mexican periods, American infiltration and conquest, the Gold Rush, statehood and the formation of government, economic growth, and cultural and social development. A study of California state and local government is included in this course. (HBCU, UC, CSU)

PSYC C1000 Introduction to Psychology - 3 Units

Advisories: Ability to read at 12th grade level.

This course is an introduction to psychology, which is the study of the mind and behavior. Students focus on theories and concepts of biological, cognitive, developmental, environmental, social, and cultural influences; their applications; and their research foundations. (Cal-GETC Area 4)
