The May 12th Board of Education meeting began on a high note, as 5th grade musical students led the Pledge of Allegiance. Afterward, the students shared reflections on their recent performance of Winnie the Pooh Kids, offering board members and attendees a joyful glimpse into the creativity, teamwork, and confidence built through the arts.

Another heartfelt moment came when two senior swim team members addressed the board to express their gratitude. Four years ago, as 8th graders, they had come before the Board to request the opportunity for Blair students to participate in swim through a cooperative program with Fremont. Thanks to the Board's approval, both students were able to pursue a sport they love, represent Blair and Fremont at the State Swim Meet, and grow through years of commitment and competition. Both seniors are now headed to college where they will continue their swimming careers—an incredible outcome made possible by the board's support.

In further support of hands-on learning and workforce readiness, the Board gratefully accepted two generous donations to Blair High School's small engine program. Sid Dillon Chevrolet donated \$6,000 to purchase two ATV lifts, expanding the program's instructional tools. Rehiko also donated 10 engines, valued at approximately \$3,500, which will give students valuable real-world experience in engine repair and maintenance.

The Board also approved a trip for six Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) students and their sponsor, Mrs. Vicki Schrick, to attend the FBLA National Leadership Conference in Anaheim, California, from June 27 to July 3, 2025. This prestigious national event gives students the opportunity to compete, network, and further develop their leadership and business skills.
