



<u>Dismissal time is 3:30 PM</u> (Staggered)

- Kindergarten is out the front doors (Dismissed at 3:20 PM)
- KPS bus riders out the front doors (Dismissed at 3:15 PM)
- All other buses out the cafeteria doors (Dismissed at 3:20 PM)
- 1st & 2nd oldest and only are out the front doors (Dismissed at 3:25 PM)
- 3rd & 4th as students with no siblings will go out the back door (Dismissed at 3:25 PM)
- 3rd, 4th & 5th with younger siblings will go out the front doors at 3:30 PM and meet their younger siblings. 5th without siblings out the back.



TRAFFIC

Meadowlark Elementary traffic is a very big priority for all! We know that all parents are busy, and our number one goal is to make sure all staff and students are safe. In order to accomplish this, we need traffic to run smoothly each morning and afternoon.



DROP OFF/PICK UP REMINDERS

- KISS AND GO: We need to keep the line moving. Please talk with your child about how this will look.
- Get out on the right side: This helps keep everyone safe as traffic passes on the left.
- Pull all the way up: The more cars we can fit, the less time everyone has to wait.
- Before school, if you need to park or get out of your vehicle you must park on the left side of the street.
- Use the crosswalk always if you need to enter the building.
- Safety patrol students help will guide traffic, as well as assist any student into the school that may be having a hard morning.



PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL (PAC)

Each year, the PAC has an advisory board with the hope of getting more parents involved in the child's education and helping each classroom have a voice in PAC. Each classroom has one-two parents/guardians to represent them at the monthly PAC meeting as well as ANY parents who would also like to attend.



WATCH D.O.G.S

The Dads of Great Students WATCH D.O.G.S.® program is one of the nation's largest and most respected school-based, family, and community engagement, organizations designed and developed by educators, experts and parent & guardian volunteers over more than two decades.

This program helps provide positive male role models for the students, demonstrating by their presence that education is important. Meanwhile, we provide extra sets of eyes and ears to enhance school security, reduce bullying and provide a greater sense of campus safety allowing students and teachers to focus on learning and instruction.





SAFETY

Our number one job is to keep your child safe when they come to us each day! This is something we take very seriously. We utilize the Standard Response Protocol as a district. The benefits of SRP become quickly apparent in the case of an emergency. By standardizing the vocabulary, all stakeholders can understand the response and status of the event.

For students, this provides continuity of expectations and actions throughout their educational career. For teachers, this becomes a simpler process to train and drill. For communities, it leverages the growing adoption of the protocols from residents of all ages. For first responders, the common vocabulary and protocols establish a greater predictability that persists through the duration of an incident.



Hold is followed by the Directive: "In Your Room or Area" and is the protocol used when hallways need to be kept clear of occupants.



Secure is followed by the Directive: "Get Inside. Lock Outside Doors" and is the protocol used to safeguard people within the building.



Lockdown is followed by "Locks, Lights, Out of Sight" and is the protocol used to secure individual rooms and keep occupants quiet and in place.



Evacuate may be followed by a location, and is used to move people from one location to a different location in or out of the building.



Shelter and state the Hazard and Safety Strategy for group and self protection.



ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS

Each grade level will communicate specific academic expectations for your child.

- Attend our fall curriculum nights
- Check backpacks, folders, and work coming home
- Review your child's planner (3rd-5th)
- Practice sight words linked on the KPS website (K-3)

- Encourage Accelerated Reader and IXL practice
- Communicate with us to help support your unique learner

BRACELETS

We will be using our "Above and Beyond" bracelets again this year. We are looking for our students to go "Above and Beyond". We already have wonderful students, so this gives the staff the opportunity to catch a student doing something "Above & Beyond" what is already expected. This program generated a great deal of excitement within the school. So, if you see your child or another child wearing a bracelet that says "High 5 – Ask Me Why?", please ask them why and give them that "High 5" they deserve!

INVITATIONS AND TREATS

It is district policy that students do not hand out invitations or treats at school. We want to ensure the protection of our students with allergies, as well as prevent disruptions to the school day.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is very important for routines and student growth! Parents will get a letter when their student misses or is tardy:

5 days; 10 days; 15 days; 19 days; 20 days.



OFFICE REMINDERS



<u>Visitors:</u> ALL visitors must come through the front doors and sign in at the office. Thank you for helping us keep a safe school.

Absences: Please call the school when your child is going to be absent! This communication helps us tremendously.

<u>Appointments:</u> Please call Mrs. Rademacher to set up appointments. There are so many meetings after school required by our teachers that we need to ensure that your child's teacher is available to meet at a convenient time with you.

<u>Picking Up:</u> If you are picking up your child for an appointment of any kind, please let the office know ahead of time, and we will try to have your student ready for you to pick them up!

<u>Eating With Your Child:</u> If you would like to eat lunch with your child, we start this <u>after 1st quarter</u>. Please call the office in the morning, so we can order a tray for you if needed. If you are bringing outside lunch we will have you eat in the office with your child.

PARENT PARTNERSHIP AND SUPPORT


Partnership with parents is very important to us. Reach out with any information that can help us support your child. Please also plan to attend conferences to discuss all of the progress they are making!


