CLASS TITLE: PARA EDUCATOR - MUSIC DEPARTMENT

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of an assigned supervisor, support and provide assistance with the delivery and implementation of the District's music program. Assist the music teacher in reinforcing music instruction to individual or small groups of students in a classroom or other learning environment; assist teacher with the preparation of materials related to the music department. Provide technical support, audio and video/recording.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

Conduct sectionals with individuals or small groups of students, reinforcing musical instruction as directed by the teacher; monitor and oversee student drills, practices and assignments.

Provide classroom support to the teacher by setting up work areas, operating equipment, and distributing and collecting paper, supplies and materials; confer with teacher concerning lesson plans and materials to meet student needs.

Rehearse the band an/or choir in the absence of the teacher and under the supervision of the substitute teacher. Conduct the Jazz Band under the direction of the teacher. Assist with evening performances when appropriate.

Track musical instrument inventory, including assessing instrument condition and perform small repairs and recommend appropriate additional repairs.

Assist assigned music and/or other teacher with the implementation of lesson plans; assist teacher in the administration of various tests.

Perform a variety of clerical duties such as preparing, typing and duplicating instructional materials, scoring papers and recording grades; maintain student files as assigned; record student attendance.

Operate a variety of equipment including a computer, copier, paper cutter and laminator.

Assure the health and safety of students by following health and safety practices and procedures; maintain learning environment in a safe, orderly and clean manner.

Direct group activities of students as assigned; assist in monitoring activities as assigned; accompany students on field trips as assigned.

Attend and participate in parent conferences and a variety of meetings as assigned.

Perform related duties as assigned.
