#### Conclusions from Parent, Teacher and Student Input:

School wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) creates a common language for high expectations and positive behavior choices. Counseling services target high-risk students and provide a curriculum designed to instill empathy through teaching conflict resolution and anger management skills. The Community Health Awareness Council (CHAC) program offered at Vargas has on-call services to work with any crisis or behavioral problems on the spot.







#### **Re-Unification Sites**

#### **Administration Back Up/Notification**

The first administrative backup is Heather Willhalm (instructional coach) for Vargas. Always notify the district office when time permits regarding a serious incident.

#### **Safe Ingress and Egress**

#### **Getting to School:**

In keeping with our goal of fostering environmental awareness among our students, we strongly urge families to use means of transporting children to school other than driving. We encourage activities such as walking, bicycling, or scootering. If children must be driven by car, carpooling is encouraged. Safety is emphasized, whatever the mode of transportation. It is everyone's responsibility to know the traffic laws surrounding the school, including appropriate speed limits, and to obey them.

#### **Crossing Guards:**

There are three Vargas crossing guards every school day during arrival and departure times. They are provided by The Crossing Guard Company All City Management Servoices, Inc. Their locations are as follows:

- At the stop light at the intersection of Washington and Bernardo;
- At the 4-way stop intersection of Leota and Washington;
- At the crosswalk on Leota and Carson

#### Walking:

We recommend that parents and guardians accompany kindergarten and primary grade (1st-3rd) students to and from school in walking groups. Walking groups for older children, such as walking school buses, will foster independence and increase safety. Parents are encouraged to evaluate the routes to school to determine the safest route to school. Walkability/bikeability checklists are available from the school office. Teach children how to cross streets:

- At intersections
- In crosswalks when available
- With pedestrian crossing signal at light-signal controlled intersections
- With crossing guard assistance when available

Children must wear the required protective gear when bicycling or using a scooter and follow applicable laws and the directions of the crossing guards. Per California law, helmets are required for all children under the age of 18.

#### Using the Passenger Drop-Off and Pick up Zone:

Drop children off and pick them up in the designated passenger drop-off and pick-up zones at the front of the school roundabout area on Leota . Please help keep traffic flowing in these zones. DO NOT leave your vehicle parked or double-park in the passenger drop-off/pick-up zones. If children are not present for pick-up at arrival time, continue out of the area, park on the street in a legal parking spot, and walk up to find them.

Stop before the crosswalk at the entrance to the roundabout at the front of the school to wait for any pedestrians using the crosswalk. Drive as far forward as possible in a single file line along the drive through area before dropping off or picking up children. Do not block anyone parked in a handicapped parking space.

# **School/School District Support:**

To support the goal of fostering environmental awareness among our students, the School/School District will annually:

- o Survey students and/or parents to determine mode of travel to school. A simple survey will aid in planning for addressing transportation issues.
- o Educate, inform, and train students, parents, and staff about safe travel to and from school.
- o Review safe ingress and egress plan and procedures with staff.
