JOB GOAL:

To provide each student in Adaptive Physical Education with a program that will enable him to reach his fullest physical, emotional and behavioral potential as outlined by his Educational Plan.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Instructs children who qualify for the adaptive physical education program using appropriate techniques, equipment, and instruction materials as specified in the Individualized Education Program.
- 2. Observes children in order to identify children who may need adaptive physical education assessment.
- 3. Performs appropriate assessments of individual children to determine specific needs of children to be enrolled in the program.
- 4. Provides information to the Individualized Education Program Team in the development of I.E.P.'s.
- 5. Provides consultation to regular classroom teachers, and special day class teachers that have students in the adaptive physical education program regarding a modified regular P.E. Program.
- 6. Modifies a child's adaptive physical education program as indicated by periodic evaluation.
- 7. Cooperates with other staff members involved in implementing a child's I.E.P. including the Resource Specialist, Special Day Class Teacher, or Regular Classroom Teacher.
- 8. Maintains up-to-date records of pupil progress.

- 9. Confers with parents regarding their child's progress.
- 10. Participates in staff development programs.
- 11. Works with the Resource Specialist in insuring the procedures for placement of children have been followed, particularly as it relates to parental consent and provision of information regarding parent rights.
- 12. If assigned as an itinerant specialist, plans a schedule in cooperation with district and school administrators.
- 13. Provides information to the Individualized Education Program Team regarding progress of a pupil when an annual or triannual review is being conducted.
- 14. Provides in service training regarding adaptive physical education to staff, parents, and community.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Salary and terms of employment are described in the Agreement between the Sunnyvale School District and the Sunnyvale Education Association.
