Measure Y November 5, 2024

In November voters in the Sunnyvale School District will be asked to renew the District's \$59 per year parcel tax that was first approved in 2011.

Measure Y funds will allow the District to protect programs such as math, English, and science; attract and retain highly qualified teachers and staff; keep class sizes as small as possible; and maintain computers and technology used by students and teachers.

Measure Y provides for strict accountability. An Independent Community Oversight Committee will monitor and review all parcel tax expenditures, making sure that all funds are spent as planned for the benefit of local students.

An exemption from the parcel tax is available to those who are 65 years old or disabled and own and reside in their home. Anyone currently exempt from the parcel tax will continue to be exempt. You do not need to re-apply.
