We are excited to announce that work has started on the longawaited project to renovate the running track around the turf field on the High School's Kippy Mitchell Sports Complex. This project has been years in the making, since the first failed Town referendum in 2019. The second referendum passed in November



of 2021, and while the turf replacement was completed in the summer of 2022, the track portion of the project has faced delays due to multiple factors, including previous consideration of the sports complex as a potential site for the 2023 school referendum project, as well as overbooking of qualified contractors post-COVID, who were unable to meet the tight schedule required to accomplish the work between the spring thaw and the start of fall sports.

The renovation project includes:

- Detaching and rolling back the turf (to be reinstalled on completion)
- Demolition & excavation of existing track
- Grinding and leveling of sub-base, adding new material if needed
- Installation of new curbing and drainage
- Installation of electrical conduit
- Grading & paving (asphalt)
- Installation of updated track & field equipment (discus, shot put, high/long/triple jump areas)
- New football goal posts, safety netting and perimeter fencing
- Track surfacing with urethane structural spray (Level 5 Track Certification)
- Line and event markings/striping

What To Expect:

- The track & turf field area is closed as of May 28
- There will be **NO PUBLIC ACCESS** to the turf and track area during construction
- The turf & track area will be fenced off as a construction site
- There will be a staging area on Wentworth Drive (between baseball field and skate pond)
- Please avoid Wentworth Drive as a route through the Oak Hill campus during this time

Project schedule:

- Last week of May installation of construction fencing & erosion control
- Beginning of June demolition of the existing track
- Mid-June through mid-July installation of curbing, drainage, conduit
- End of July begin paving, installation of track & field equipment
- Mid-August final paving & fencing finished; turf field re-installed
- Track surfacing will be the final step, requires stretch of dry weather

Please bear in mind: this is a big project and weather-dependent; all scheduled milestones are estimates. We greatly appreciate the patience and understanding of the Scarborough community as we work to accomplish this long-awaited goal!

WHAT ARE THE NEXT STEPS IN THE PROCESS?

The SBAC will be working over the next 3-4 weeks to identify cost savings measures in the scope, evaluate scope deferments, select the proposed site, and ultimately select the supported option. This decision is targeted for mid-June.

How does SUN Bucks work?

SUN Bucks benefits are loaded onto an **EBT card** and can be used to buy food like fruits, vegetables, meat, whole grains, and dairy at grocery stores, farmers markets, and other places that accept EBT benefits.

How do I get SUN Bucks?

Automatic Enrollment

Your child will be **automatically enrolled** for SUN Bucks and does not need to apply if:

- They completed an application for school meal benefit and were found eligible or
- Age 6-16 and part of a household that already participates in SNAP, FDPIR, TANF, MaineCare at 185% FPL or identified as foster, homeless, or migrant by OFI or OCFS.

Keep an eye out! Automatically enrolled households will receive benefits starting in June on an existing Pine Tree card or on a new EBT card in the mail.

Manual Application

Most families will be automatically enrolled. If you haven't received a letter in the mail by June, consider applying for SUN Bucks before August 15 if:

- Your child attends a school that offers the National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program, and
- Your household meets the requirements for free or reduced-price school meal benefit.

Do you have a new address?

Make sure your address is up to date with your school and with the Office for Family Independence so your **SUN Bucks** benefits are sent to the right place!

Project Grace's Backpack Program



Developed many years ago in collaboration with Project GRACE, the <u>Backpack Program</u> began with a commitment to provide backpacks filled with nutritious, non-perishable foods for students in need over long weekends and school vacation weeks. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Backpack Program was a critical

resource fighting food insecurity in our community.

In its current form, the Backpack Program continues to provide non-perishable foods as well as fresh produce and meats to families so that our students do not go hungry over school breaks. During the school year, we prepare breakfast & lunch for weekends, holidays and school vacations, in packages that can be picked up once a week at the Wentworth kitchen.

Our community members are essential partners in supporting the ongoing success of the Backpack Program - the program is fully funded by donations and grants. 2025-2026 School Calendar Approved!



At the March 6th board meeting, the board approved the 2025-2026 calendar. It is very similar to this year's calendar, and will allow for up to three "traditional snow days" (or any type of unplanned "no school" days). If more than the allotted three days are needed, those days will be **asynchronous** remote learning days, consistent with how the school calendar has looked like for the past few years.

Work Permits

Work Permit Information for Minors Under 16 Years Old

Once a minor under 16 years old has the promise of a job, they must obtain a work permit before beginning that job. This includes students who are homeschooled. They must get a new permit every time they begin a new job until they reach 16 years old, even if they work for their parents.



In order to apply for a work permit, the minor must be:

- · enrolled in school
- not habitually truant or under suspension; and
- passing a majority of courses during the current grading period.

A copy of the Maine Work Permit Form can be downloaded here. Once this form is completed and signed, the work permit application should be delivered to the superintendent's office (Scarborough Town Hall, 259 US Route 1) with a **copy of the minor's birth certificate, passport or permanent resident card**. You may also email this information to Melissa Booth (mbooth@scarboroughschools.org) If you have general questions please call Melissa at 207-730-4100.

The superintendent's office will forward the information to the Maine Department of Labor. This process could take up to one week. If the permit is in order, the MDOL will validate/approve the form. A staff member at the superintendent's office will email a copy of the approved work permit to the student and the parent/guardian who gave permission for the permit.

- 1. Minors should bring the approved work permit to their new employer.
- 2. A minor can have one active permit during the school year and two during the summer.
