OUR LOCATION

Duluth East High School is located in Minnesota along the beautiful shores of Lake Superior. You will find direct access to the city’s Lakewalk just steps from our front door. This bike friendly path connects the iconic Canal Park to our scenic North Shore with Duluth East in the center.

With Duluth’s population exceeding 85,000, the city offers diversified business, professional, and industrial services as well as expanding recreational opportunities to Northeastern Minnesota.

EDUCATION

The curriculum of our four-year high school is designed to meet the needs of approximately 1,600 students. Our curriculum is semester based with a seven period day. Each period is 47 minutes in length and meets five days a week. Grades are distributed four times per year. Final transcript grades are given at the end of each semester.

About 85% of East’s graduates continue on to some form of higher education or training. Better than 60% pursue a four-year college degree and approximately 22% enroll in a community or two-year college option. Of those, 8% include military or trade profession. The remainder choose immediate employment or are undecided.

DULUTH EAST SCHOLARS

Students who rank in the upper five percent of the graduating class are designated as Duluth East Scholars and are recognized at graduation.

NATIONAL MERIT QUALIFYING TEST

Each year East students have been recognized for achievement on the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. The East graduating class of 2024 had four students receive a Letter of Commendation and one student qualify as a National Merit Semifinalist.

CURRICULUM COMMENTS

**Advanced Placement:** College Board program that offers high school students the opportunity to take rigorous, college-level courses and the potential to earn college credit while in high school.

**Honors Courses:** Follow an advanced and more rigorous curriculum as compared to the regular level counterparts. Students must meet minimum grades and GPA from prior year, or receive strong teacher recommendation to take these courses.

**College in the Schools (CITS):** This program allows academically strong high school students, meeting a minimum GPA, to take college level courses and earn college credit. Students take courses at East High School under highly qualified, master degreed educators.
