BACKGROUND:

In 2016, the Birmingham Community Charter High School (BCCHS) Board approved and adopted the California State University (CSU) A-G course sequence as part of the high school graduation requirements. Beginning with the graduating class of 2020, students are required to complete 230 credits with a grade of “D” or higher in the areas indicated in the table shown below:

On August 29, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the anticipated challenges of distance learning, the BCCHS Board approved a resolution to temporarily modify graduation requirements for the 2020–2021 school year as follows:

- o Reduction of total credits required for graduation from 230 to 210 for the Class of 2021
- o Suspension of the Career Technical Education (CTE) graduation requirement
- o Adoption of the “Do No Harm” policy for final semester grades

On October 21, 2020, the BCCHS Board approved a provision to support students who enroll at BCCHS in their 3rd or 4th year of high school, and who have previously earned Language Other Than English (LOTE) credits in a language not offered at BCCHS. The following accommodation applies:

- o Students who have completed LOTE credits in a language not offered at BCCHS may enroll in any LOTE Level 1 or 2 course offered at BCCHS.



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- These courses, when combined with the course(s) previously completed at the student's prior high school, may fulfill the 20-credit LOTE graduation requirement. This applies even if the language studied at the prior institution differs from the one offered at BCCHS.
- Students and parents must be informed that utilizing this provision prevents the student from becoming UC/CSU A-G eligible.
- This resolution applies to the class of 2020 and beyond.

On March 23, 2021, the BCCHS Board approved the following amendments:

1. Board Policy (BP) 47.1 – Amendment to the Math and LOTE Waivers for Students with Disabilities (SWD):
 - This amendment modifies the Math and LOTE waiver provisions for students with disabilities. Specifically, students that are granted a math waiver will now be eligible to enroll in an additional a-g course, intervention support course, or elective course, provided that the course is not a Student Service or Tutor course.
 - Furthermore, eligible students may also waive the 1st and/or 2nd year of LOTE as long as the 1st year of LOTE was attempted.
2. In response to the unique challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the BCCHS Board amended the graduation requirements for the class of 2022:
 - The total credit requirement for graduation has been reduced to 210 credits.
 - The Career and Technical Education (CTE) requirement was suspended for the class of 2022.

On July 1, 2021, AB 104 was signed into law which included the following provisions:

1. Student retention (if necessary) for those enrolled in K-11
2. Pass/No Pass Grades for students in high school during the 2020-2021 school year
3. Exemption from Local Educational Agency (LEA) graduation requirements for students in their 3rd or 4th year of high school during the 2020-2021 school year who are not on track to graduate in 4 years. These students may graduate with the minimum state graduation requirements.

In 2021, AB 469 amends Education Code 51225.7 to require that students complete one of the following to graduate from high school in California starting in the 2022-2023 school year:

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), OR
- California Dream Act Application (CADAA), OR
- Opt-Out Form, OR
- Meet an exemption requirement established by the LEA.

On October 8, 2021, AB 101 was signed into law, requiring all California public high school students to complete a one-semester course in ethnic studies to graduate, beginning with the class of 2030. Local educational agencies (LEAs), including charter schools, must begin offering at least one ethnic studies course starting in the 2025–2026 school year.

On August 26, 2023, the BCCHS Board approved the alternate Health requirement for the class of 2027 and beyond.

CURRENT STATE APPROVED EXEMPTIONS FROM LEA GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

Students that meet the specific criteria outlined in the following Assembly Bills:

- AB 216 – Foster Care Youth
- AB1806 – Homeless Children and Youth
- AB 2121 – Migratory Children and Newcomer Pupils as defined by AB 714
- AB 2306 – Juvenile Court Students
- AB 104 – Students affected by COVID-19 pandemic
- AB 365 – Children of Military Families
- AB 2251 – General Policy for LEAs and Charter Schools

shall be exempt from Local Educational Agency (LEA) graduation requirements and will only need to complete the minimum graduation requirements set by the California Department of Education (CDE). Refer to BCCHS BP 70 for additional information.



DEFINITIONS

Validation: Refers to the process by which the University of California (UC) and the California State University (CSU) systems assess a course to determine whether it satisfies the a-g subject area requirements for UC and/or CSU admission. Specifically, in the areas of Mathematics, Language Other Than English (LOTE), and Chemistry (for CSU only), when a student has successfully completed advanced coursework in a sequential subject area, they are presumed to have mastered the corresponding lower-level coursework. Validation rules apply to courses passed with a grade of “C” or better in the following subject areas:

- **UC/CSU Mathematics - Disciplines**
 - *Algebra 1:* Algebra 1B will validate Algebra 1A, including its omission.
 - *Geometry:* Geometry B will validate Geometry A, including its omission.
 - *Algebra 2:* Algebra 2B will validate Algebra 1 and/or Algebra 2, including course omission.
 - *Algebra 2/Trigonometry*
 - **Through Summer 2022:** A semester course will validate deficient grades in Algebra 1, Geometry and Algebra 2.
 - (For CSU Only) A semester course will validate Algebra 1, Geometry and Algebra 2 including course omission.
 - **Beginning Fall 2022:** This category no longer exists, and all courses previously labeled as such will be equivalent to Algebra 2.
 - *Advanced Mathematics (including Precalculus, Calculus, Other Advanced Math):*
 - **Through Summer 2025:** Any semester course will validate deficient grades in Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2.
 - (For CSU Only): Any semester course will validate Algebra 1, Geometry and Algebra 2 including course omission.
 - **Beginning Fall 2025:** Any semester course will validate Algebra 1 and Algebra 2 including course omission.
 - *Statistics:*
 - **Through Summer 2022:** Any semester statistics course will validate Algebra 1 and Algebra 2 including course omission
 - **Fall 2022 through Summer 2025:** Any semester statistics course will validate deficient grades in Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2. Any semester statistics course will validate the omission of Algebra 1 and/or Algebra 2 courses.
 - **Fall 2025 through Summer 2026:** Any semester statistics course will validate Algebra 1 & Algebra 2 including course omission
 - **Beginning Fall 2026:** Statistics courses will no longer validate ANY math courses.
- **UC/CSU Language Other Than English (LOTE)**
 - A semester course will validate the corresponding previous semester course(s) including its omission.
- **Chemistry (CSU Only)**
 - Chemistry B will validate Chemistry A, including its omission.

MAJOR CHANGES:

This policy:

- Clarifies the implementation of the CSU A-G requirements, including validation rules, in relation to BCCHS graduation requirements and in compliance with the California Department of Education (CDE) high school graduation requirements.
- Affirms that beginning with the graduating class of 2023, students may meet both the CTE and VPA requirements by completing a course that is approved for both CTE and VPA.
- Provides an alternative pathway to a BCCHS diploma for students enrolling during their 3rd or 4th year of high school that attended a school that did not offer UC/CSU A-G approved courses



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BCCHS GRADUATION ELIGIBILITY:

To receive a BCCHS high school diploma, students must earn 230 credits (or 210 credit for Classes of 2021 and 2022) and a grade of "D" or better in all courses that satisfy the following:

- Minimum CSU A-G course sequence
- CDE high school graduation requirements
- Any additional BCCHS graduation requirements

BCCHS GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS BY SUBJECT AREA:

A. History: 3 years (30 credits)

Students must complete the following history courses that are aligned to the CA standards and are A-G approved to meet the BCCHS graduation requirements for this subject area:

- World History (10 credits) or its equivalent
- US History (10 credits) or its equivalent
- Government/Civics (5 credits) or its equivalent
- Economics (5 credits) or its equivalent

Courses completed that are not A-G approved by UC but that are aligned to CA Social Science standards may be used to meet the CDE history graduation requirements. However, students are still required to complete the minimum CSU A-G history course requirements to fulfill the BCCHS graduation requirement. In instances where a student meets the CDE history requirements and the courses are not A-G approved, the student must complete additional A-G approved history courses to meet the BCCHS history graduation requirement. The courses must be listed on the school's UC A-G list under category A – History and/or G – Social Science. The additional courses that must be completed are as follows:

(A) or (G) World History requirement:

- Two semesters of (A) World History, Cultures, or Historical Geography OR
- Two semesters of (G) History / Social Science OR
- Two semesters of any combination of (A) or (G)

(A) US History requirement

- Two semesters of (A) US History OR
- One semester of (A) US History AND One semester of (A) Civics/Government

B. English: 4 years (40 credits)

Students must complete 4 years of English courses (40 credits) that are aligned to the CA standards and are "B" approved to meet the BCCHS graduation requirements for this subject area. The courses at BCCHS that meet this requirement are:

1. English 9AB or its equivalent
2. English 10AB or its equivalent
3. Amer Lit Comp & Cont Comp or its equivalent
4. ERWC AB or its equivalent

Courses that are not UC "B" English approved but align with California ELA standards may be used to fulfill the CDE English graduation requirements. However, students must still meet the minimum CSU "B"-English course requirement (4 years) to satisfy the BCCHS English graduation requirement. In such cases, students are required to complete a total of 8 semesters of UC "B" English approved courses to meet the BCCHS ELA graduation requirement.

C. Mathematics: 3 years (at least 20 credits)

Students must complete the following UC approved math courses: Algebra 1AB, Geometry AB and Algebra 2AB to meet the BCCHS math graduation requirements. Refer to the definitions section to apply the appropriate validation rule whenever necessary.

Limitations on Validation Rules:



- Students must fulfill the CDE Algebra 1 requirement. This can be met by completing any two courses equivalent to Algebra 1 or higher-level math. Please note that Geometry is not considered an equivalent or higher-level course to Algebra 1.
 - Courses listed under the following math disciplines on the UC A-G course portal are recognized as equivalent to or higher than Algebra 1:
 - Algebra 1
 - Any semester of the Integrated Math sequence greater than Math 1A (Math 1B, Math II, Math III, Math IV)
 - Algebra 2
 - Algebra 2/Trigonometry
 - Precalculus
 - Calculus
 - Other Advanced Math
 - Statistics
 - Additional Math – for courses that have Algebra 1 as a prerequisite
 - Any Algebra Support Math course may be combined with Algebra 1B or higher-level math to meet the Algebra 1 requirement.
 - Pre-Algebra may not be combined with Algebra 1B to meet the Algebra 1 requirement.
 - Math courses aligned with California standards, but not UC C Math approved, that are equivalent to or higher than Algebra 1, will satisfy the CDE Algebra 1 requirement.
- Although Validation rules apply, students must have a minimum of 20 math credits to meet the BCCHS math graduation requirements (e.g. Algebra 2B (5) + Geometry B (5) + Algebra Comp 1A (5) + Pre-Algebra 1B (5))

Courses that are not approved by UC may be used to fulfill the CDE math requirements. However, students must complete UC-approved math courses and may apply validation rules to meet the minimum CSU C-Math requirements to satisfy the BCCHS math graduation requirements.

D. Science: 2 years (20 credits)

One year (10 credits) of UC approved Biological Science from category “D” or “G”

One year (10 credits) of UC approved Physical Science from category “D” or “G” on the UC course portal

A yearlong course must be completed from category “D”

Biological Science: Completed courses must be listed under the **Biological / Life Sciences** discipline on the UC course portal. Biological science courses can only be combined if they share the same title or are paired with honors or AP versions of the same course (e.g., Biology A + AP Biology B).

Physical Science: The disciplines of **Chemistry, Physics and Earth & Space Sciences** listed on the UC course portal are considered Physical Sciences.

- Physical science courses can only be combined if they share the same title or are paired with honors or AP versions of the same course (e.g. Physics A + AP Physics 1B).
- Validation rules apply for Chemistry. However, since the CDE requires 10 credits for graduation, another Physical Science course may be completed to meet this requirement whenever validation is applied to Chemistry. (e.g. Chemistry B with a grade of C and Physics A with a grade of D qualifies for 10 credits of Physical Science)

Courses categorized as “**Interdisciplinary**” or “**Integrated**” may be used to fulfill either the Biological or Physical Science requirement. However, these courses may only be combined if they share similar titles and fall under the same category, or if they are paired with honors or AP versions of the same course (e.g., Environmental Science A (“D”) + AP Environmental Science B (“D”)).

Courses that are not UC “D” or “G” Science approved but are aligned with California Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), may be used to fulfill the CDE science graduation



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requirements. However, students are still required to meet the minimum CSU science course requirements to satisfy the BCCHS science graduation requirements. In such cases, students must complete one year of a UC/CSU approved biological science course and one year of a UC/CSU approved physical science course. Additionally, one year must be from the UC Category "D"-Science.

E. Language Other Than English (LOTE): 2 years (at least 5 credits)
Students must complete 2 years (or 20 credits) of UC approved LOTE courses to meet the BCCHS LOTE graduation requirements. Validation rules apply as necessary.

F. Visual & Performing Arts (VPA): 1 year (10 credits)
Students must complete 1 year or 10 credits of UC F-approved VPA courses in the same discipline. There are 5 disciplines in VPA: Theater, Music, Dance, Visual Arts, and Interdisciplinary. Students may complete any 2 semesters in the same discipline (e.g. DRAWING A + PAINTING A).

Courses approved as both CTE and VPA may be used to satisfy both requirements without the need to complete an additional 10 credits. If this occurs, students may complete any additional elective courses, whenever necessary, to meet the minimum credit requirement for graduation.

G. College Preparatory Elective: 1 year
Although UC and CSU require one year of an additional UC-approved A-G college prep elective, BCCHS students typically fulfill this requirement by completing Principles of American Democracy and Economics in 12th grade. Alternatively, students may satisfy this requirement with any other A-G approved courses.

H. Career Technical Education (CTE): 1 year
BCCHS students must complete 1 year or 10 credits of a CTE course in the same pathway and/or industry sector.

Some CTE courses may also satisfy the Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) requirement. In such cases, students are not required to complete an additional 10 credits to meet both the CTE and VPA requirements.

I. Health Requirement: 5 credits OR Alternate Health requirement
Students must complete 5 credits of Health Education to graduate from BCCHS. Beginning with the class of 2027, students may fulfill this requirement through courses that incorporate Comprehensive Sexual Health & HIV/AIDS Instruction into their curriculum.

J. Ethnic Studies: 5 credits
Beginning with the class of 2030, Students must complete 5 credits of an Ethnic Studies course to graduate from BCCHS.

K. Physical Education: 20 credits
Students in California must complete 2 years (or 20 credits) of physical education courses to receive high school diploma in California.

L. Financial Aid Requirement
Beginning with the 2022–2023 school year, students must fulfill the Financial Aid requirement to earn a BCCHS high school diploma. For more information, refer to AB 469.



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A-G REQUIREMENT EXEMPTION FOR LATE ENTRY TRANSFERS

Beginning in the 2025-26 school year, students that enroll at BCCHS during their third or fourth year of high school and previously attended a California school that did not offer UC/CSU approved courses will be exempt from the A-G course requirement for earning a BCCHS high school diploma. However, these students must still meet the following requirements to be eligible for a BCCHS high school diploma:

- A. Complete three years (30 credits) of history/social science courses aligned with the California Department of Education (CDE) high school graduation requirements.
- B. Complete four years (40 credits) of English language arts courses aligned to California state standards.
- C. Complete three years (30 credits) of mathematics, including courses equivalent to Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II, aligned with California Common Core State Standards.
- D. Complete two years (20 credits) of science, including one year each of biological and physical science, aligned with the California Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS).
- E. Complete two years (20 credits) of a Language Other Than English (LOTE).
- F. Complete one year (10 credits) of Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) within the same discipline.
- G. Complete one year (10 credits) of Career Technical Education (CTE) within the same pathway or industry sector.
- H. Complete 5 credits of Health or meet the alternate health requirement.
- I. Complete two years of Physical Education.
- J. Complete 5 credits of Ethnic Studies (required beginning with the Class of 2030).
- K. Earn a grade of "D" or better in all required coursework.
- L. Meet the Financial Air Requirement
- M. Accumulate a minimum of 230 total credits.
