## Summer Reading 2025

Research shows that students who read during the summer gain an average of 1 month of reading proficiency. Students who do not read over the summer lose an average of 2-3 months proficiency. When students self-select the books they read, they become more deeply involved in the learning process, which fosters an interest in reading.


