DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

On July 1, 2013, the California school finance funding model changed from its historical revenue limit and categorical program approach to a new system called the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). Along with the new funding system is a new accountability system which is designed to be broader and balanced between local and state priorities. On June 17, 2014, RUSD’s first Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) was approved by the Board of Education.

This evening, staff will provide a brief review of the LCAP process and review alignment of the eight LCAP priority areas with the Board of Education goals and RUSD’s identified student needs. Review of LCAP content and progress to date will be discussed along with next steps.
