DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

The official start of the annual budget development cycle for school districts is the release of the Governor's Budget Proposals in mid-January. Traditionally, the next major milestone in the process to determine funding levels is the release of the governor's May Revised Budget Proposals. On May 14, 2013, Governor Jerry Brown released his May Revised Budget Proposals. There were relatively minor revisions from the initial January proposal. Parallel and subsequent to the governor's proposals, both the Assembly and the Senate developed and released budget proposals.

On June 15, 2013, both houses of the State Legislature concluded their work on the 2013-14 State Budget and various accompanying trailer bills. The Education Omnibus Trailer Bill is Assembly Bill 86 which contains implementing language for the many education budget changes other than the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), such as details on deferrals, Common Core State Standards funding, and mandates. Assembly Bill 97 is the trailer bill that contains the implementing language for the LCFF. Additionally, Senate Bill 73 is the trailer bill that contains the implementing language for Proposition 39 (2012) energy funding.

The Board of Education adopted the initial 2013-14 All Funds Budget on June 17, 2013. That initial budget was prepared and recommended prior to any definitive information on the 2013-14 State Budget. As such, it was developed using a traditional approach to K-12 funding looking at overall Proposition 98 funding levels and applying a cost-of-living adjustment and deficit reduction factor to the District's revenue limit in order to compute a conservative revenue

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forecast. Expenditure projections were based on normal year-over-year incremental cost increases and Board-designated high priority / previously committed items.

Understanding that both the Proposition 98 funding levels and the funding formulas were in play, District staff developed a three phase approach to allocate any new funding resources starting with the most conservative revenue forecast and progressing through the phases to the funding level provided under the governor's proposed LCFF. This phased approach was reviewed by the Board of Education's Finance Subcommittee and was presented to the Board of Education on June 3, 2013.

The first phase is characterized as minimum revenue assumption and "must dos" and non-negotiable commitments previously made for the expenditure assumptions. This first allocation is what the District's Initial Budget (pre-July 1) was built upon. The revenue relied on the computed cost of living adjustment factor of 1.565% applied only to the District's Base Revenue Limit and the improvement in the Revenue Limit Deficit Factor to determine its revenue growth over 2012-13. Several high priority budget expenditure items were included in the first phase – each of which represented a pre-existing commitment.

The second phase is characterized as using the May Revised estimates for the LCFF. While the June Compromise / Final Budget estimates are available and total roughly \$500,000 more than the May Revised estimates, there remains some uncertainty as to details. The second phase is

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also characterized by high priority expenditure items that the Board of Education and staff have identified overtime to address pressure points on school and District operations. The timing of the second allocation will be addressed within the legally required "45 Day Revision" budget adjustment process and come to the Board of Education for consideration at their July and August meetings. The revenue reflected in this phase includes the proposed \$212 per-ADA one-time funds for implementation of the Common Core State Standards and the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (CCSS/SBAC) (a 25% increase over the May Revised). The expenditure plan reflects Board of Education and staff identified high priority items to address high need areas with school and District operations. These high need areas are consistent with the Board of Education's adopted goals, collective bargaining commitments and operational needs within the District.
