



Short Description: From time to time, the District needs to dispose of items that are surplus or obsolete. As an alternative, some items may be donated. Approval is requested for the disposal of surplus items otherwise constituting E-Waste (electronic waste) through donation to a charitable organization.

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**DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:**

Electronic equipment becomes obsolete and surplus after extensive use and or failure which may not be economically repaired. Items in this condition must be disposed of in accordance with District Policy, California Education Code and environmental regulations designed to protect from electronic waste (e-waste). As an alternative to traditional disposal, and depending on the declared value of the item, some items may be donated. California Education Code Section 17546 (c) provides that if a governing board, “by unanimous vote of those members present, finds that the property is of insufficient value to defray the costs of arranging a sale, the property may be donated to a charitable organization deemed appropriate by the board, or it may be disposed of in the local public dump”. Given the environmental regulations associated to the disposition of electronic equipment, disposal in the public dump is not an option, and other disposal methods are costly.

The District partners with SmartRiverside and their Digital Inclusion Program (a charitable organization) to help provide low income students and their families with computers that they otherwise could not afford. Additionally, SmartRiverside is a state certified e-waste collection facility.

The electronic equipment on the attached list has been withdrawn from various sites and declared surplus/e-waste. Typically the items are considered surplus when they either become uneconomical to repair or obsolete for classroom usage.

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**FISCAL IMPACT:** None

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education 1) find and declare that the electronic equipment on the attached list is surplus and of insufficient value to defray the costs of arranging a sale, and 2) authorize staff to dispose of these items per District policy and California Education Code by donating such to SmartRiverside to be used in their Digital Inclusion Program.

Short Description: The Board of Education will consider adopting Resolution No. 2012/13-03 asking the Riverside County Committee on School District Organization to approve and establish trustee areas from which District governing Board Members will be elected in a by-trustee area election process.

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### DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

On August 15, 2011, the Board of Education began a conversation about undertaking a study to determine whether or not the need exists to consider the establishment of trustee areas for Governing Board elections pursuant to the provisions of the California Education Code and the California Elections Code. On February 6, 2012, the Board of Education continued the discussion by identifying specific legal and demographical criteria that would be used to draw potential districting scenarios. Eight criteria were broken down into two categories – “legal” and “local preference” criteria. Based on these criteria, potential trustee area map scenarios were prepared and reviewed by the Board of Education on May 7, May 21, June 4 and June 18, 2012. Additionally, The Board of Education held three community meetings on May 14, 15 and 16, 2012, and a Public Hearing on May 21, 2012.

On June 18, 2012, the Board of Education adopted Resolution 2011/12-86 – Resolution of the Board of Education of the Riverside Unified School District Recommending That the Riverside County Committee on School District Organization Approve a By-Trustee Area Election Process – formally requesting that the District’s election system change from the current at-large system to a system based on trustee-areas. A Public Hearing was held on July 16, 2012, seeking input on a waiver request to the State Board of Education regarding waiving Education Code Sections 5019 and 5020. Subsequent to the

Public Hearing, the Board of Education adopted a waiver request to waive portions of Education Code Sections 5019, 5021 and 5030, and all of Education Code Section 5020.

On June 18, 2012, the Board of Education asked staff and community members and their representatives to meet and discuss a potential trustee area map that would create a majority-minority area. The meeting to fulfill this request was held on July 11, 2012, and included District staff, consultants and approximately 20 members of the community and their representatives. Staff has continued to refine map scenario options and shared various scenarios with community members and their representatives.

On August 20, 2012, the Board of Education considered potential Trustee Area Map Scenario H. The agenda item was tabled and deferred to September 4. On September 4, 2012, the Board of Education considered potential Trustee Area Map Scenarios I, J, K. A motion was made and seconded in support of Scenario J, but the motion failed upon vote. The agenda item was tabled and deferred to September 17.

An outline of the pros and cons of each potential Trustee Area Map Scenario/Option is attached. In addition, a more simple description of each potential Trustee Area Map Scenario/Option is provided below. Recall that “Scenarios” and “Letters” are maps prepared by the District; “Options” and “Numbers” are maps prepared by community members and their representatives. While most of the follow-on scenarios are refinements of previous versions, there are four distinct approaches reflected in the potential Trustee Area Map Scenario/Options.

Theme 1 – Legal and Local Criteria

- Scenario A: Original Map Scenario
- Scenario B: A refinement of Scenario A with attention to community of interests
- Scenario C: A refinement of Scenario B with adjustments Downtown and Ramona
- Scenario D: A refinement of Scenario B with adjustments Canyon Crest and Ramona

Theme 2 – Legal Criteria, Ignores Incumbency

- Scenario E: Original Map Scenario drawn without regard to incumbency

Theme 3 – Creation of a Majority-Minority Trustee Area, Ignores Incumbency

- Option 3: Original Majority-Minority option

Theme 4 – Creation of a Majority-Minority Trustee Area, Local Criteria

- Option 6: A refinement of Option 3 with incumbency honored
- Option 8: New Majority-Minority option
- Scenario F: New Majority-Minority option
- Scenario G: A refinement of Scenario F with adjustments to JWN HS and Highgrove
- Scenario H: A refinement of Scenario G with adjustments to Downtown and Emerson

The Board of Education has previously considered draft Trustee Area Map Scenarios A-H, and Option 3, Option 6 and Option 8. Staff has considered additional draft Trustee Area Map Options 1 and 2. The party that submitted Option 1 and Option 2 has withdrawn them from consideration.

Subsequent to the Board’s last meeting, Trustee Area Map Scenarios I, J and K have been developed and are attached. All were shared with representatives of community members on August 27 and 28, including the supporting data files.

Scenario I - Refinement of Scenario H by 1) moving all of Highgrove into Trustee Area 3, 2) moving University Heights MS and its adjacent areas into Trustee Area 3, and 3) making changes to the Downtown neighborhood to correspond to the movement of University Heights MS in order to balance CVAP data. While staff believes that Scenario H poses a long-term risk to maintaining a majority-minority area, the Federal Voting Rights Act focuses on only what exists today and leaves the long-term concerns to future revisions of trustee area boundaries. The Hispanic/Latino CVAP (2005-2009) percentage in Trustee Area 3 is 50.06%.

Scenario J – Refinement of Option 6 by 1) including the area of Victoria north of Arlington in Trustee Area 2, 2) moving areas of Orangecrest south of John F. Kennedy Drive into Trustee Area 1, and 3) smoothing out the line between Trustee Areas 4 and 5 through the Ramona neighborhood. Staff has reservations with Trustee Areas 4 and 5 in Scenario J. The Hispanic/Latino CVAP (2005-2009) percentage in Trustee Area 3 is 50.23%.

Scenario K – Refinement of Scenario B by 1) extending Trustee Area 4 north to Third Street (like Scenarios C and D), 2) moving the Canyon Crest “triangle” to Trustee Area 3 (like Scenario D), and 3) including the area of Victoria north of Arlington in Trustee Area 2. Scenario K does not include a pure majority-minority trustee area based on current data. However, in a longer term view, it has the potential to grow to two majority-minority areas. The Hispanic/Latino CVAP (2005-2009) percentage in Trustee Area 3 is 33.03% and in Trustee Area 4 is 40.34%.

As written, Resolution No. 2012/13-03 adopts Trustee Area Map Scenario I. Scenarios J and K were prepared and are part of this consideration as a result of suggestions of individual Board Members that were made subsequent to the August 20 Board Meeting. Specifically, Scenario J was developed as an improvement to Option 6, and Scenario K was developed as an improvement to Scenario B (C and D).

Copies of each of the potential Trustee Area Map Scenarios and Options are attached. Also attached is a Summary of the Consideration of Scenarios which provides pros and cons for each scenario and option considered in this process.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt Resolution No. 2012/13-03 – Resolution of the Board of Education of the Riverside Unified School District Recommending that the Riverside County Committee on School District Organization Approve and Establish Trustee Areas From Which District Governing Board Members Will Be Elected in a By-Trustee Area Election Process.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE

**WHEREAS**, The Riverside Unified School District (“District”) currently uses an at-large system of electing its governing board members; and

**WHEREAS**, In a by-trustee area system of election, candidates for the District’s governing board (the “Board”) must reside within a specific geographic subarea of the District called a “trustee area” and candidates are elected only by the voters of that trustee area; and

**WHEREAS**, One method of transitioning from an at-large electoral system to a by trustee area electoral system is for the school district board of trustees to petition the local county committee on school district organization by resolution to initiate the transition under California Education Code section 5019(c)(1); and

**WHEREAS**, the Riverside County Committee on School District Organization (“Committee”) has indicated that it will initiate this process on behalf of the District at the District’s request, and will consider any recommendation on specific trustee areas made by the District; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 18, 2012, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2011/12-87 recommending that the Committee approve a by-trustee area election process; and

**WHEREAS**, District staff and consultants have prepared proposed trustee area plans and recommendations, and community representatives have prepared proposed trustee area plans and recommendations (the “Plans”) that the Board has considered (Scenarios A – K and Options 3, 6 and 8); and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has conducted public forums on May 14, 2012, May 15, 2012, and May 16, 2012, to receive public input and comment on the Plans developed at that time; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has conducted a public hearing on May 21, 2012 to receive public input and comment on the Plans developed at that time; and

**WHEREAS**, at the Board’s request, District staff and consultants met with community representatives on July 11, 2012 to garner a better understanding of community interests; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has considered revised Plans on June 18, 2012, August 20, 2012 and September 4, 2012; and

**WHEREAS**, beginning May 7, 2012, the District staff posted all relevant information on the District’s web site and has collected electronic messages as a means to receive public input and comment on the Plans; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has considered all such public input and comment on the Plans; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board desires to adopt Plan I and hereby recommends Plan I to the Committee for its consideration based upon the findings, analysis and recommendations contained in the report attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit “A”; and

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Board of Education of the Riverside Unified School District as follows:

1. That the above recitals are true and correct.
2. That the Board hereby adopts Plan I and recommends Plan I to the Committee for consideration and adoption.
3. That the Superintendent and/or his designee take all actions necessary to notify the Committee of the Board’s determination forthwith and provide whatever assistance may be required by the Committee to complete the process.



Short Description: It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt Resolution No. 2012/13-13 to declare its Intention to Grant an Easement and Right-of-Way to the City of Riverside for a Temporary Construction Easement at 700 Highlander Drive and Declaring a Public Hearing.

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**DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:**

Due to the extension of the Perris Valley Line Commuter Rail, it is necessary to grant a temporary construction easement along portions of the west and northwest property lines (along Watkins Drive) of Highland Elementary School, located at 700 Highlander Drive, to the Riverside County Transportation Commission (“County”). The temporary easement is to facilitate the construction and/or installation of tracks, catenary systems, drainage structures, utilities, signals, retaining walls, and slopes. The temporary easement also includes rehabilitation of the District’s property at the conclusion of the project.

The County’s right to use the property is for a period of eighteen (18) months from the Notice to Proceed. In addition to the restoration of the District’s property, the County shall compensate the District in the amount of four thousand, two hundred and sixty dollars (\$4,260.00), as consideration.

The County has the option to extend the term of the easement for up to twenty-four (24) months, following the initial eighteen (18) month period. For the term extension, the County shall compensate the District in the amount of two dollars (\$2.00) per square foot, capitalized at nine percent (9%), or two hundred and thirty-seven dollars (\$237.00) per month (as rounded).

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**FISCAL IMPACT:** Compensation in the amount of four thousand, two hundred and sixty dollars (\$4,260.00) will be provided to the District as consideration for the temporary easement. Compensation may increase by an additional five thousand, six hundred and eighty-eight dollars (\$5,688.00) if the option to extend the term for up to twenty-four (24) months, at a monthly rate of two hundred and thirty-seven dollars (\$237.00) per month, is exercised.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt Resolution 2012/13-13 - to declare its Intention to Grant an Easement and Right-of-Way to the Riverside County Transportation Commission for Temporary Construction Easement at 700 Highlander Drive, and Declaring a Public Hearing.

Groves to the Riverside City School District, first being described in that certain grant deed, recorded February 28, 1957, in Book 2047, at Page 201, of Official Records; and the second being a portion of that certain grant deed recorded October 21, 1957, in Book 2165, at Page 389, of Official Records, both in the Office of the County Recorder, Riverside County, being described as follows:

Being a strip of land of variable width lying easterly of the northeasterly right-of-way line of Parcel 3 as described in that certain Grant Deed and Grant of Easement to the Riverside County Transportation Commission, recorded March 30, 1993, as Instrument No. 116807, in said Office of the County Recorder, said northeasterly right-of-way line being more particularly described as follows:

**BEGINNING** at the intersection of the east line of the west one-half of the northwest one-quarter of said Section 20, with the said northeasterly right-of-way line of Parcel 3;

Thence along said northeasterly right-of way line, North 42°18'19" West, 295.00 feet to a point hereinafter referred to as Point 'A';

Thence continuing along said right-of-way line, North 42°18'19" West, 512.82 feet to the beginning of a curve concave northeasterly having a radius of 5,679.65 feet;

Thence northwesterly along said curve through a central angle of 05°01'29", an arc distance of 498.09 feet to the most westerly corner of that certain parcel described in said (2165 O.R. 389).

Said strip of land shall be 20.00 feet in width lying easterly of and parallel with said right-of-way line from the Point of Beginning to Point 'A'; and 10.00 feet in width lying easterly of and parallel with said right-of-way line from Point 'A' to the northerly terminus.


Said strip of land shall also be lengthened or shortened so as to terminate southerly at the east line of said parcel described in (2047 O.R. 201), and terminate northerly at the northwesterly line of said parcel described in (2165 O.R. 389).



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**DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:**

REACH Leadership Academy School of Math, Science and Technology is requesting a material revision of their Charter in order to be eligible for funding under the Public Charter Schools Grant Application administered by the California Department of Education. Element 8: Admission Requirements has been revised to clearly delineate: 1) students who will be exempt from the lottery, including existing students, 2) all preferences that will be employed in the lottery including existing students. The Governing Board of REACH approved the material revision at their July 30, 2012 board meeting. All material revisions of a Charter Petition require approval from the Board of Education of the authorizing agency.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the material revision of the charter of the REACH Leadership Academy School of Math, Science and Technology.

## **ELEMENT 8: ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

### ***California Education Code 47605(b)(5)(H)***

#### **I. Admission Policy**

REACH Leadership Academy will admit all pupils who wish to attend the school as outlined in Education Code, section §47605(d)(2)(A).

Students shall be admitted in accordance with the provisions of law as prescribed in the Charter Schools Act or as said laws may in the future be amended. It will be a desire of REACH that students and their parents complete an agreement which stipulates the commitment to abide by all school rules, procedures, codes of behavior and dress, attendance and timeliness, participation in school activities, academic progress, and other matters deemed by the school to be essential for a successful learning environment. However, no student shall be excluded nor discouraged from attending if such an agreement is not completed.

#### **II. Admissions Requirements and Assurances.**

There are no specific admission requirements for REACH other than submission of all proper paperwork and verification of all required health screening and immunizations. REACH shall not discriminate and will ensure that no person is subjected to discrimination on the basis of physical or mental disability, gender, nationality, race or ethnicity, color, religion, disability, sexual condition, sexual orientation, home language, or any other characteristic that is contained in the definition of hate crimes set forth in Section 422.55 of the Penal Code or against any person based upon the perception that the person has any of those characteristics or that person is associated with a person who has, or is perceived to have, any of those characteristics. [Ref. Education Code Section 47605 (d)(1)]. REACH will be non-sectarian in its programs, curriculum, and operations and will not charge tuition. REACH will adhere to all state and federal laws regarding the minimum age of students. The city or county that the student resides in will not determine admission eligibility. Enrollment and admission will remain the same for all students. Past academic performance, presence of an IEP, EL designation, or any other factor, other than expulsion from another school, will not be considered during the enrollment or admission stages.

#### **III. Open Enrollment**

Open enrollment for REACH will commence March 1 through June 15. All pupils who wish to attend REACH and who are residents of California, regardless of place of residence will be admitted.

#### IV. Public Random Lottery

Should the amount of pupils whom wish to attend REACH exceed the enrollment limit, a public random drawing (lottery) will take place to determine the school's enrollment per Education Code, Section 47605(d)(2)(B).

#### V. Lottery Process Communication

The school will designate an application **deadline of July 15, and** only applications received prior to the deadline will be considered for the public random drawing. Public notice will be posted in a public location and the school website regarding the date and time of the public drawing once the deadline date has passed. All parents will be notified, within 7 days of enrollment closing, of the Lottery date and details via mail, email, and an automated phone message. The lottery will be conducted on a Saturday afternoon so all interested parties will be able to attend.

#### VI. Fair Lottery Procedures

REACH will use a neutral proctor, such as the League of Women Voters to ensure the lottery procedures are fairly executed. The proctor will draw the pupil names and verify lottery procedures are fairly executed. REACH will keep a file documenting the fair execution of lottery procedures.

#### VII. Lottery Preferences and Exemptions

REACH shall admit all students who wish to attend. Admission, except for in the case of a public random drawing, shall not be determined by the place of residence of the pupil or his or her parents. If there are more students who wish to attend than capacity, attendance, except for existing students of REACH, shall be determined by public random drawing by grade level. Admission preferences in the public random drawing as described in Education Code Section 47605(d)(2)(B) shall be given to the following students in the following order:

- a. Students already enrolled in REACH
- b. Children of Founding Families\*
- c. Children of REACH teachers
- d. Siblings of enrolled students
- e. Residents of the District

\*As defined by the REACH Board policy and definition of "Founding Family"

*(Revisions highlighted in yellow)*

Pursuant to federal and state guidelines, during any period of funding for the Public Charter Schools Grant Program ("PCSGP"), the following shall apply:

- 1) The public random drawing will be held as a single weighted public drawing.
  - a. Residents of the District will be given a 2:1 weighting factor, or as otherwise agreed upon with the District.
  - b. No other preferences other than "residents of the District" shall be used during the PCSGP funding period.
- 2) The following categories of students will be exempt from the public random drawing:
  - a. Students already enrolled in REACH
  - b. Children of Founding Families
  - c. Children of REACH teachers
  - d. Siblings of enrolled students
- 3) No other exemptions other than those listed above in 2.a through 2.d shall be used during the PCSGP funding period.
- 4) The sum of all exemptions for children of REACH teachers and children of Founding Families combined will not exceed 10% of total enrollment.

Per state law, REACH will follow school entrance age laws.

#### **VIII. Waiting List Development, Communication, Record Keeping**

Once the grades are filled to capacity, applications will continue to be drawn and placed on a wait list in the order drawn. Should there be a waiting list for enrollment, those on that list will be offered enrollment when space is available and according to their position determined by the public random drawing.

#### **IX. Waiting List Communication**

REACH will contact the parents/guardians of students who have been promoted off the waiting list and inform parents/guardians of the timeline in which they must respond by mail. Parents will have 10 business days to confirm enrollment acceptance and have one month to enroll their child.

#### **X. Lottery Procedures Record Keeping**

REACH will document and keep on file the lottery procedures and fair execution of lottery procedures for review at all times.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the school may refine lottery policies and procedures following the first year of operations in accordance with a written policy adopted by the governing authority of the school. A copy of the revised policy, designed to improve the school's lottery efforts, shall be provided to

Riverside Unified School District within 30 calendar days of approval by the REACH Board and prior to the enrollment period of the year in which the revised lottery policy will be implemented.

It will be at the discretion of Riverside Unified School District if any changed lottery procedures constitute a “Material Revision” to the charter. If it is deemed that such changes do constitute a Material Revision, REACH will proceed with all the proper measures to formally submit the revised policies for consideration by Riverside Unified School District.
