Throughout June, we will continue working hard to ensure your children remain actively engaged and learning until the very end.


Thank you once again for your continued support and for being such dedicated partners in your children's education.

Enjoy the final month of school, and we wish you and your families a safe and joyful summer!



# HEALTH OFFICE END OF SCHOOL YEAR REMINDERS

Health examinations are required for all new students and those entering 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade. The <u>NYSED Student Health Examination Form for School</u> is available online. Please download and print the form prior to your child's appointment with their healthcare provider. The forms are on the district website under the Building Information tab, then select Health Services.

If your child has medication in the Health Office, NYS law requires that it must be picked up by a parent or guardian or it has to be discarded at the end of the school year. If you are unable to come to the Health Office before June 26<sup>th</sup>, and do not want your child's medication discarded, please contact the Health Office at (631) 474-2721. New medication authorization forms are required each school year and can be found on the district website under the Building Information tab, then select Health Services.
