REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING TUESDAY, DECEMBER 15, 2020

The St. Bernard Parish School Board met in a Regular Monthly Meeting on Tuesday, December 15, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. in the St. Bernard Parish School Board Office. Following the Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance, the Secretary called the roll. Present were, Mrs. Diana B. Dysart, President, Mrs. Darleen P. Asevedo, Mr. Donald D. Campbell, Mrs. Katherine K. Lemoine, Mr. Clifford M. Englande, Mr. Joseph V. Long, Sr., Mr. Sean K. Warner and Mrs. Rosiland R. White. Mr. William H. Egan, Ms. Carly C. Jackson and Mr. Shelton P. Smith were absent.

On a point of privilege, Mrs. Dysart thanked Mrs. Lemoine and the Nunez Community College for their gift of face masks for the entire Board.

Mrs. Dysart began the meeting by opening a public hearing and inviting the public to speak regarding the Virtual School Discipline Policy to be included in the Guide to Student Conduct. With no one appearing to speak, Mr. Tommie Powell presented information on this new policy. After Mr. Powell completed his presentation, Mrs. Dysart closed the public hearing and asked for a motion to confirm. Mr. Englande moved to close the public hearing. Mrs. Lemoine seconded the motion which passed unanimously by a voice vote of the members present.

On motion from Mrs. Asevedo with a second by Mr. Warner, the Board voted unanimously by a voice vote of the members present to incorporate the report of the December 8, 2020 General Committee Meeting into the minutes of the December 15, 2020 Regular Monthly Meeting.

GENERAL COMMITTEE REPORT TUESDAY, DECEMBER 8, 2020

The St. Bernard Parish School Board met as a Committee of the Whole on Tuesday, December 8, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the St. Bernard Parish School Board Office. Following the Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance, the Secretary called the roll. Members present were; Mrs. Diana B. Dysart, President, Mrs. Darleen P. Asevedo, Mr. Donald D. Campbell, Mr. William H. Egan, Ms. Carly C. Jackson, Mrs. Katherine K. Lemoine, Mr. Clifford M. Englande, , Mr. Sean K. Warner and Mrs. Rosiland R. White. Mr. Joseph V. Long, Sr. and Mr. Shelton P. Smith were absent.

Mrs. Dysart welcomed Ms. Cheramie Kerth, Special Education Supervisor to introduce Mr. Michael Bouche' and Ms. Allana Fast of Ochsner Hospital System to recognize them for a donation of masks for teachers. Ms. Kerth explained that Ochsner Health has donated 600 windowed masks to the St. Bernard Parish Public School District. She stated that the cloth masks with a clear vinyl window in the middle are designed to provide teachers and staff the opportunity to maintain proper masking while removing potential communication barriers. Mr. Bouche' and Ms. Fast explained that research indicated the need for students and/or young patients to see the mouth and facial expression as an additional stimulus for learning and understanding. This is what prompted the development of these masks and the donation to the schools.

Ms. Voitier and the Committee thanked the representatives from Ochsner for their donation which is sure to assist in teaching and learning. Ms. Voitier also mentioned a donation from the Office of Public Health of 2000 rapid Covid-19 tests which can be used by our partners with the Methodist Foundation who staff the Nunez Community College clinic. These tests allow for testing teachers, students and family expeditiously and conveniently.

Mrs. Dysart welcomed Ms. Alex Schneider to present Super News for the month of December. Ms. Schneider began by reviewing the December Communications Report of Press and Social Media coverage during the previous month. The Super News video presented Teachers of the Year, they are Alaa Alkurd of Arabi Elementary, Gabrielle Arceneaux of Chalmette Elementary, Kayla Serigne of Davies Elementary, Chelsea Hayes of Gauthier Elementary, Dina Martinez of Lacoste Elementary, Katie Green of Meraux Elementary, Greg Patterson of Smith Elementary, John Trevino of Rowley Alternative, Bridget Derbyshire of Andrew Jackson Middle, Amber Manino of St. Bernard Middle, Sabrina Cunningham of Trist Middle School and Annelise Cassar Tedesco of Chalmette High. District wide winners named were Katie Green of Arlene Meraux Elementary, Amber Manino of St. Bernard Middle and Annelise Cassar Tedesco of Chalmette High School.

Mrs. Dysart thanked Mrs. Schneider for her presentation and congratulated all the Teachers of the Year.

Mrs. Lemoine, Education Committee Chair, presented the next agenda item regarding an update on Head Start. Dr. Raviotta appeared before the Education Committee to provide the Head Start update and Annual Report. Dr. Raviotta presented items that are mandated to be presented to the Head Start governing board, which is the School Board. In the series of handouts to be presented Dr. Raviotta began with the Head Start Program Annual Report. This Annual Report consists of the following information; Funding of the program, budgetary expenditure projections for those funds, total number of children and families served, percentage of students who received medical and dental exams, parent involvement information and the final component is how they transition students for kindergarten.

Other handouts offered were; Head Start Governing Body Roles and Responsibilities; Head Start Program Goals and Head Start correspondence regarding waivers for bus child restraint systems and monitors; The Summary Narrative of Fall and Winter Data for 2019-2020 which refers to the assessment of improvements made by students during the school year; and finally the Summary Narrative of Fall Data for the 2020-2021.

Dr. Raviotta thanked all of the Head Start administrators, teachers and staff for their hard work and professionalism on a daily basis. He addressed all questions from the Committee. Mrs. Lemoine thanked him for the presentation and his hard work within the Head Start Program. The Head Start Annual Report is shown below.

127 children received an oral exam by a dentist. 127 children received preventive care and 19 received additional treatment.

(F) Information about parent involvement activities.

The St. Bernard Parish School System's Head Start program provided a number of opportunities for parents to become involved in their children's preschool experience. Parents were first introduced to the Head Start Program at Orientation followed by Home Visits. During the school year, parents were able to conference with teachers and paraprofessionals regarding their child's progress at Parent-Teacher Conference Day. An open door policy gave parents access to the child's classroom in the course of the school day. Parent information workshops on topics such as Work Force, Make-N-Take sessions, and School Readiness

Training were held throughout the year. Parents received information based on their needs identified on the Family Interest Survey in the areas of Disciplining your Child, Stages of Child Development, Adult Education Programs, Mental Wellness for Children and Families, and Health Issues. Informational flyers were sent home monthly. Parents were encouraged to participate with their children during Reading around the World days and were also able to accompany their children on all field trips. Parents were able to participate in parent involvement activities held on their elementary school sites such as Family Math & Literacy Night, the Health Fair, Book Fairs, Dad's Day and Fall Festivals. Grandparents were invited to participate in Grandparent's Day at each school. Parents were also able to participate in our Parenting Curriculum Sessions at each school site. NOTE: The Annual Transitioning to Kindergarten Workshop was not held due to school closures because of COVID.

(G) The agency's efforts to prepare children for kindergarten.

The St. Bernard Parish School System's Head Start program served 127 eligible children four years of age by September 30, 2019. Twelve children with IEPs received services.

Ms. Voitier presented the Personnel changes for the month of December. Mrs. Dysart congratulated Kathy Pechon on her retirement from teaching at Chalmette High, Patrice Trosclair of Davies Elementary and Virginia Neal of Trist Middle School and thanked them for their years of service. Ms. Dysart thanked Ms. Voitier for this presentation.

Mr. Englande, acting on behalf of Executive Committee Chair Joe Long who was absent welcomed Mr. Tommie Powell, Child Welfare and Attendance Supervisor, regarding the consideration of adopting a Virtual School Discipline Policy to be included in the Guide to Student Conduct.

Mr. Powell began with some background on Act No. 48 of the 2020 Second Extraordinary Session of the Louisiana State Legislature. It states that it is an act to amend and reenact R.S. 17:416(C)(4) and (5) and to enact R.S. 17:416(K), relative to student discipline to provide for judicial review of certain discipline actions; to provide for discipline policies applicable during online instruction; to provide awarding of damages and attorney fee; to provide for applicability; and to provide for related matters. In section K of Act No. 48 it states that for the purposes of this Section, "virtual instruction" means instruction provided to a student through an electronic delivery medium including but not limited to electronic learning platforms that connect to a student in a remote location to classroom instruction. Act No. 48 also states in Section 4 that no later than December 31, 2020, every public school board shall comply with the provisions of R.S. 17:416.8 and convene a meeting of its disciplinary policy review committee to update all policies and procedures relative to conduct that occurs at home or other locations that are not school property where a student is participating in virtual instruction.

Mr. Powel then stated that the St. Bernard Parish School District Discipline Policy Review Team met on Tuesday, December 1, 2020 in order to comply with Act No. 48. The review team members were:

Mr. William Schneider – Assistant Principal at Chalmette High School

Ms. Andrea Licciardi – Principal of Andrew Jackson Middle School

Mr. Todd Larche – Assistant Principal of Andrew Jackson Middle School

Ms. Shannon Meyer – Parent from Andrew Jackson Middle School

Dennis Bradley – Teacher from Chalmette High School

Mr. Powell stated that he has brought to the Committee a draft of the Virtual Discipline Policy for their consideration to be adopted and added to the School District's Guide to Student Conduct.

Ms. Voitier added that in an abundance of caution, she requests that the Committee, in order to closely review this policy between this General Committee Meeting and the December 15th Regular Monthly Board Meeting, pass this agenda item on to the Regular Monthly meeting without a recommendation. This will allow for a Public Hearing to be held regarding this policy before the Board takes action on adopting this policy and adding it to the Guide to Student Conduct.

Mr. Warner moved to move this agenda item on to the Regular Monthly Meeting without a recommendation. Ms. Jackson seconded the motion which passes unanimously by a voice vote of the members present.

Mr. Englande, again, acting as Executive Committee Chair, welcomed Ms. Alex Schneider who presented four (4) policies that need to be revised in conjunction with the aforementioned Act No. 48. Mrs. Schneider presented the first policy, BD – School Board Policy.

Ms. Schneider stated the change clarifies language which states that the School Board does not appoint a discipline committee, only establishes it in accordance with statutory guidelines.

With a motion from Mrs. Dysart, seconded by Ms. Lemoine, the Committee voted unanimously by the members present to recommend to the Board to approve the revisions to this policy of BD – School Board Policy.

The next policy concerns the revision of policy JD - Discipline. Mrs. Schneider explained that this revision is mainly to include a new section titled, "Discipline of Students Engaged in Virtual Instruction. The definition for virtual instruction will also be added to the end of the Definitions section.

With a motion from Mr. Warner, seconded by Ms. Jackson, the Committee voted unanimously by a voice vote of the members present to recommend to the Board to approve the revisions to the policy JD - Discipline.

Ms. Schneider next presented policies JDD – Suspension and JDE – Placement at the Alternative School. Both policies have been revised to provide the right for a parent or tutor of a student who is recommended for expulsion to a review by the School Board then they may appeal to the district court, even if the recommendation for expulsion is reduced to a suspension.

Mrs. Dysart moved to recommend that the Board approve the revision to policy JDD – Suspension. Seconded by Mrs. White, the motion passed unanimously by a voice vote of the members present.

Mrs. Lemoine moved to recommend that the Board approve the revision to policy JDE – Placement at the Alternative School. Seconded by Mrs. White, the motion passed unanimously by a voice vote of the members present.

Mr. Englande moved on with Executive Committee business by welcoming

Ms. Lumetta, Assistant Superintendent to discuss the adoption of the 2021 through 2022 School Calendar. Ms. Lumetta first congratulated the calendar committee that was formed by Ms. Maggie Roussell. She then explained the differences between the three choices being voted on by the school district full-time employees. These options are laid out in the handout below.

Ms. Lumetta stated that each of the three options seem to have been attractive as evidenced by the very close voting between the options but in the end, option #1 was the winner. The highlights of that option are as follows; Classes begin for students on August 6^{th,.} Fall Break is on November 1st. Professional Development Days are on November 2nd and January 18th. Report Card Conference Nights are on October 19th, 20th, & 21st. Easter Holidays begin on April 14th with classes resuming on April 20th.

Mr. Warner moved recommend to the Board to approve Option 1 of the proposed school calendars for 2021-2022 school year. Seconded by Mr. Campbell, the motion passed by a voice vote of the members present.

Mr. Warner as Finance Committee Chair welcomed Mr. Fernandez to address the next agenda item regarding the Administration's request for proposals for Telecommunication Services. Mr. Fernandez stated that this request for proposal was advertised in the St. Bernard Voice,

www.periscopholdings.com, St. Bernard School Board website and Erate website. Proposals were also mailed to 4 vendors who showed interest but only one proposal was received. Cox Business proposes commencing on July 1, 2021 with an initial 3 year contract with 2 optional 12 month extensions. Cox will provide an integrated system including delivery, installation, training, in-service and maintenance of a turnkey system compatible with our existing equipment.

With a motion from Mrs. Dysart and a second from Mrs. Lemoine, the Committee voted unanimously by a voice vote of the members present to recommend to the Board to approve Cox Business as our Telecommunications Services provider.

Continuing with Finance Committee business Mr. Warner welcomed Mrs. Joni Blum to present the bid tabulation for Spices and Seasonings (Class 2), Cereal, Dried Beans and Crackers (Class 3), Frozen Foods (Class 5), Meat and Meat Products (Class 6), Poultry and Eggs (Class 7), Seafood Products (Class 8) and Canned Goods (Class 9) for the period of January 1, 2021 to June 30, 2021.

Mr. Campbell moved to recommend to the full Board the approval of the lowest bidder on each item on the aforementioned bid tabulation. Seconded by Mrs. Lemoine, the motion passed with no objections by a roll call vote of the members present.

Under Superintendent's recommendations Ms. Voitier stated that the under this pandemic situation many holiday happenings are being pared back but the season continues and teachers continue to keep the classroom productive and celebratory.

On motion of Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mrs. Asevedo, and passed by a unanimous voice vote of the members present, the meeting was adjourned.

Mr. Long moved to approve the minutes of the October 27, 2020 Regular Monthly Meeting as published on November 27, 2020. Seconded by Mrs. White, the motion passed unanimously by a voice vote of the members present.

Mr. Campbell moved to approve the minutes of the November 17, 2020 Regular Monthly Meeting as published on November 27, 2020. Seconded by Mr. Englande, the motion passed unanimously by a voice vote of the members present.

Without a recommendation from the Committee, Mr. Warner moved to approve the new Virtual School Discipline Policy to be included in the Guide to Student Conduct. Mr. Englande seconded the motion which passed unanimously by a voice vote of the members present. The entire policy is shown below.

ST. BERNARD PARISH SCHOOLS VIRTUAL DISCIPLINE POLICY

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the St. Bernard Parish School

System has made virtual classes available to students. Students may also be required to attend school virtually when schools are closed due to inclement weather or other unanticipated emergencies. The St. Bernard Parish School Board adopts this Virtual Discipline Policy in order to clarify expectations for student conduct in the virtual classroom and to provide notice of the possible consequences of inappropriate conduct in the virtual classroom.

Regardless of the model of instruction, student conduct is governed at all times by La. R.S. 17:416 and the Student Code of Conduct. Conduct that is unacceptable in the physical classroom is, under most circumstances, equally unacceptable in the virtual classroom. While students and parents normally have an expectation of privacy in their home, conduct that occurs in front of a camera and in view of peers and teachers in the virtual classroom may subject students to disciplinary action.

The context in which student behavior occurs is important, however, and will be taken into consideration by School and District administrators in determining whether there has been a violation of the Code of Conduct, the severity of the infraction, and the appropriate penalty, if any, under the circumstances.

Privacy and the Virtual Classroom

Students and parents, typically, have a reasonable expectation of privacy with regard to what takes place in their home *outside of the view of teachers and peers in the virtual classroom*. In order to ensure that students and teachers are able to work and learn in a safe and orderly virtual environment, it is imperative that students have a quiet, well-lit "classroom" space – free, to the extent possible, from toys, images, messages, personal property, or other items that may distract from teaching and learning or that may subject the student to disciplinary action if possessed on school busses, in the regular classroom, or on school property.

Students should be cautioned that the virtual classroom is for instruction and for engaging with peers and teachers for educational purposes. Students must not handle or display items, toys, messages, images, or personal property or engage in conduct unrelated to the lessons taking place. Students who engage in conduct in the virtual classroom that violates the Student Code of Conduct and this Virtual Discipline Policy may be subject to discipline in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct and this Policy.

School and/or district officials may be required, as mandatory reporters, to alert local law enforcement and/or the Department of Children and Family Services if they observe conduct, messages, images, or objects that raise legitimate concern for the safety and well-being of students in the virtual classroom. This may include students handling weapons in the virtual classroom, even if it is subsequently learned that the weapon is a toy or facsimile, as it is not always possible to determine remotely whether the weapon is real or not.

Conduct in the Virtual Classroom

Students are responsible for all content posted through their online account. Students are prohibited from sharing their online account username or password or using the username or password of another student. Students are required to have their computer camera turned on when virtual classes are in session.

Following is a *non-exclusive* list of behaviors that are prohibited in the virtual classroom and that may result in disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct and this Policy:

- Antagonistic, harassing, or discriminatory language of any kind with regard to race, color, religion, sex, gender, intelligence, age, orientation, disability, socioeconomic status or any other legally protected characteristic or activity
- Bullying and/or cyberbullying
- Use of obscene, degrading or profane language (written, verbal, pictures, drawings, audio, video)
- Displaying pornography, nudity or images of nudity
- Committing lewd or sexual acts
- Handling or displaying weapons, including toy or facsimile weapons*
- Any criminal or other illegal activity encouraging the unlawful use, possession, manufacture or distribution of tobacco, drugs or alcohol*
- Illegal posting, distribution, upload or download of copyrighted work of any kind
- Sharing assignments, questions/answers, or any other action that would violate any expectations or rules relative to academic honesty
- Posting personally identifiable information in any format other than via private message
- Indecent dress or disrobing
- Interference with the instructional audio or video
- Use or display of illegal drugs, alcohol, tobacco or tobacco products, or vaping devices*
- Violations of the Board's/School's Acceptable Use Policy or Device Contract

Consequences of Inappropriate Online Conduct

Parents and students must be aware that conduct that is unacceptable and disruptive in the regular classroom environment is, typically, unacceptable in the virtual classroom. The School Board recognizes, however, that virtual learning is a new experience for students and families, and that the context in which student conduct occurs must be taken into account in determining the appropriate penalty, if any, imposed for violations of the Student Code of Conduct in the virtual classroom.

Student conduct that occurs in the virtual classroom may be subject to progressive discipline which, depending on the seriousness of the conduct at issue, will include an initial verbal warning and consultation with the student's parent or guardian prior to any formal disciplinary action. The seriousness of the conduct at issue will dictate the actions of administrators and the nature of the penalty ultimately imposed. For example, a student may be subject to a severe penalty, even for a first offense, depending on the seriousness of the conduct at issue.

Some factors that administrators will take into account in determining the penalty to be imposed, if any, for conduct that occurs in the virtual classroom will include:

- Age of the student
- Whether the conduct disrupted learning in the virtual classroom
- Whether the conduct was violent or threatening in any way
- Whether the conduct was illegal
- Whether the conduct interfered with the rights of teachers and/or students to work and learn in a safe and orderly environment free from inappropriate images, messages, language or behavior
- Whether the student has committed prohibited conduct in the past
- Whether the student has received prior warnings or discipline for similar conduct

*Conduct in the virtual classroom related to the display or handling of weapons or drugs, or other conduct that raises legitimate concerns about the safety and welfare of a student, must be reported immediately to the School Principal and/or School Resource Officer in order to assess whether the matter must be reported to local law enforcement and/or the Department of Children and Family Services.

SCHOOL BOARD POLICY

The St. Bernard Parish School Board shall formulate policies to guide the action of those to whom it delegates authority. These guides shall constitute the policies governing the operation of the schools. They shall be recorded in writing and made a part of the School Board Policy Manual.

The formulation and adoption of policies shall constitute the primary method by which the School Board shall exercise its leadership in the operation of the school district. When establishing policies, the School Board shall prioritize student achievement, financial efficiency, and workforce development on a local, regional, and statewide basis. The evaluation of reports concerning the execution of its written policies shall constitute the basic method by which the School Board shall exercise its control over the operation of the school district.

The policies of the School Board are meant to be interpreted in terms of state laws, rules and regulations of the School of Elementary and Secondary Education, and all other regulatory agencies within the local parish, state, and federal levels of government.

POLICY ADOPTION

For a policy to be adopted by the School Board, it must receive a simple majority of members present and voting. The formal adoption of policies shall be recorded in the minutes. The official minutes shall constitute the authority for any change made in the Policy Manual.

The School Board is the legal body authorized to approve policies for the school district and shall not delegate or relinquish that authority to another party or group. The School Board welcomes comments and suggestions on local policy matters and will comply with all laws addressing proper involvement of other parties in the policy process.

POLICY REVIEW

The School Board shall periodically direct the systematic review of its policies. The Superintendent shall appropriately involve representative groups of administrators, teachers, supervisors, students, support personnel and lay citizens relative to policies affecting each group.

The School Board currently has a *Discipline Policy Review Committee* in accordance with La. Rev. Stat. Ann. §17:416.8. The purpose of the

committee shall be to review discipline policies of the School Board to assure consistency with state law, receive input into the effectiveness of established policy, make recommendations to improve policy provisions, and to assist the School Board in the orderly operation of the school district. In particular, state law requires a policy review committee to review discipline policies annually to make recommendations for appropriate revisions.

POLICY DISSEMINATION

The School Board shall direct the Superintendent to establish and maintain an orderly plan for disseminating School Board policies and administrative rules and regulations. These policies and administrative rules and regulations shall be made accessible to all employees directly or indirectly affected by those policies. School Board policies and administrative rules and regulations shall also be made accessible to members of the School Board, students, and members of the community served by the school district.

SUSPENSION OF POLICY

The operation of policy or section of policy not established by law or contract may be suspended temporarily by a majority vote of School Board members present and voting at a regular or special meeting.

ADMINISTRATION IN ABSENCE OF POLICY

In cases where action must be taken within the school system where the School Board has no formalized policy statement, the Superintendent shall have the power to act. His or her decisions, however, shall be subject to review by action of the School Board at its regular meeting. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent to inform the School Board promptly of such action and of the need for policy, if in his/her best judgment, a need for such policy exists.

DISCIPLINE

It is the purpose of the St. Bernard School Board to operate schools in a manner that will provide an orderly process of education and that will provide for the welfare and safety of all students who attend these schools. The school's primary goal is to educate, not discipline; however, when the behavior of an individual comes in conflict with rights of others, corrective actions may be necessary both for the benefit of the individual and the whole school.

Every teacher and other employees in the system shall hold each student accountable for any disorderly conduct in school, on the playgrounds, on any school bus, on the street or while going to or returning from school, during intermission or recess, or at any school-sponsored activity. To assist the teacher, the Board shall establish regulations for the use of disciplinary measures and continually monitor and appraise their usefulness. Discipline shall be administered uniformly, consistently, and in a nondiscriminatory manner, in accordance with the School Board's *Student Code of Conduct*.

Principals shall have the authority and the duty to take disciplinary action whenever the behavior of any student(s) interferes with or substantially disrupts learning within the classroom or other parts of the school. However, no student shall be disciplined in any manner for the use of force upon another person when it can be reasonably concluded that the use of such force, more probably than not, was committed solely for preventing а forcible offense himself/herself. The force used must be reasonable and apparently necessary to prevent such offense. A student who is the aggressor or who brings on a difficulty cannot claim the right stated above to defend himself/herself.

Each teacher may take disciplinary action to correct a student who engages in bullying, who disrupts normal classroom activities, who is disrespectful, who is willfully disobedient, who directs abusive or foul language to another person, who violates school rules, or who interferes with an orderly education process. The disciplinary action taken by the teacher shall be in accordance with regulations and procedures established by the Board.

STUDENT REMOVAL FROM CLASSROOM

A student may be immediately removed from a classroom by the teacher and placed in the custody of the principal or designee if the

student's behavior prevents the orderly instruction of other pupils or poses an immediate threat to the safety of students or the teacher. A student removed from the classroom shall be assigned school work missed and shall receive either partial or full credit for such work, upon the recommendation of the student's teacher, if it is completed satisfactorily and timely as determined by the principal or his/her designee. The student should not be kept out of school past the suspension period imposed by the principal.

Any student removed from class in kindergarten through grade 6 shall not be permitted to return to class for at least thirty (30) minutes unless agreed to by the teacher. A student removed from class in grades 7 through 12 shall not be permitted to return to class during the same class period, unless agreed to by the teacher initiating the disciplinary action.

Once a student is removed from class and sent to the principal's office, the principal or designee shall conference with the student to discuss the particular misconduct and to allow him/her the opportunity to explain his/her behaviors. Once removed, the student shall not be readmitted to the classroom until the principal has implemented one of the following disciplinary measures: counseling session(s); parent conference; in-school suspension; detention; suspension; assignment to an alternative school; requiring the completion of all assigned school and homework which would have been assigned and completed by the student during the period of suspension; and/or any other disciplinary measure authorized by the principal with the concurrence of the teacher or that is in agreement with the student's IEP/behavior plan.

For purposes of this section, classroom shall include on-campus or virtual classes.

PARENTAL NOTIFICATION

The principal or his/her designee shall provide oral or written notification to the parent/ legal guardian of any student removed from the classroom. Such notification shall include a description of any disciplinary action taken. When a student has been removed from a classroom, the teacher may require the parent/legal guardian of the student to have a conference with him/her in the presence of the principal or his or her designee before the student is readmitted.

Upon the student's third removal from the same classroom, the teacher and principal shall discuss the pupil's disruptive behavior and contemplated disciplinary measures before the principal implements such measures. In addition, a conference between the teacher or other appropriate employee and the student's parent/legal guardian shall be required prior to the student being readmitted. If the disruptive behavior persists, the teacher may request that the principal transfer the student into another setting.

STUDENT MISCONDUCT AT END OF YEAR

Any non-graduating student who commits offenses during the last ten

(10) days of the school year, which carry recommendations for suspension or removal beyond the end of the school year, shall have such recommendation extended into the next school year.

Any graduating senior who commits a serious major or criminal infraction after the last regular class period, as held up by the Superintendent or his/her designee, shall be excluded from year-end activities, including graduation exercises.

PARENT CONFERENCES

In any case where a teacher or administrator is authorized to require the parent/legal guardian of a student to attend a conference or meeting regarding the student's behavior, and, after notice, the parent/legal guardian willfully refuses to attend, the principal, or his/her designee shall file a complaint in accordance with statutory provisions with a court exercising juvenile jurisdiction. Notice of the conference, specifying the time and date of the conference, shall be given by contacting the parent/legal guardian by telephone at the number shown on the student's registration card or by sending a certified letter to the address on the student's registration card.

REPORTS TO PRINCIPAL

Any teacher or other school employee may report to the principal any student who acts in a disorderly manner or is in violation of school rules or any misconduct or violation of school rules by a student who may or may not be known to the employee. The principal shall review and act upon such information provided to determine if suspension or other disciplinary action is necessary.

Should the principal fail to act on any report of misconduct or school violation, he/she shall explain the reasons for doing so to the Superintendent or his/her designee and to the teacher or school employee, student, parent/legal guardian reporting the violation. However, confidentiality of student information must be in place at all times.

DELINQUENT STUDENTS

Students who regularly disrupt the normal school environment shall be considered as delinquent and may be reported by appropriate school personnel to the juvenile court. Any student that exhibits disruptive behavior, an incorrigible attitude, or any other discipline problems in general may be recommended by the principal for assignment to an appropriate alternative educational placement, or transfer to adult education if the student is seventeen (17) years of age or older with less than five (5) units of credit toward graduation; eighteen (18) years of age or older with less than fifteen (19) years of age or older with less than fifteen (15) units of credit toward graduation.

RECUSAL OF ADMINISTRATOR IN DISCIPLINE MATTERS

Any school administrator or administrator's designee who is required to make a recommendation, decide an issue, or take action in a matter involving the discipline of a student shall recuse himself/herself whenever a member of the immediate family of the administrator or designee is involved in any manner. In case of recusal, the action to be taken shall be done so by the Superintendent or an impartial designee. Immediate family means the individual's children, brothers, sisters, parents, and spouse and the children, brothers, sisters, and parents of the spouse.

DISCIPLINE OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Discipline of students with disabilities shall be in accordance with applicable state or federal laws and regulations. The Superintendent or his/her designee shall develop and implement procedures for the discipline of students with disabilities, accordingly.

DISCIPLINE OF STUDENTS ENGAGED IN VIRTUAL INSTRUCTION

The School Board shall adopt disciplinary measures that define the rules of conduct and expectations of students engaged in virtual instruction, including clearly defined consequences of conduct, and shall take into consideration the students' and their families' rights to privacy and other constitutional rights while at home or in a location that is not school property. Any such disciplinary measures adopted by the School Board shall be included in the School Board's Code of Student Conduct.

Virtual instruction means instruction provided to a student through an electronic delivery medium, including, but not limited to, electronic learning platforms that connect to a student in a remote location to classroom instruction.

SUSPENSION

The principal of the school has the authority to suspend a pupil for a specified time in accordance with statutory provisions. In each case of suspension, the principal or his or her designee prior to any suspension shall advise the student of the misconduct of which he/she is accused as well as the basis for such accusation, and the pupil shall be given an opportunity at that time to explain his/her version of the facts. The principal/designee shall contact the parent/legal guardian of the pupil to notify them of the suspension, if such is warranted, and establish a date and time for a conference with the principal or designee as a requirement for readmitting the pupil. Notice shall be given by contacting the parent/legal guardian by telephone at the telephone number shown on the pupil's registration card or by sending a certified letter to the address shown on the pupil's registration card. The principal shall promptly advise the Superintendent or designee of all such suspensions, stating the reasons for the suspensions.

No suspended pupil shall be allowed to leave the school premises during the school day until the parent/legal guardian or other proper authority assumes responsibility for him/her, unless immediate removal from school due to danger or threat of disruption to academic process is warranted.

If the parent/legal guardian fails to attend the required conference within five (5) school days of notification, the truancy laws shall be effective. On not more than one occasion each school year when the parent/legal guardian refuses to respond to such notice, the principal may determine whether readmitting the pupil is in the best interest of the pupil. On any subsequent occasions in the same school year, the pupil shall not be readmitted unless the parent/legal guardian, court, or other appointed representative responds.

In any case where a teacher, principal, or other school employee is authorized to require the parent/legal guardian of a pupil to attend a conference or meeting regarding the pupil's behavior and, after notice, the parent/legal guardian willfully refuses to attend, the principal or his/her designee shall file a complaint, in accordance with statutory provisions, with a court exercising juvenile jurisdiction.

When a pupil is suspended for a second time within one school year, the principal may require a counseling session be held with the parent/legal guardian and pupil by the school counselor. If no counselor is available, the conference may be held with all the pupil's teachers and the principal or other administrator.

Any student, after being suspended on three (3) occasions for committing Student Code of Conduct infractions during the same school year, shall upon committing the fourth offense, be removed from the regular education setting and assigned to the alternative school. This applies only to offenses other than severe infraction, including those involving violence and possession of drugs and weapons, which may result in placement

at the alternative school on the first offense.

The principal/designee shall be required to file written documentation of all suspensions. Said documentation shall include the circumstances surrounding any suspension, the reason for suspension, and any other pertinent facts concerning the disciplinary action. The principal shall file copies of his/her report with the Superintendent, other appropriate personnel, the parent or guardian, and retain a copy for his/her records.

Students who have been suspended from school are not allowed on campus for any classes or activities once the suspension is in effect and until such time it is terminated by the principal. Similarly, suspended students who are placed at the alternative campus are not allowed to be on the campus of any other school in the district.

Upon the seizure by any teacher, principal, school security guard, or other school administrator of any firearm, knife, or other dangerous implement which could be used as a weapon or inflict injury, the principal or his or her designee shall be required to report the confiscation to the Supervisor of Child Welfare and Attendance who, in turn, shall notify appropriate law enforcement officials.

Students suspended for more than ten (10) days shall remain under the supervision of the district in an alternative educational placement. The student shall be placed in an alternative school and shall be required to attend and participate in educational services.

Suspension of students with disabilities shall be in accordance with applicable state or federal law and regulations.

APPEALS

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the parent or tutor of a pupil who has been recommended for placement at our alternative school but suspended instead following a hearing conducted by the Superintendent or his/her designee shall have the right to request review by the School Board of the findings of the Superintendent or designee at a time set by the School Board. Such request must be made within five (5) days after the decision is rendered, or the decision of the Superintendent or designee shall be final. The School Board may affirm, modify, or reverse the action previously taken.

The parent or tutor of the pupil may, within ten (10) days, appeal to the judicial district court an adverse ruling of the School Board in upholding the action of the Superintendent or designee. The Court may reverse or revise the ruling of the School Board upon a finding that the ruling of the School Board was based on an absence of any relevant evidence in support thereof.

MANDATORY REMOVAL

The principal shall be required to recommend the removal from the regular school setting

any student who is found carrying or possessing a firearm or a knife with a blade two (2) inches or longer, or another dangerous instrumentality, except as provided below, or who possesses, distributes, sells, gives, or loans any controlled dangerous substance governed by state law, in any form.

If a student less than eleven (11) years of age in pre-kindergarten through grade 5 is found in possession of a knife with a blade two (2) inches or longer, the principal may, but shall not be required to, recommend the student's removal. A student found in possession of a knife with a blade less than two (2) inches in length may be suspended by the school principal, but, at a minimum, shall be placed in in-school suspension.

The required suspension of a student shall not apply if the student is possessing a firearm or knife for purposes of involvement in a school class, course, or school approved co-curricular or extracurricular activity approved by appropriate school officials, or the student possessing any controlled dangerous substance that has been obtained directly or due to a valid prescription or order from a licensed physician. The student who must be in possession of such a prescription at school must register the prescription with the administration and must receive permission for possession.

In addition, school officials, in accordance with statutory provisions, shall have total discretion and shall exercise such discretion in imposing on a pupil any disciplinary actions authorized by state law for possession by a pupil of a firearm or knife on school property when such firearm or knife is stored in a motor vehicle and there is no evidence of the pupil's intent to use the firearm or knife in a criminal manner.

The parent or tutor of a pupil who has been recommended for expulsion, including if the recommendation is reduced to a suspension, shall have the right to request review by the School Board of such recommendation, or appeal to the parish district court, as appropriate, in accordance with La. Rev. Stat. Ann. §17:416.

ASSAULT OR BATTERY OF SCHOOL EMPLOYEES

When a pupil is formally accused of committing assault or battery on any employee, the principal shall suspend the pupil from school, and he/she shall be removed immediately from the premises without the benefit of required procedures, provided, however, that such shall follow as soon as practicable. The student shall not be readmitted until all hearings and appeals associated with the alleged violation have been exhausted.

CREDIT FOR SCHOOL WORK MISSED

A student who is suspended for ten (10) or fewer days shall be assigned school work missed while he/she is suspended and shall receive either partial or full credit for such work, upon the recommendation of the student's teacher, if it is completed satisfactorily and timely as determined by the principal or his/her designee. A student who is

suspended for more than ten (10) days and receives educational services at an alternative site, shall be assigned work by a certified teacher and shall receive credit for school work if it is completed satisfactorily and timely as determined by the teacher.

RECUSAL OF ADMINISTRATOR IN DISCIPLINE MATTERS

Any administrator or designee who is required to make a recommendation, decide an issue, or act in a matter involving the discipline of a student shall recuse himself/herself whenever a member of his/her immediate family is involved in the discipline matter. In case of recusal, the action to be taken

shall be done so by the Superintendent or designee. Immediate family includes children, brothers, sisters, parents, and spouse and the children, brothers, sisters, and parents of the spouse.

PLACEMENT AT THE ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL

The St. Bernard Parish School Board may opt to remove a pupil from the regular education setting if an offense committed by the pupil is serious enough to warrant such action or is in violation of state law. Upon a recommendation for the placement of a pupil at the alternative school by the principal, the Superintendent or his/her designee shall conduct a hearing to determine the facts of the case and make a finding of whether the student is guilty of conduct warranting such placement, unless the parent/legal guardian opts to waive the right to a hearing and accepts placement at the alternative school. Notification of the time, date, and place of the hearing shall be mailed to the parents/legal guardians, and, following the hearing, the parents/legal guardians shall be notified of the decision. Until the hearing, the pupil shall attend classes at the alternative school.

At the hearing, the principal, his/her designee, and/or teacher concerned may be represented by any person appointed by the Superintendent, and the principal, his/her designee, or teacher shall be permitted to attend and present any relevant information.

Students with disabilities shall be placed at the alternative site in accordance with applicable state or federal law and regulations. Students who are arrested or charged with felony violations of criminal law, or who would be charged with a felony if tried as an adult, may be removed from traditional educational settings and placed at the alternative school by the Superintendent pending outcome of criminal proceedings.

APPEALS

The parent or tutor of a pupil who has been recommended for placement at the alternative school following a hearing conducted by the Superintendent or his/her designee shall have the right to request review by the School Board of the findings of the Superintendent or designee at a time set by the School Board. Such a request must be made within five (5) days after the decision is rendered, or the decision of the Superintendent or designee shall be final. The School Board may affirm, modify or reverse the action previously taken.

The parent or tutor of the pupil may, within ten (10) days, appeal to the judicial district court an adverse ruling of the School Board in upholding the action of the Superintendent or designee. The Court may reverse or revise the ruling of the School Board upon a finding that the ruling of the School Board was based on an absence of any relevant evidence in support thereof.

The parent or tutor of the pupil shall have such right of review by the School Board and by the district court even if the recommendation for placement at the alternative school site has been reduced to a suspension of the pupil.

FIREARMS

Any student in grades six (6) through twelve (12) who is found guilty of being in possession of a firearm on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored event, pursuant to a hearing, shall be removed from school for a minimum period of four (4) complete semesters and shall be referred to the district attorney for appropriate action.

Any student in kindergarten through grade five (5) who is found guilty of being in possession of a firearm on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored event, pursuant to a hearing, shall be removed from school for a minimum period of two (2) complete semesters and shall be referred to the district attorney for appropriate action.

The Superintendent, however, may modify the length of the minimum removal required in the above paragraphs on a case-by-case basis, provided such modification is in writing.

DRUGS

Any student, sixteen (16) years of age or older, found guilty of possession of, or knowledge of intentional distribution of, or possession with intent to distribute any illegal narcotic, drug, or other controlled substance on school property, on a school bus or at a school-sponsored event, pursuant to a hearing, shall be removed from school for a minimum period of four (4) complete school semesters.

Any student under sixteen (16) years of age and in grades six (6) through twelve (12) who is found guilty of possession of, or knowledge of and intentional distribution of, or possession with intent to distribute any illegal narcotic, drug, or controlled substance on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored event, pursuant to a hearing, shall be removed from school for a minimum period of two (2) complete semesters.

Any case involving a student in kindergarten through grade five (5) found guilty of possession of, or knowledge of and intentional distribution of or possession with intent to distribute any illegal narcotic, drug, or other controlled substance on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored event, pursuant to a hearing, shall be referred to the Superintendent for action.

The conviction of any pupil of a felony or the incarceration of any pupil in a juvenile institution for an act which, had it been committed by an adult, would have constituted a felony, may be cause for placement at the alternative school of the pupil for a time as determined by the Board.

A student shall not be removed from the campus if he/she is in possession of a firearm or knife for purposes of involvement in a school class or school-approved activity. A student shall not be removed from the campus if he/she is in possession of any controlled dangerous substance that has been obtained directly or due to a valid prescription from a licensed physician. However, such student shall have registered the prescription with

the administration and received permission to have possession on campus.

In addition, school officials, in accordance with statutory provisions, shall have total discretion and shall exercise such discretion in imposing on a pupil any disciplinary actions authorized by state law for possession by a pupil of a firearm or knife on school property when such firearm or knife is stored in a motor vehicle and there is no evidence of the pupil's intent to use the firearm or knife in a criminal manner.

In each case, if a student is reassigned to the alternative school, he/she shall report for classes on the day and time designated by the administration. If the student fails to report to the alternative school within five (5) school days of notification, he/she shall be considered a truant and dealt with according to statutory provisions.

Readmission to the regular education setting shall occur once the student has completed his/her designated placement at the alternative site. Completion is determined by academic success, attendance, discipline record, drug screens, if applicable, and other factors as may be determined by the regular education principal, the principal of the alternative site, the student, the parent/legal guardian, and any applicable state laws regarding a student's removal from the regular education setting.

Any pupil attending classes at the alternative school may be readmitted to the regular education program on a probationary basis at any time during the placement period on such terms and conditions as may be stipulated by the Board, Superintendent, and/or his/her designee. Readmission on a probationary basis shall be contingent on the pupil and parent/legal guardian agreeing in writing to the conditions stipulated. Any such agreement shall contain a provision for immediate removal of the pupil from the regular education setting without benefit of a hearing or other procedure upon the principal or Superintendent determining the pupil has violated any term or condition of the agreement. Immediately thereafter, the principal shall provide proper notification in writing of the determination and reasons for removal to the Superintendent and the pupil's parent.

In addition to the readmittance provisions stated above, a pupil that has been removed for possessing on school property or on a bus, a firearm, knife, or other dangerous weapon, or possessing or possession with intent to distribute or distributing, selling, giving, or loaning while on school property or a school bus any controlled dangerous substance shall not be readmitted on a probationary basis prior to the completion of the period of removal until the pupil produces written documentation that he/she and his/her parent/legal guardian have enrolled and participated or is participating in an appropriate

rehabilitation or counseling program related to the reason(s) for the pupil's removal.

A pupil who has been expelled from any school in or out of state shall not be admitted to a school in St. Bernard Parish except upon the review and approval of the Board following the written request for admission. To facilitate the review and approval for readmittance, the pupil shall provide to the Board information on the dates of any expulsions and the

reasons therefor. Additionally, the transfer of pupil records to any school or system shall include information on the dates of any expulsions and the reasons therefor.


Any administrator who is required to make a recommendation, decide an issue, or act in a matter involving the discipline of a student shall recuse himself/herself whenever a member of the immediate family of the administrator is involved in any manner in the discipline matter. Instead, the issue shall be resolved by an impartial designee of the Superintendent. Immediate family means the individual's children, brothers, sisters, parents, and spouse and the children, brothers, sisters, and parents of the spouse.
