











As we approach the final month of the school year, we also enter a busy stretch filled with local finals and Regents exams. Local final exams are scheduled for June 12th, 13th, and 16th. Our first Regents exam will take place during the school day on June 11th, with the remaining Regents exams scheduled from June 17th through June 25th.

A special congratulations goes out to our Seniors, who are just days away from completing their high school journey. This extraordinary group of students has left a meaningful and lasting impact on our school community, and I am confident they will continue to achieve great things in the future. I look forward to celebrating their accomplishments together at commencement on June 27th.

Please join us for the Jr./Sr. High School Concert on Wednesday, June 11th at 7:00 PM in the Auditorium. In addition, the Student Council Awards Ceremony will be held on Monday, June 16th at 1:30 PM in the Keith T. Davis Gymnasium. Parents and guardians of students receiving awards have been invited through a letter sent home. The Academic Achievement Award recognizes students for academic improvement, high averages, consistent effort, a willingness to seek help, and passion for their subjects. The Classroom Citizenship Award celebrates students who show motivation, good attendance, positive classroom behavior, and who encourage achievement among their peers.

Our spring sports teams have also had an outstanding season. The Boys Varsity Baseball team will compete in the Section III Class D finals at OCC on June 2nd. Our Varsity Track & Field team had an excellent showing at Sectionals. Jack Tagliaferri placed first in both the 100m and 200m. Julian Jałowiec earned first place in the Triple Jump. Brody Anderson finished second in the Pentathlon, setting a new school record with 1,943 points. The Boys 4x100m Relay team, made up of Jeffrey Phillips, Julian Jałowiec, David Zinicola, and Jack Tagliaferri, also secured first place. Both the relay team and Julian Jałowiec in the Triple Jump will advance to the State Qualifier meet at CNS on Tuesday, June 2nd. On the girls' side, Brienne Eldred earned second place in the Pentathlon. Our Varsity Golf team placed third out of 18 teams in the CSC Medalist Tournament. Additionally, Ashton Ricci, an 8th grader on the Oriskany-Westmoreland golf team, won Sectionals and will advance to the state meet.

Looking ahead to the summer, Oriskany students in need of summer school will participate in a regional program hosted at Sauquoit Middle and High School. More information will be shared with families as it becomes available.






### Parents of Seniors

## From the School Nurses...

Dear Parents/Guardians of our Oriskany Students,

We will be sending out important information regarding physicals and vaccinations needed for the 2025-2026 school year.

### **Physicals**

Students entering 7th, 9th and 11th grades, and any student who plans on participating in fall sports will need to complete the enclosed forms. Forms can also be found on our Oriskany homepage under nursing.

### **Vaccinations**

Students entering 7th and 12th grades will need to have their Meningitis vaccine completed prior to entering the first day of school. Students that have not received their vaccination by the first day of school will be contacted to request a specific date for their scheduled vaccination. By the 14th day of school proof of vaccination must be provided or the student will not be allowed to attend school on the 15th day. Students who transfer in from out-of-state have up to 30 days to receive this vaccination.

Vaccinations can either be provided by your child(s) health care provider or by Oneida County Department of Health. They can be reached at 315-798-5747. Appointments are necessary because certain vaccinations are only given on certain days.

### Medication Pick Up

Students that have medications located in the nurse's office will need to have a parent pick them up by 2:30 on June 25th, 2025. Any medication remaining in the nurse's office will be properly disposed of.
