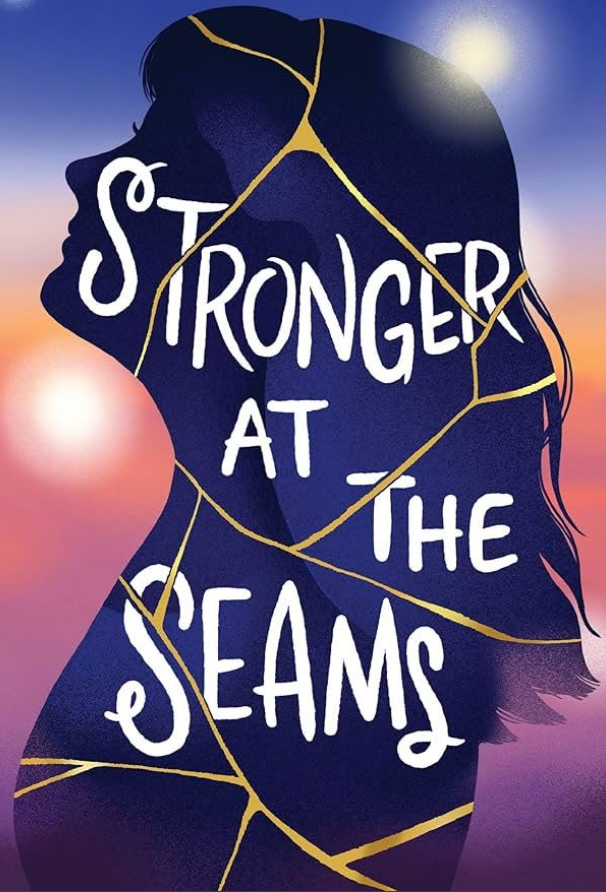
Curriculum Committee members will pilot this text to be used in conjunction with Warriors Don't Cry during their unit on resiliency during the Civil Rights Movement.

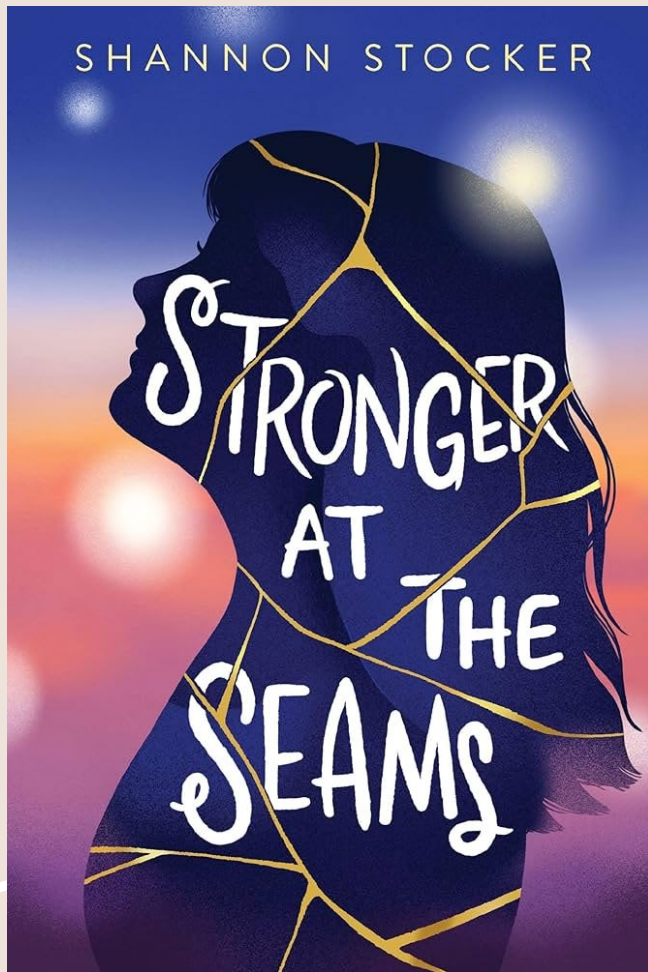

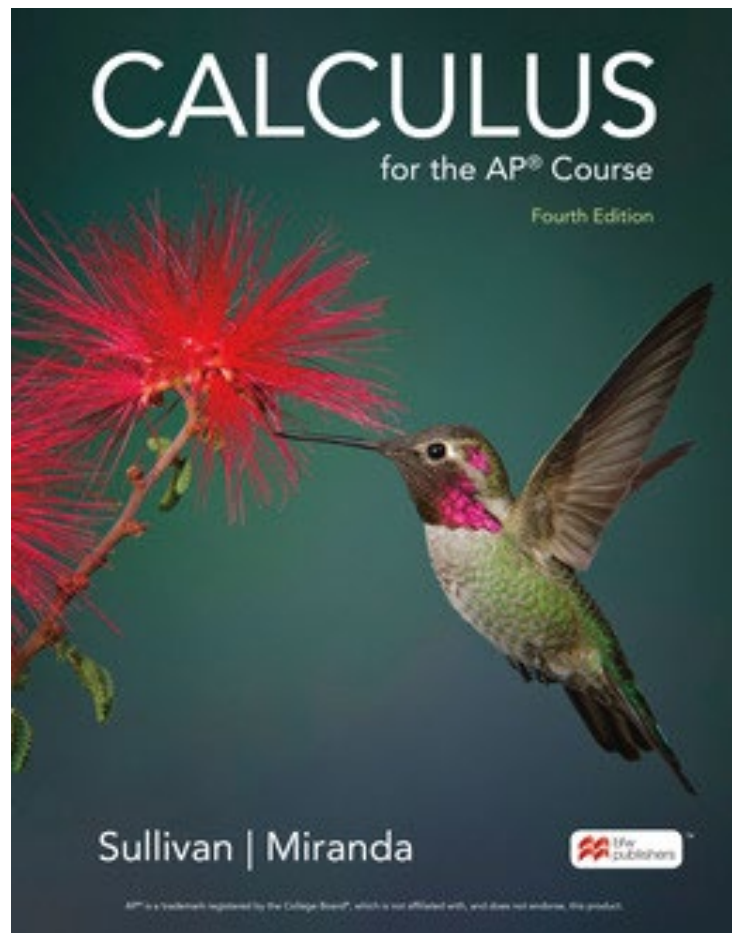

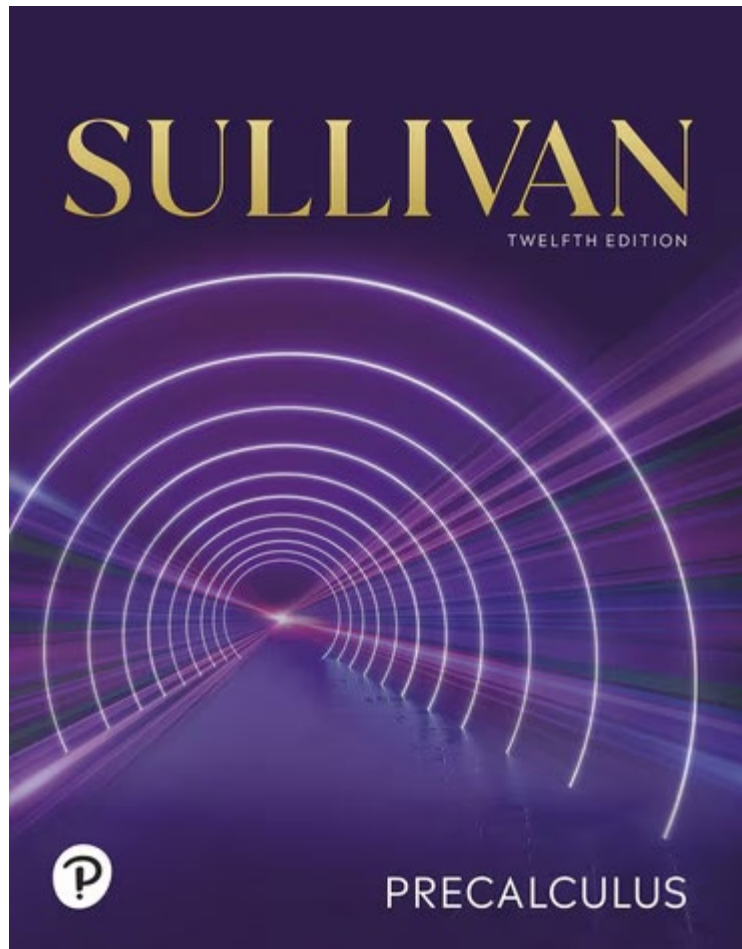
