Summer Reading 2025 Assignment

Dear Parents/Guardians and Students:

Charles W. Eliot once said, “Books are the quietest and most constant of friends; they are the most accessible and the wisest of counselors, and the most patient of teachers.”

At Shelter Island School we believe that reading during the vacation months contributes significantly to a student’s academic growth and lifelong reading pleasure. As a result, we are committed to a district summer reading program. At the high school level, we require that students read **one** fiction or non-fiction book and **one** companion article. (The article must be from a credible source and be published within the last 5 years. Please see the last page of this packet for guidance.) This packet contains reading lists for each grade level.

Please note there is a separate reading list for College Credit Senior English (see Mrs. Treharne). There will also be a separate reading assignment for Mrs. Sears’s English 9 Regents class (see Mrs. Sears).

All other students are required to read a book from the list that corresponds to their grade level (the grade they will be entering in the fall). They may NOT substitute alternative titles. In this year’s packet, all new titles are in bold print. The article students choose must have a thematic or topical link to the book they have read and be from a credible source. Students must have their article printed out and with them on the first day of school. The article will be used for class discussion and an assignment that will be assessed at the start of the school year.

Students taking AP English Literature & Composition 11 will be given an additional assignment (see Mrs. Colligan).

It is important to note that all students will be assessed on their summer reading during the first two weeks of school. **Reading should be done carefully, and students should note key ideas either directly in their copy of the book or on post-it notes. Additionally, the chosen article must be read and marked up/annotated.** Grades for summer reading may be the result of a book talk, a formal presentation, a take-home test, or an in-class essay. Additional summer reading packets are available at the Shelter Island Public Library or at the school’s main office. We hope that this year’s summer reading will be both an enjoyable and worthwhile experience.

6 Key Components for Finding a Credible Source:

1) **Authority**: Who is the author and is he/she/they credible?

2) **Purpose**: Why was the source produced?

3) **Platform**: Look at the hosting URL. Examples include .gov or .edu. Sites ending in .com must be evaluated very closely.

4) **Links**: What do the links in the article lead to? Are those links working/credible?

5) **Depth**: Is the information common knowledge or do you learn more?

6) **Timeliness/ Relevance**: Is the source written/edited within the last 5 years?

Summer Reading Additions FRESH for 2025:

9-12th grades:

James by Percival Everett: A retelling of Huck Finn from the perspective of Jim. (Reworking a classic/minority perspective to the center of text.)

The Meadowbrook Murders by Jessica Goodman: When her best friends get murdered in their boarding school dorm room, all fingers point to Amy. Meanwhile, school newspaper reporter Liz digs into the case, unearthing secrets and piecing together clues. With a killer on the loose and a college scholarship at stake, Liz will do anything to find the truth.

Make Good Trouble by Jamia Wilson: This book collects 70 stories about people from various backgrounds who had the courage to challenge injustice. It's a must-read for any passionate young person wanting to shape the future.

Great Big Beautiful Life by Emily Henry: Newest romance by popular author.

The Ministry of Time by Kaliane Bradley: In the near future, a civil servant gets the job of her dreams and then discovers she will be working on a confidential gov't project researching time travel...sci-fi/romance thread/realistic futuristic fiction.

The Last Murder at the End of the World by Stuart Turton: In a post apocalyptic world, one small island remains habitable, free of a deadly smog that has taken everyone else out. Three scientists on the island (pop of 122) keep the smog at bay. When one is murdered, everyone is a suspect and at risk of dying within 92 hours.

Salt & Broom by Sharon Lynn Fisher: A fantasy retelling of Jane Eyre....mysterious, romantic, classic retelling.

Bound by Dragons by Alicia Klapheke: Fantasy with dragons and faeries, romance and action. (Stand alone, not in a series.)

Juniper & Thorn by Ava Reid: Fantasy: Story of a young witch trying to keep her magic while her city and father want to end magic in their city. (Coming of age.)

The Cheat Sheet by Sarah Adams: 9-12: "BookTok" famous, "sports romance"

The Last Bookstore on Earth by Lily Braun-Arnold: After the world ends, Liz converts an abandoned bookstore into her home. When another teenage girl, Maeve, breaks in, the girls form an unlikely alliance to survive. Secrets, romance, and impending doom make this post-apocalyptic YA novel.
