Oakland Unified School District Nutrition Services Department Summer 2025 Free Meal Program

Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) announces its participation in the **Seamless Summer Option (SSO)** of the National School Lunch Program. During summer 2025, **at no charge**, OUSD will provide nutritious breakfast and lunch—including milk or a compliant milk substitute—to all children 18 years of age and younger, as well as to individuals over 18 who are determined by a state or local educational agency to be mentally or physically disabled and enrolled in a public or nonprofit private school program during the regular school year.

Meals will be provided at the following open sites, Monday through Friday, at no cost to participants. All meals must be consumed on site, unless otherwise noted and pre-approved by the California Department of Education.
