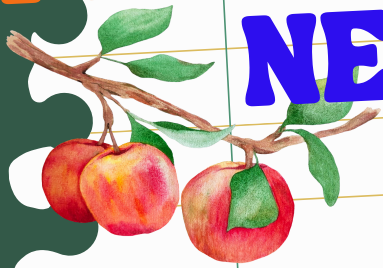


FLORENCE RIDEOUT NEWSLETTER
