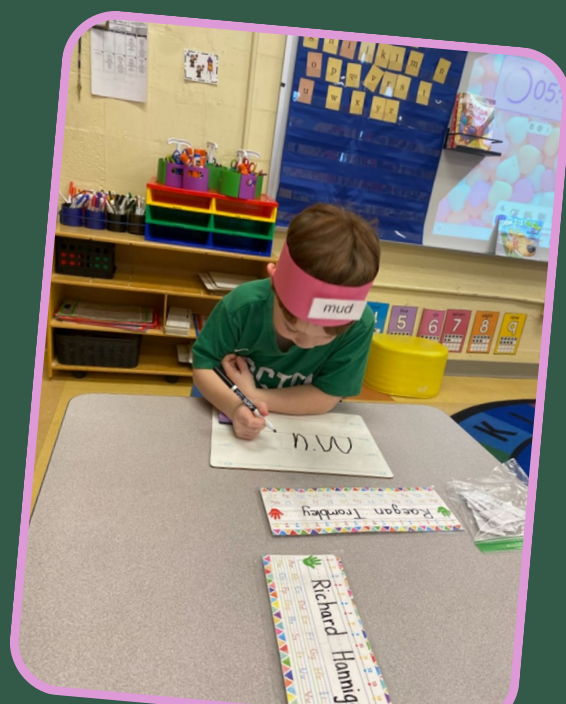


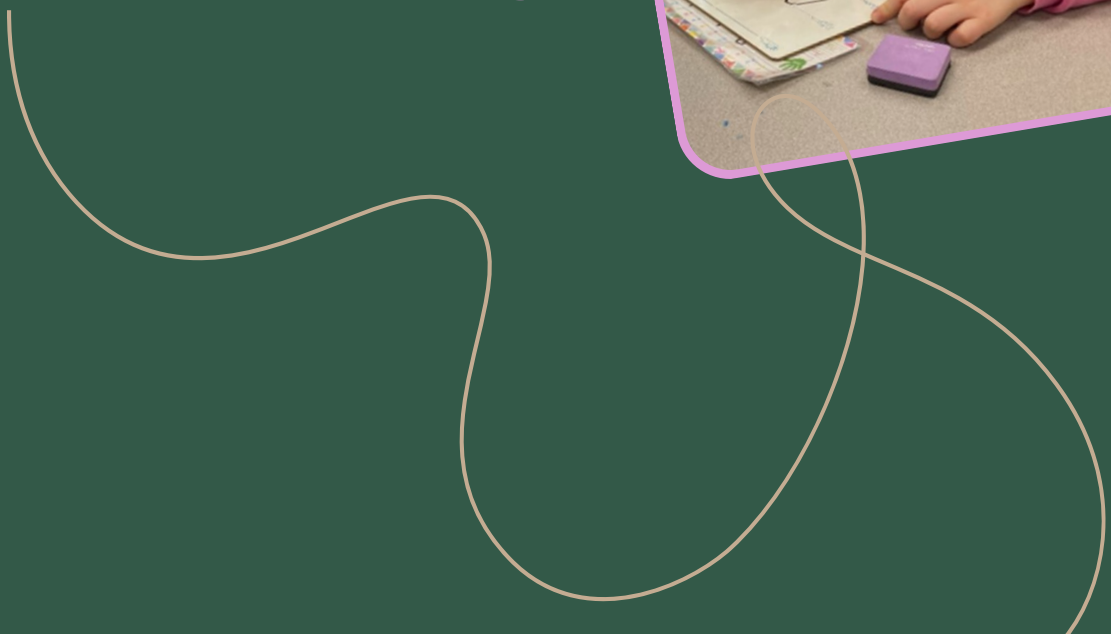
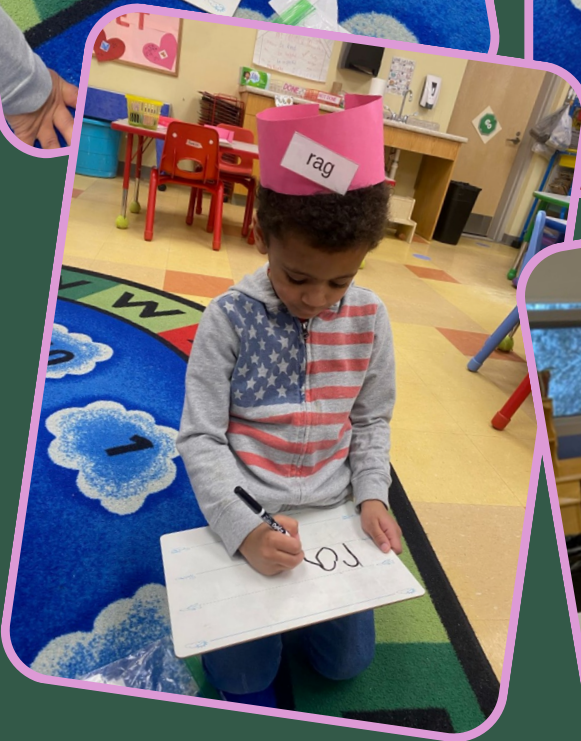

# MUSIC WITH MS. KUDLICH

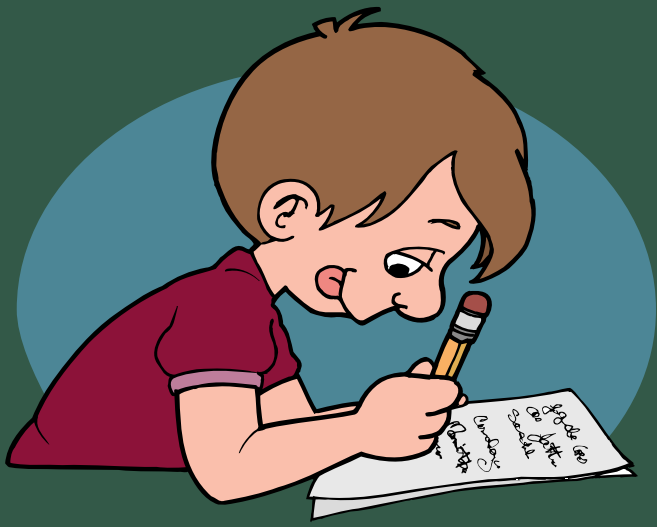
