



Measure O Overview

On November 8, 2016, the voters of the Riverside Unified School District approved Measure 0 General Obligation Bonds (the "Bonds") with a 70% approval rate. Measure 0 will generate \$392 million dollars over the next 10 to 15 years to improve and build new capital facilities in the Riverside Unified School District.

The Bonds will be used to repair and upgrade District aging school infrastructure, classrooms and buildings, build new schools, modernize school facilities with 21st century technology, improve access for students with disabilities, provide classroom and labs for career and technical education classes, improve school safety by modernizing security systems, retrofitting buildings to be earthquake proof, and upgrading emergency communications.

Louisa May Alcott Elementary School was built in 1961. Under Measure O, the project includes new interior and exterior painting, new ceiling tile and t-bar, new lighting, new HVAC, casework, and carpet, and restroom ADA upgrades, removal of eleven (11) classroom portables, grading, new hard court play yard area, turf, ADA Upgrades, new landscape and irrigation throughout the campus, new gate, new fencing, and new domestic water, sewer, storm drain, and gas line for new building; and a new classroom building with six (6) general education classrooms and four (4) kindergarten classrooms with restrooms and new kinder playground, play equipment and fencing.

Project Description

Monroe Elementary School was built in 1955. Under Measure O, the project includes a new 1-story classroom building with 5 kinder classrooms, modernization of existing buildings including fire alarm, HVAC, plumbing, roof, door hardware, paint, new carpet, casework, ADA improvements, new school frontage, replacing kinder equipment, updates to irrigation and drainage systems and twenty-three (23) new restroom facilities. Site work includes new playground grass, new water, sewer, gas lines, new parking and bus drop-off and lunch shelter.





Project Description

Fremont Elementary School is one of the oldest schools in the District, built in 1917. Under Measure O, the project includes a new two-story building with six (6) general classrooms and six (6) kinder classrooms with interior restrooms, new play equipment and surfacing, landscape, elevator, covered walkway, exterior restrooms and storage. Site work includes removal of four portables and demo existing building J, new kinder play yard, hard court play yard area, turf, ADA upgrades, new visitor parking lot with fifteen (15) regular and two (2) ADA accessible parking stalls, grading, re-stripe and slurry existing parking lot, and domestic water, sewer, storm drain, gas, electrical power upgrades. Existing classroom buildings and administration updates include exterior improvements & roofing, reconfigure administration, interior and exterior paint.

Project Description

Henry W. Longfellow Elementary School was built in 1947. It faces logistical challenges due to its small footprint and no onsite parking. The site currently has 12 portable classroom buildings. The school is on 6 acres. Under Measure O, it will receive a new 6 kinder and 6 general education classroom building with new play area, new administration building and re-purposing of administration building, new parking lot, and modernization of existing buildings.

Project Status

- ✓ Started and completed roofing replacement and gutters for Buildings C, D & E including the Walkway Canopy.

- ✓ Started modernization of new casework, sink fixtures, tack boards, interior paint, lighting, ceiling tiles, window tinting, metal doors, replacement of carpet in areas affected, restroom compliance upgrades, in addition to path of travel concrete upgrades.
 - Building D is complete.
 - ➤ Building C and E will continue with modernization through the school year 2022/2023 until completion.
- ✓ Over-excavation for the new modular buildings is complete in all three (3) areas.
- \checkmark Started to prepare areas for the coordination/placement of modular footings.
- ✓ Manufacturing of the modular buildings has commenced at the plant and will continue development through December 2022.








Modernization & New Construction Project Overall Site Plan







- Option 3: B Lots, C Lots, Vacate Park Avenue, Reconfigure Lincoln






Option 1 – Relocate Lincoln High School Off-Site, Capture Park Avenue Conceptual Site Plan







Potential State Grants for Groups A, B & C Projects

The Riverside Unified School District will make every effort to augment its Measure O General Obligation Bonds with future State eligible grants. Set forth below are estimated State new construction and modernization grant funding amounts that the District has submitted funding applications, and may be eligible for funding under the State's School Facility Program ("SFP"). The State passed a State School Bond Measure in November of 2016. However, the receipt of potential State grants is predicated on: 1) the Governor agreeing to issue State School Bonds, 2) the District meeting the State's eligibility requirements, and 3) the State funding levels remaining at current levels.

School Funding Program Glossary of Acronyms

General Obligation Bonds (G.O. Bonds) – Fund 21: Measure 0 is a voter approved bond measure within the boundaries of the District. It represents a maximum tax of \$60 per \$100,000 of assessed property value.

Community Facilities District Bonds (CFDs): The Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act provides an alternative method for public agencies to fund facilities. The Community Facilities District ("CFD") is a financing entity through which a local government is authorized to levy special property taxes to pay debt service on bonds or to pay for the direct construction of facilities. CFD revenue is restricted to the funding of additional capacity (e.g. New Construction).

Developer Fees – Fund 25: School districts have the ability to impose impact fees from new residential development and commercial/industrial development for the construction or reconstruction of school facilities. Developer fees are collected at the time a building permit is issued and are restricted to the funding of additional capacity (e.g. New Construction).

Redevelopment Agency Revenue (RDA – Fund 06): California redevelopment law allows school districts to share property tax increment income via pass-through agreements with local redevelopment agencies. State law eliminated redevelopment agencies as of February 1, 2012; however, local educational agency's pass-through entitlements remain. Redevelopment revenue is received annually and can be used to fund modernization and/or new construction projects.

State School Facility Program Grants (SFP) - Fund 35: The SFP provides grants for school districts to acquire school sites, construct new school facilities, or modernize existing school facilities. The two major funding types available are "new construction" and "modernization". The new construction grant provides funding on a 50/50 State and local match basis. The modernization grant provides funding on a 60/40 basis.

California Clean Energy Jobs Act (Proposition 39): Prop. 39 is an energy efficiency grant program that provides funding for eligible repairs to heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning (HVAC) systems; new chillers, boilers and furnaces; new lighting and lighting control systems; Installation of energy-efficient windows, programmable thermostats, and thermal window shades; and on-site clean energy generation, such as solar photovoltaic.
