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Executive Summary

The Riverside Unified School District (RUSD) was successful passing Measure O General Obligation Bond on November 8, 2016. With a 70% approval rate, the voters approved to issue up to \$392,000,000 as the principal amount for the District's school facilities bond (Measure O). Measure O will generate the dollars over the next 10 to 15 years to improve existing school facilities and build new capital facilities in Riverside Unified School District.

The Long Range Facility Master Plan completed in 2016 serves as the guide to plan projects based on condition, educational program, capacity needs, and available state funding. The Board of Education held three workshops to discuss the needs of district facilities and identify priorities. The workshops primarily focused on educating the Board and public on the prioritization process, providing data on the facilities, determining focus goals, and identifying priority projects.

2016 Ballot Measure O

The following is the ballot measure summary presented to the voters by the Riverside Unified School District.

"To repair and upgrade Riverside schools, including deteriorating roofs, plumbing and electrical systems, improve student safety, security, and seismic safety, upgrade classrooms, science labs, career-training facilities, computer systems and instructional technology to support student achievement in math, science, engineering and skilled trades, and construct, acquire, repair classrooms, sites, facilities and equipment, shall Riverside Unified School District issue \$392 million in bonds at legal rates, with citizen oversight, no money for administrator salaries, all money staying local?"

Purpose of the Committee

Pursuant to Section 15278 of the Education Code, the District is obligated to establish an independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) in order to satisfy the accountability requirement of Prop. 39. The Board of Education approved the appointment of the CBOC at its March 20, 2017 Board meeting.

The purpose of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) shall be to inform the public concerning the expenditure of the bond proceeds. The CBOC will review bond program expenditures and outside audits to make sure the will of the voters is strictly followed in accordance with the wording of the original ballot measure.

To carry out its stated purpose, the Committee shall perform the duties set forth in the CBOC bylaws as listed below:

3.1 Inform the Public. The Committee shall inform the public concerning the District's expenditure of bond proceeds. In fulfilling this duty, all official communications to either the Board or the public shall come from the Chair acting on behalf of the Committee. The Chair shall only release information that reflects the majority view of the Committee.

- 3.2 Review Expenditures. The Committee shall review expenditure reports produced by the District to ensure that (a) bond proceeds were expended only for the purposes set forth in Measure O; and (b) no bond proceeds were used for teacher or administrative salaries or other operating expenses in compliance with Attorney General Opinion 04-110, issued on November 9, 2004.
- 3.3 Annual Report. The Committee shall present to the Board, in public session, an annual written report for Measure O, which shall include the following:
 - (a) A statement indicating whether the District is in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution; and
 - (b) A summary of the Committee's proceedings and activities for the preceding year.

Committee Membership

The Committee is composed entirely of District residents, including those with experience in business, government, finance and education, as well as parents of Riverside Unified School District children, a member of a taxpayer association, and member of senior citizens' community, and parent-teacher organizations.

Committee Activities

In accordance with the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Public Act, the committee conducts meetings for the public's attendance and participation. Meeting agendas and notices are sent to committee members and posted 72 hours in advance of the meeting. Notices are posted at the Riverside Unified School District office, Business office, Facilities Planning and Development office and on the district website. Meeting notices, agenda, minutes and all other documents received by the committee are a matter of public record and are available on the Riverside Unified School District website:

All meetings conducted during this time period were done so virtually. At every meeting, staff reports the status of projects and project financials.

At every meeting, the committee has encouraged community input related to concerns with Measure O funding allocation. These concerns have and will continue to be discussed by the committee as brought forth in public comment.

An independent performance and financial audit was reviewed by the committee.

The Committee was to be invited to Town Hall meetings, Board Study Session meetings, and regular Board meetings when Measure O Bond projects were discussed. However, due to the lockdown, this did not occur. Site visits were also suspended due to the lockdown.

Committee Findings

August 26, 2020 virtual meeting, the committee was notified by a member of the public that the posting for public access was not available; therefore, the meeting concluded.

The committee inquired as to whether the district saves money by retiring portables. The response to the committee was that the district owns the portables; therefore, there are no savings.

The committee inquired as to whether solar was being added to at school sites. The response was no, the schools are under the city's public utilities, and payback from converting to solar is not advantageous as it would be if they were under Southern California Edison.

The committee inquired as to whether additional security is being provided for active shooters. The response was that security is handled in the design phase; some schools have added infrastructure for cameras and other types and measures of security.

The committee inquired as to why North High School moved up on the project list at the September 10, 2020 meeting? The response was that the Board of Education reviewed the project list and the cash flow and made some modifications to the order of projects while waiting for state funds. There are funds for the planning stage of North High School, but the construction phase will have to wait until more bonds are sold in 2022 or 2023.

With regard to the Eastside Neighborhood School, concern was raised by the committee as to the closing of Park Avenue, the expansion of the Metro Link, and the impact on the bus station that is adjacent to the proposed location of the school. The response was that the city has a process that must be followed to vacate a street for a school. The impact on traffic will be studied and the school district will work with the city, metro link, and surrounding businesses to find a resolution that works for everyone.

Measure O projects are also funded by other sources of revenue (e.g., Mello-Roos, developer fees, and funding from the State of California). The committee receives information on the different funding sources as requested.

Although resolved with the Board recently, there were concerns by the committee during this time period about being left shorthanded with regard to committee member vacancies and imminent term expirations. Specifically, there was concern about representation and how members term off and are selected. There will be continued examination of how to best fill vacancies timely with consideration towards classification and trustee areas.
