#### BOARD OF EDUCATION STATUTORY OBLIGATION


California Constitution Article XIII & Education Code:

- 1. Establish a Citizens' Oversight Committee (Education Code Section 15278(a)).
- 1. Appoint members to the Bond Oversight Committee (Education Code Section 15278(a)) and ensure that such appointed members satisfy the requirements of Education Code Section 15282.



"Members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Education through the following process:

- (a) the District will advertise in the local newspaper, on its website, and in other customary forums, as well as solicit appropriate local groups for applications;
- (b) the Superintendent will review the applications; and
- (c) the Superintendent will make recommendations to the Board."





#### MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

"The Committee shall consist of at least seven (7) members appointed by the Board (*RUSD appointed 13*) from a list of candidates submitting <u>written applications</u>, and based on <u>criteria established by Prop 39</u>, to wit:

- One (1) member shall be the parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the District.
- One (1) member shall be both a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the District and active in a parent-teacher organization, such as the <u>P.T.A. or a school site council</u>.
- One (1) member active in a <u>business organization</u> representing the business community located in the District.
- One (1) member active in a senior citizens' organization.
- One (1) member active in a bona-fide taxpayers association.
- Two (2) members of the community at-large."
