LUNCH ACCOUNTS

As we approach the end of the school year, there have been several questions regarding student balances on their lunch accounts. Student balances will roll over into the next school year automatically. <u>Unpaid balances must be paid by June 16, 2025</u>. If your child has a negative balance, you can pay it online or can send it in with your child with their name, teacher, and grade marked on the envelope. If your child is leaving the district and they have a balance on their account, **please submit a letter in writing requesting a refund to the cafeteria manager no later than June 9, 2025**. REPORT CARDS & CLASS ASSIGNMENTS

Report cards will be available on Parent Access on the last day of school at dismissal. You will be notified of classroom assignments in August. A MESSAGE FROM OUR SCHOOL NURSE, MRS. DEBELLIS

For Parents of Children with Medications at School:

If you would like to pick up your children's medications before the last day of school, (June 20, 2025) please email me at maria.debellis@monroe.k12.nj.us to make an appointment for pick up.

For all students who need medication in school for the 2025-2026 school year, you can access the district medication forms on the Monroe Township Public Schools website, under "Health Offices".

The completed forms and medications are to be delivered by an adult to Brookside preferably BEFORE the first day of school, Wednesday, Sept. 3, 2025. Please email me at maria.debellis@monroe.k12.nj.us to make an arrangement with me for medication drop-off before September 3, 2025.

No medications can be accepted without the completed physician forms with physician signature, stamp, date, and parent signatures.

For Grade 5 Parents:

Thank you for taking your children for their 6th grade immunizations and submitting the forms to me. For those parents who have not made an appointment for their child's 6th grade immunizations, just a friendly reminder: if your child is entering Middle School in the fall, according to NJ law, they must receive the **Tdap and Meningitis immunizations after they turn 11 years old**. According to NJ **State law, your child will** <u>not</u> be allowed to attend school until proof of immunization is received.

- If the vaccines have already been administered, but you have not sent in documentation from the physician, please send it to me at Brookside at this time.
- If your child is not 11 years old by September 4, the documentation must be received at the middle school within 2 weeks after their 11th birthday. Reach out to the middle school nurses to let them know when your appointment is.

If you have identified a child who resides in Monroe Township with anyone or a combination of difficulties listed above, please encourage the parent to contact the Department of Pupil Personnel Services at (609) 642-6128 to schedule an appointment. A member of the Child Study Team will initiate a referral for possible evaluation.

The Key to Your Child's Success: A Well-Balanced Breakfast!

Your school's breakfast program will offer a well-balanced breakfast to every student, each morning, in the cafeteria. These nutritious meals are carefully designed to comply with current USDA regulations and dietary guidelines, and include a filling breakfast entrée, a side item, low-fat milk and 100% juice.

Breakfast is the most important meal of the day! Children of all ages need breakfast each morning to succeed. Although breakfast is the one meal your children cannot afford to skip, it is becoming increasingly difficult for children to find the time to eat a nutritious meal in the morning.

Brookside Elementary School's breakfast may be purchased in the cafeteria, daily from 9:10am-9:20am, and the student may take it to their classroom to be eaten for breakfast, or they may save it for snack. Breakfast is free to all students who qualify for the Free and Reduced Meal Program. The price for purchasing a breakfast is \$2.25.

We want to take the worry out of your morning routine! When you know, your children are guaranteed to receive a healthy breakfast in the morning, you have one less thing to worry about each day. School breakfast will help your children start the day with the right type of nutrition that energizes them for a full day of learning.

Our breakfast menus are prepared by our Chefs and Dieticians to provide:

- Delicious entrée and side items such as whole grain muffins, assorted cereals, low-fat yogurts and other delicious items.
- Variety of fresh fruits, skim milk white or chocolate, and 100% juice
- Each breakfast contains no more than 30% of calories from fat and no more than 10% of calories from fat.
