28	Part IV. General Considerations (a) was presented at this time.  a. Informational item regarding Worker's Compensation- Mr. Ted Tomblin		
29 30	<ul> <li>a. Informational item regarding Worker's Compensation- Mr. Ted Tomblin</li> <li>Mr. Tomblin was pressed for time and presented first. When Bray and Oakley took over our program, our</li> </ul>		
31	e-mods were 2.09%. A standard e-mod is 1.0. We are 100.9% above what our e-mod should be. Our new		
32	e-mod for the upcoming year is 1.59. That is about a 50% decrease from when we started. Some		
33	programs had been implemented and several improvements had been made.		
34	The return to work mandate was put in place about a year ago and there had been several loss-control		
35	visits by different individuals. Lighting was improved in different areas and mats installed in entry ways.		
36	We now sub-contract lawn care and snow and ice removal and that prevented a lot of falls and claims.		
37	There was a lot of cooperation from cooks. They helped get a lot of things corrected. Curbs were painted		
38	around the schools for greater visibility. Claims reviews were done monthly. Mr. Tomblin applauded		
39 40	everyone involved in the changes. The premium decreased by about \$50,000.00.		
+0 41	III. Departmental Updates		
42	a. Financial Update - Beth Daniels		
43	Beth Daniel and Rod McCoy presented the financial update. There were two PowerPoints. Fund 11 was		
44	down about a million dollars. Those locally received funds were generally collected around September and		
45	March/ April. Our local funds allow us to pay things upfront. Things like payroll, accounts payable bills an		
46	items purchased by Federal funds. We spent the monies and then request a cash draw down from the		
47	state department. It is necessary to maintain a healthy balance in fund 11 to cover such expenses.		

Expenditures were looked at and explained. There was discussion, questions and answers. There had been a lot of things done in the county that had benefited students and staff this year. Among those improvements were softball facilities, baseball facilities and improvements, lighting, paving, restroom upgrades, gym floors, and playground equipment. The Technology office had been able to provide laptops for students. Food was being provided for students on weekends. An update on the incoming revenue will be provided in April. There was discussion about many things, including the bleachers at the Gilbert football field.

Mr. Dean presented to the Board about naming the Baseball field. There was discussion. The Board decided to table this item until the next Board meeting of 4-19-22.

Mr. Hoffman addressed the Board and expressed interest in getting a Cosmetology program established at the Mingo Extended Learning Center. He explained the process. There was discussion. The Board suggested to table this item until the treasurer approvaled.

Dr. Branch spoke regarding this item and explained the financing. The Board of Education paid about half of the funding for the officers and the county commission did too. Having these officers are very beneficial to the schools. Chris Endicott is located at Mingo Central and David Nunley is located at Tug Valley.
