33	a. Discussion and possible action on setting the 2020-2022 MCBOE meeting schedule.
34	Mrs. Grace made a motion to keep the schedule as the third Tuesday of each month. Mr. Slone seconded
35	that motion. The motion carried at 4/1. Mr. Preece voted no.
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37	b. Discussion and possible action toward the approval of re-entry strategy for 2020-2021 school year.
38	Dr. Branch lad the discussion
39 40	Dr. Branch led the discussion.
40	Joe Howard, spoke regarding the preparations that had been made to make re-entry safer for our students
42	and staff. Some items discussed were sprayers/foggers, and back to school/Covid-19 training for the drivers.
43	and starr. Some items discussed were sprayers, robbers, and back to school, covid 15 training for the drivers.
44	William Hensley demonstrated a cordless handheld mister. Things discussed were an initial deep cleaning of
45	schools by an outside company, cleaning/removal of carpets/rugs.

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47 48	Rodney McCoy discussed purchases made for safer entry into schools; masks, gloves, shields, and items for Covid Care bags.
49 50	Dr. Branch discussed survey results and explained scenarios for re-entry into school. Board members
50 51 52	reviewed the survey results. There were questions and discussion.
52 53	Ms. McCormick made a motion to enter into executive session regarding a personnel matter. Mr. Preece and
54 55	seconded that motion. The motion carried with a vote of 5/0. The time was 10:29 a.m.
56 57	The Board resumed the meeting at 10:59 a.m.
58 59	Dr. Branch continued the report on the survey questions.
60 61	Other things discussed were restroom time for students, temperature screening,
62 63	Mr. Spence addressed the Board. Three options for opening schools were:  A) 4 days in school, 1 day remote learning
64	B) 5 days in school and leave early each day
65	C) 2 days in school, 3 days remote. The school would divide their students into two groups and alternate
66	school and remote learning.
67	Example of option C: Students would be divided into group A and B. Group A would
68	attend school on Monday and Tuesday; they would use remote learning from home
69	Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. Group B would attend school on Thursday and Friday;
70	they would use remote learning from home on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday.

72	There was discussion about the three options.
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74	Mrs. Grace made a motion for option B) - 5 days in school and leave early each day. Mr. Preece seconded
75	that motion. The motion failed with a show of hands. The vote was 2/3. Mr. Baisden voted no. Mr. Slone
76	voted no. Ms. McCormick voted no. The motion did not pass.
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78	Mr. Slone made a motion for option A) – 4 days in school and 1 day remote learning. Ms. McCormick
79	seconded that motion. The motion carried with a vote of 3/2. Mr. Preece voted no. Mrs. Grace voted no.
80	The motion passed.
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82	Dr. Branch spoke about our county prioritizing the remote learning experience for our students.
83 84	There was discussion about the calendar, when first day for teachers would be, and the playing of sports.
