Through the strategic plan, surveys and in-person meetings, the OPS team has received significant feedback about this facility package – more than 22,000 points of community engagement. We are grateful for your questions, ideas and suggestions.

We've listened to your input and finalized a plan that reflects what matters most to Owasso residents. Administrators, board members, teachers, support staff, parents and community members have worked together to address critical needs, while minimizing the financial impact to local residents with **no increase to the tax rate**.

School investment elections require 60% to pass. We encourage all Owasso residents to please take time to vote.

What will the plan cost each taxpayer?

After listening to feedback from the community, the district developed a plan that will meet the needs of Owasso students with NO increase to the tax rate – but rather a continuation of the current level. It's a win-win for students and Owasso residents.

Who can vote?

Multi-Use Athletic Facility



In addition to providing a home for the soccer teams and other school/community programs, this facility will include a walking track for the public and serve as green space for 7th-grade students during PE, lunch and recess.

5th Grade Elementary Center



The 5th Grade Elementary Center will provide students with a developmentally appropriate environment designed to meet their unique needs – including the support of an elementary school setting and learning opportunities that will prepare them for the next steps in their school career.

Fine Arts Instructional Addition



The fine arts instructional addition will provide new classrooms on the west high school campus. While the current Performing Arts Center is designed for large audiences and events, this addition will include spaces for smaller performances and daily instruction for students who participate in speech, theatre, debate and other classes.

What is the total cost of the plan?

The total cost of the plan is \$169,180,000.
