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# WELCOME TO SUMMER SCHOOL!

Dear Families,

It is time to register for summer school and we are excited to show you all of the amazing opportunities we have from which to choose. This year we will once again be using Skyward Family Access to register for most of the listings in this book. Please do not let that scare you away from registering! We are here to help. Simply call one of the school offices for assistance. (Elementary 715-373-6199 Ext. 202 or MS/HS 715-373-6188 Ext. 100)

**Dates:** Our traditional summer school takes place over six individual weeks, with other opportunities taking place at various times throughout the summer.

Session I June 16<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup>

Session II June 23<sup>rd</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup>

Session III July 7<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup>

Session IV July 14<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup>

Session V July 21<sup>st</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup>

Session VI July 28<sup>th</sup> – Aug 1<sup>st</sup>

There are some classes that take place at other times. Read the descriptions carefully!

**Class times:** There are two classes per day for our traditional electives' classes. The first one runs from 9:00 -10:15 am and the second from 10:20 am to 12:00 lunch built in. There are a few classes that run for both periods, and some classes take place over two weeks. This will allow for deeper learning opportunities, new styles of classes, and a more relaxing environment with less transitions.

**Drop off & pick up:** Students who continually arrive late (after 9:15am) may be dismissed from summer school. Pick up is no later than 12:05 pm.

**Registration:** Registration for most electives' classes will be through Skyward Family Access. Make sure you have your account set up. If you need help getting access to Skyward, please contact the school secretary. If you are unable to access Skyward at home, we would be happy to plan for in-person registration at the school. There are a few classes with special registration instructions. Directions for how to register for those classes will be in the class description.

**\*\*Registration for all elective classes will open Monday, May 19<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am. Registration for all classes will close at 7:30 am Friday, June 6<sup>th</sup>. Schedules will be mailed home after that date. \***

\*Please register children at least one week before the start of the session(s) they will be participating in. This is important for planning and prep purposes.

**Grade Levels:** IMPORTANT! Students should sign up for classes offered at the grade level they are currently in.

**Location:** All electives' classes will take place or start from Washburn Elementary School- 411 W. 8<sup>th</sup> St. (MS/HS specific courses will send more information about meeting location upon registration.)

**Transportation:** There will be three bus stops for Washburn students to take to and from summer school. The school will transport students for field trips or offsite classes. Students who arrive late and miss transportation may not be able to participate.

**Cancelled classes:** If a class is cancelled due to low enrollment or other reasons the school office will call you to determine an alternate class placement.

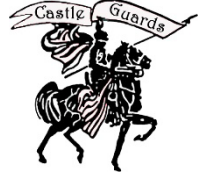

## Castle Guard Kids Summer Program 2025



The CGK Summer Program is an extension of the school year program and will operate from June 16<sup>th</sup> through August 22<sup>nd</sup>. This childcare program will provide fun and exciting activities that will engage children in the natural setting of our school grounds. Children will have the opportunity to explore, learn, and create in the school garden, Lost City, School Forest, school pond, and more. This program will follow present CGK rules and policies and will follow the ELC Handbook located on the district website.

### Important information:

- Castle Guard Kids will run June 16<sup>th</sup> through August 22<sup>nd</sup>, from 7:30am to 5:00pm
- There will be no care available during the weeks of June 9-13, June 30-July 4, August 25-29.
- CGK after school care for the 2025-2026 school year will begin Tuesday, September 2, 2025.
- This enrollment form, the parent contract, and the behavior contract are required prior to the 1st day of enrollment.
- Enrollment will be on a first-come first served basis. Available spots may fill up, enacting a waitlist.
- Students who are currently enrolled in the after-school program still need to register separately for summer care.
- **2025 Fees:**
  - 3 days per week: \$120 (\$75 during summer school weeks)
  - 4 days per week: \$145 (\$85 during summer school weeks)
  - 5 days per week: \$160 (\$95 during summer school weeks)
  - Daily drop-in: \$50 (full day) or \$30 (half day)

Washburn Elementary Cafeteria

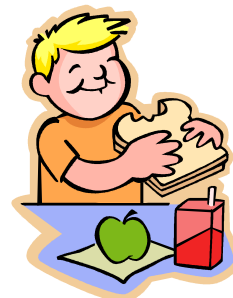
## Calling ahead:

While calling ahead is **not required**, it is encouraged. This will help to ensure that we make enough food for everyone to enjoy. Daycares, summer camps, and other groups are encouraged to attend. Call 715-373-6199 ext. 200 to let us know what days and meals your child will be eating. There is no need to call if your student is attending summer school.

## More information:

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is administered by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, provides nutritious meals to children during the summer, when free and reduced-price school meals are typically unavailable. Free meals will be made available to children 18 years of age and under. Persons over 18 years of age who are determined by a state or local public educational agency to be mentally or physically disabled and who also participate in a public or private non-profit school program during the regular school year may receive free meals as well.

# **ELECTIVE COURSES- ALL GRADES**

See the “Schedule of Offerings” pages for dates and times of each class. Many classes occur multiple times, and students may enroll in a class as many times as they wish. Students should use their current grade level when selecting classes.

## **ART**

### **ADVENTURES IN PHOTOGRAPHY** (Grades 6-8)

Middle school students interested in photography will get an introduction in this one-week class that includes learning how to make great images with a digital SLR as well as exploration of alternative printing processes such as cyanotypes and photograms! Students will engage in a series of mini shooting assignments and activities that will expand their creative photography skills. Limited space due to equipment availability.

### **CREATURE CRAFTS** (Grades K-2 and 3-6)

Students will let their creativity run wild to complete a craft each day based on various creatures, such as sea animals, fantasy creatures, and other fun and colorful beings. We will use a bunch of different materials to create our masterpieces!

### **CARD MAKING** (Grades 3-6)

Learn some fun strategies to take your homemade cards from ordinary to extraordinary! We will make a variety of cards that students can use for different occasions.

### **DRAWING 1 - SKETCHES AND DOODLES** (Grades 1-3)

Learn how to draw your favorite cartoon characters, animals, superheroes, and more! Students will learn the introductory basics of line drawing, follow along during creative in-class sketching activities, doodle from the imagination, and even turn their very own family pet into a superhero or giant robot!

### **DRAWING 2 - ADVANCED DRAWING** (Grades 4-8)

Learn how to make your drawings look more realistic! Students will practice the basics of advanced drawing skills, such as shading, dimension, depth, multiple-point perspective, and frame composition. Instruction will also include some standard industry techniques, such as inking over pencil linework, and how to go about composing images into sequential art (comics).

### **FANTASTIC FOOD ART** (Grades 3-6)

Get ready to create masterpieces in this fun, hands-on summer school class inspired by your favorite foods! Fantastic Food Art is a creative course where students will learn how to use different art mediums such as drawing, painting, and sculpture to make colorful and imaginative works of art inspired by food!

### **HIKING & ART** (Grades K-2)

Take a nature hike and then get creative! Draw, paint, and craft art inspired by nature. Flower/leaf pressing, nature collages, rock painting, and so much more!

### **JEWELRY MAKING** (Grades 3-6)

In this course, students will learn to make jewelry by using stretchy cord, wire and beads. We will learn to make necklaces, bracelets and earrings!

## **MONSTER MAKER'S LAB** (Grades 4-8)

Enter the laboratory of Dr. Frankenstein and discover how the famous movie monsters were created! Students will learn about the history and behind-the-scenes artistry (such as concept drawing, clay sculpture, animatronics, and FX makeup) used in the making of classic characters like Godzilla and King Kong! Students will also get to design their very own original monsters on paper and then sculpt them into a clay maquette.

## **MYTHS & STORYTELLING** (Grades 3-8)

Gather 'round the campfire and hear tell of the great legends of old! Students will enjoy a selection of classic myths and fables, such as the tale of King Arthur, as well as learn from the great *pourquoi* stories, which for generations have offered imaginative explanations as to why the world around us is the way it is. Why does the wolf howl at the moon? Why can the ocean be heard inside of a seashell? Maybe we'll find out. Students will also have the opportunity to create, share, and collaborate with each other on their very own stories.

## **OUT OF THIS WORLD ART** (Grades 3-6)

Blast off into creativity with *Out of This World Art*! In this exciting summer school class, artists will explore the wonders of outer space and turn them into their very own artistic creations. Students will learn about planets, stars, galaxies, and more, using various art techniques such as painting, drawing, and mixed media to bring their cosmic visions to life!

## **PERLER BEADS CREATIONS** (All Ages)

Back by popular demand—Perler beading now has its own class! With plenty of beads to go around, kids will have endless options to create amazing designs. Kids can use their imagination to craft something unique, follow themed kits, or print out instructions for a specific pattern—so many choices! For beginners or Perler bead pros, this class is all about creativity, color and fun!

## **STRINGS & THINGS** (Grades K-2 & 3-6)

Get creative this summer with Strings & Things! In this hands-on class, we will learn to make fun and unique projects using string, thread and beads. From friendship bracelets and simple beaded jewelry to macrame and beginner embroidery or cross stitch, there are so many possibilities to bring creativity to life!

# **ATHLETIC/RECREATION/FOODS**

## **BAKING BONANZA** (Grades 6-8)

Learn important kitchen safety tips and techniques to ensure a fun and secure baking environment. Each day, you'll have the opportunity to bake a variety of delightful treats, including cookies, cakes, muffins, and pastries. Get ready to impress your friends and family with your delicious creations! Discover the science behind baking as you learn various techniques, such as measuring ingredients, mixing, and decorating. You'll gain valuable skills that will elevate your baking game! Get ready to bake your way to success and have a blast while doing it!

## **BASKETBALL** (Grades K-3 and 4-6)

Basketball 101 introduces basic basketball skills and activities. Dribbling, passing, and shooting, along with some scrimmage-based instruction provides the building blocks to a strong foundation.

## **BATON** (Grades K-2 and 3-6)

Students will develop the skill of baton twirling by learning different twirling techniques, moves, and practice a routine to a song to perform by the end of the week. It will be an outdoor class, weather permitting. All students will receive a baton for use throughout the week that they can keep when the week is over!

## **BEACH SEEKERS** (Grades K-12)

Explore the beaches of the Bayfield Peninsula! Each day, we will trek to a different beach in our area. Along the way, we will track where we are on our own maps of the peninsula and identify distinctive landforms at each beach. We will spend a short time at the beach looking for evidence of how the beach was formed and other notable natural or man-made elements that affect the beach. Finally, we will have some unstructured time to enjoy the beach by playing with classmates, creating art from



nature, splashing around in the water or just relaxing. Each student should bring a snack and a water bottle with them every day, in addition to sunscreen, bug spray, swimwear, a towel and a change of clothes. Footwear should be something that can get wet/sandy and is easy for you to put on and take off.

### **BOATING ADVENTURES!** (Grades 4-8)

Explore local waterways while learning how to kayak and canoe! Join UW-Extension's Superior Adventures Director Ian Meeker and Middle School Science Teacher Elizabeth Post in learning how to paddle through a variety of waters including Lake Superior! This course also includes two full days of canoeing on the Brule River! Come ready for adventure! Students will need a packed lunch and to be dressed for the weather outside.

### **COOKING IN THE GARDEN** (Grades K-2 & 3-6)

Taste the fresh flavors of midsummer! Learn how to pick food and cook it up – right in the garden

### **CREEPY CRAWLY CRITTERS** (Grades K-2 & 3-6)

Get the skills you need to catch critters this summer. We will hunt the garden, field, pond and creek for 6-, 8-, and 100-legged creatures.

### **DISC GOLF** (Grades 4-6)

Students will practice disc golf basics, learn a variety of throws, and get to play rounds with their friends. We will do drills, play games, and work on improving our game!

### **FUN IN THE SUN** (Grades K-2)

Come and enjoy outdoor games and activities! Students will enjoy the summer weather with bubbles, playground equipment, and outdoor games.

### **GAMES!** (Grades K-6)

Do you like to play board and card games? Here's your chance to learn new games and play old favorites, too. Every day we will learn and play at least one game. There will also be time to play the games you want to play, too!

### **GARDEN DETECTIVES** (Grades K-2 & 3-6)

Uncover clues to how the school garden grows! Using science tools and a curious mind, detectives dig into the secrets of soil, mystery of plants, and the who-done-it of garden pests.

### **GARDENING EN LA JARDIN!** (Grades 3-6)

Students will be learning all about our garden while integrating the Spanish language! Each day will have some structured language time, learning Spanish through music, art, and experiences in the garden! We will play some games and learn more about plants and how to grow them! Be ready to be outside!

### **GARDENING AND OJIBWEMOWIN!** (Grades 3-6)

Join native Ojibwe language speakers for language immersion and getting our hands dirty in the garden! Each day will have some structured language time, learning Ojibwe through music, art, and experiences in the garden! We will play some games and learn more about plants and how to grow them! Be ready to be outside!

### **HEALTHY SNACK ATTACK** (Grades 3-5)

Discover the do's and don'ts of kitchen safety! Explore the world of quick and easy healthy snacks that you can make for yourself and your friends. From colorful fruit kabobs to crunchy veggie dips, the options are endless! Get your hands dirty as you cook alongside your classmates. You'll learn valuable cooking skills while creating yummy treats that are both nutritious and fun to eat! Work with your fellow classmates to come up with your own unique snack creations!

### **JUNIOR NATURALISTS AT THE SCHOOL FOREST** (Grades K-2 & 3-6)

Junior Naturalists will join the ranks as they learn about plants, animals and rocks while playing and exploring in the School Forest.

## **KICKBALL** (Grades 4-6)

Join this class and learn the rules and proper techniques for playing kickball- an all-time favorite recess game!

## **MINUTE TO WIN IT** (Grades 1-6)

Minute to win it challenges daily with winners and fun prizes. Each day we will have a different challenge to compete in. Each challenge will be completed in a minute resulting in points for teams for winning.

## **RELAY RACES AND OTHER OUTDOOR GAMES** (Grades K-2)

Run, jump, and have a blast in action packed outdoor team games! From classic relay races to creative new challenges, every day brings a fresh team game adventure. Join us for movement, laughter, and friendly competition! (grades K-2)

## **SAILING** (Grades 4-6)

Have you always wanted to sail? Come sailing with the Bayfield Rec Center! Be sure to equip yourself with your good shoes, sunscreen, and clothing which may get wet. Your student may only register for one week of sailing. Due to limited space, please contact the Summer School office if your child is unable to attend the week they have signed up for.

## **STORIES IN THE WOODS** (Grades K-2)

Students will get to explore the woods and read stories that take place in the forest. Through the stories we read, they will learn about the plants and animals around them and let their imaginations run wild as they make stories of their own as well!

## **TAKE A HIKE!** (Grades 2-6)

Kids from grades 2-6 that are interested in exploring area hiking trails should sign up for this summer school adventure course. We will be exploring area hiking trails (1 new hike each day), some of which end on local beaches, and generally letting the kids find their own way to enjoy the outdoors while they explore nature along the paths. We'll be keeping our hikes under three miles total with plenty of breaks for rest and exploration. This will be a rain-or-shine course, which means kids should come prepared with proper gear for a hike when it's raining or muddy because we do not have contingency plans for foul weather. We'd like to encourage kids to learn that a little rain and mud can sometimes make the outdoors even more fun.

## **TEAM GAMES** (Grades K-2 and 3-6)

In this session kids will learn how to play pick-up games of team sports they can play all summer long, such as soccer, football, and softball/baseball, etc.

## **TRAIL MIX ADVENTURES** (Grades K-2)

Get ready for a deliciously fun journey on our **Trail Mix Adventures** cooking course! Students will dive into the exciting world of creating their very own trail mixes while learning essential kitchen safety tips, whipping up healthy treats, and discovering how food fuels their energy for play and exercise. This course focuses on making age-appropriate snacks that are not just nutritious but also packed with flavor and creativity! After making a tasty treat, we will head outside and visit the Lost City or head to the playground. We will be outside as much as we can, make sure to pack a water bottle and sunscreen Let's get mixing and make this a snack-tastic experience!

## **VOLLEYBALL 101** (Grades 3-8)

Spend the day in the gym playing volleyball. We will be learning basic skills: passing, setting, hitting. Students will also learn ways to develop their skills at home.

## **WILD PURSUITS BOAT CHARTER** (Grades 2-12)

Spend the day on one of the Wild Pursuits Boat Charter tours!! This opportunity is open to students of all ages. Due to the limited number of spaces available, this opportunity will be based on a lottery system. Student names will be drawn on the Friday of the previous week that tours are offered. Summer School office staff will reach out to families of the students whose names were drawn to determine participation on the tours. ## **WORLD OF WHEELS** (Grades K-2 & 3-6)

Bring your helmet and skates, skateboard, hoverboard, rip stick, and/or scooter for some fun on wheels! Don't want to be on wheels? That's okay! There will be hot wheels and tracks too!

## **YARD GAMES** (Grades K-3)

From cornhole and ladder toss to giant Jenga and Bocce ball, we will learn and play a variety of outdoor games that has something for everyone, whether you're looking for friendly competition or just a little fun in the sun.

# **MATH / READING / SCIENCE / SOCIAL STUDIES / TECHNOLOGY**

## **VIRTUAL SUMMER BOOST PROGRAM** (Grades 1-8)

Utilizing research based, personalized math and literacy learning programming students will work through an online platform for a minimum of 60 minutes per week during our summer school session: June 16-June 27 and July 7-Aug 1. ## **3D PRINTING AND LASER CUTTING** (Grades 3-6)

This summer, ignite your child's creativity and introduce them to the exciting world of digital fabrication! Our hands-on summer school class provides a unique opportunity for elementary students to explore the possibilities of 3D printing, 3D scanning, and laser cutting with a Glowforge.

## **BERENSTEIN BEARS** (Grades K-2)

Join Brother, Sister, Mama, and Papa Bear as we read stories that will teach us lessons about life. Students will listen to stories and practice the skills that the bear family learns about.

## **BIRD WATCHERS** (Grades 1-4)

## **BOTTLE ROCKETS** (Grades 3-6)

## **BUG HOTELS** (Grades 2-5)

## **FISHING** (Grades 4-6) *\*To ensure opportunity for all students, your child may sign up for fishing one time.\**

Does your child want to spend time outside this summer while learning about the lake, local fish species, and the basics to becoming an angler? Look no further! The first part of this class will focus on learning to read maps of the lake, species identification, casting, lures, and much more! In the last part of class students will put their new skills to the test by visiting different local fishing spots. Students in fishing will also have the opportunity to get out on the Lake and explore shipwrecks and lighthouses with Wild Pursuits Boat Charters. You do not want to miss out! Note: This is a two-session course.

## **LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION! UNLEASH YOUR INNER FILMMAKER!** (Grades 3-6)

Ready to bring your wildest stories to life? Dive into the thrilling world of movie making this summer! We'll be transforming ordinary objects into cinematic stars using the magic of stop motion animation and transporting ourselves to any world imaginable with our green screen adventures! Get hands-on with iPad apps like iMovie, Clips, MyCreate, Stop Motion, and PicCollage to create your very own short

films. And for those who want to take their movies to the next level, we'll be diving into advanced editing software on the iMacs! Bring your imagination and your favorite toys! Action figures, LEGOs, anything you can dream up can become part of your movie masterpiece.

### **ICKY STICKY OOEY GOOEY CHEMISTRY** (Grades K-6)

Have fun exploring mystery powders and experimenting with different mixtures and solutions!

### **KINDERGARTEN, HERE WE COME!** (4K) (3 HOUR CLASS)

Ready- Set – Go! This course will give incoming kindergarten students the opportunity to learn the routines of a typical school day with outdoor exploration to build academic and social-emotional skills. This is a two-session course.

## **AGRIPRENEUR** (Grades 9-12)

This is a summer school apprenticeship program involving work in the high tunnel and the aquaponics greenhouse. Selected students will work cooperatively with other student apprentices and support staff to manage food production and process produce. Tasks include:

1. Weekly maintenance in the high tunnel includes irrigation maintenance, pruning, trellising, weeding, and harvesting.
1. Develop marketing strategies and packaging for produce.
2. Attend all training sessions, hands-on learning sessions, and farm and facility tours.

Students completing the apprenticeship will earn a stipend, a science credit of electives, and have an opportunity to take home fresh produce throughout the growing season. Please email Mr. Long [dlong@washburn.k12.wi.us](mailto:dlong@washburn.k12.wi.us) for schedule specifics and to register.

Aquaponics will be offered all six weeks of summer school. Sign up for the weeks that will work best in your schedule.

## **CHILD DEVELOPMENT IN EARLY LEARNING CENTER (ELC)** (Grades 5-8)

Does your student enjoy interacting with young children? In this class students will assist early childhood teachers to read, sing, and play with our babies, toddlers, and preschoolers in the Early Learning Center. Students will be introduced to basic ways to support child development. This experience is great for beginning babysitters. Register by using the Summer School Registration method.

## **FUNDAMENTALS OF GOLF** (Grades 6-12)

Essential skills taught include but are not limited to: Putting, chipping, approach shots, hitting from the rough, sand, and sloped terrain, swinging with rescue clubs, hybrids, short irons, long irons, woods, and drivers. Time will be spent on the driving range as well as on the golf course. It is preferable if students have their own clubs, but some golf clubs can be provided. Please email Mr. Tyndall [rtyndall@washburn.k12.wi.us](mailto:rtyndall@washburn.k12.wi.us) for schedule specifics and to register. Transportation can be arranged from the school. Register by using the Summer School Registration method.

## **SPEED AND STRENGTH** (Grades 6-11)

Speed & Strength is an athletic training class for all skill and strength levels. This class will focus on fundamental movements in strength, power, speed, and agility. Participants will follow research backed training plan suited to their age, skill level, and experience. If you would like to improve your performance in athletics, improve your fitness, and improve your self-confidence, this class is for you.

- **Session 1 - 6:30am - 8:25am:** 3 days per week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday)
- **Session 2 - 8:30am - 10:25am:** 3 days per week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday)
- Classes will run from June 9<sup>th</sup> to August 1<sup>st</sup>. Any changes made will be relayed to students and parents.

# **CREDIT RECOVERY MS/HS**

To register for MS/HS credit recovery students must submit a completed application (including teacher approval) for Summer School and return it to the Middle/High School Office. The Summer School Credit Recovery form is included in this booklet, will be mailed home to students who failed classes, or can also be picked up in the Middle/High School office. All forms must be returned by Friday, June 6, 2025.

## **HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT RECOVERY** (Grades 9-12)

High School Summer School will be in session during the regularly scheduled six weeks for summer school from 8:30 am to 12:00 pm. The goal of summer school is to assist students in finishing courses in which they have received a grade of “incomplete” and/or an F and a time for students to work on credit recovery/online courses. Students must submit a completed application (including teacher approval) for summer school to the Middle/High School Office.

## **MIDDLE SCHOOL CREDIT RECOVERY** (Grades 7-8)

Middle School students who have failed three or more quarters of any class will need to attend summer school. Middle School Summer School will be in session during the regularly scheduled four weeks for summer school from 7:30 am to 12:00 pm. Students must submit a completed application (including teacher approval) for Summer School to the Middle/High School Office.

### For Skyward Family Access Online Class Selection:

1. Go to <http://www.washburn.k12.wi.us/>, click on the **"PARENTS"** tab at the top of the page, and then click the **"SKYWARD FAMILY"** link located under **"QUICK LINKS"**.
2. Login with your **Skyward** username and password. If you do not remember your login or password, click on the **"FORGOT LOGIN/PASSWORD"** link and follow the instructions. If you do not have a Skyward Family Access account, please contact Leasa Tody at 715-373-6199 ext. 202 to have one set up.
3. Click on **"ARENA SCHEDULING"** (left column). Click on **"2024-2025"** under the child's name that you wish to schedule summer school classes.
4. Courses that the student can sign up for will be displayed for their current grade level.  
**Period (Prd)** = what time the class meets, **period 1** (9:00am-10:15am), **period 2** (10:20am-12:00pm)  
**Term (Trm)** = **T1** (June 16<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup>), **T2** (June 23<sup>rd</sup>-27<sup>th</sup>), **T3** (July 7<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>), **T4** (July 14<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup>)  
**T5** (July 21<sup>st</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup>), **T6** (July 28<sup>th</sup> – Aug 1<sup>st</sup>)

If you would like to display only period 1 or period 2 classes, click on the **"PERIOD"** drop down menu and click **"APPLY FILTER"**. This will make it easier to schedule classes for each period.

5. Schedule your child's classes: Click the **"ADD"** link in the front of the course name to select the courses you would like to enroll in and click **"OK."** Click the **"REMOVE"** link to remove a selected course from your student's schedule. If the course fits into the student's schedule it will display yes or no under the **"FIT"** column. **"ENR"** will display when you have selected (enrolled) in the class. The **"SEATS AVAIL"** column displays how many seats are available in that class. If the class is full, it will display 0 seats available and under the **"IND"** column it will show an F (meaning class is full) and you will have to choose a different class. Click the right arrow at the bottom to display more classes.
6. If you select a class that will not fit or overlaps, you will receive a warning message. OK will change it to the new class. Cancel will keep the class.
7. Click on **"VIEW/PRINT SCHEDULE"** to verify the student's schedule. You may print out the schedule at this time. After the summer school enrollment period the student's schedule will be sent home.

We have multiple 3-hour classes. When signing up for a 3-hour class you should not sign up for a period 2 class. If you do choose a period 2 class, you will receive a warning message.

## **MS/HS Summer School**

1. MS/HS Summer School will be throughout the summer, but all summer schoolwork must be completed by Aug 1, 2025.
2. Students must submit a completed application, with all the needed signatures, for Summer School by June 6, 2025, Jennie Gilbert. Students must obtain approval from the teacher of the failed class.
3. Students who have failed a class beyond the point of credit recovery may retake the class via WVS or EDucere through Mrs. Lutz.
4. Online attendance in summer school is required.
5. If students finish the assigned work, they may be dismissed from summer school, with teacher approval.
6. Successful completion of credit recovery may reinstate athletic eligibility. Grades for Summer School will not be entered on transcripts until September of the following school year. No report cards will be sent.
7. Students can recoup credit for required and elective courses. Credit may be recovered for first or second semester classes, but only fourth quarter/second semester counts toward reinstatement for athletic eligibility.
8. The classroom teacher will determine the final grade. Online courses will follow the WVS deadlines. Be aware that grades from online courses may not be received in the time to reinstate athletic eligibility.
9. Students who do not remediate the required course(s) during summer school will have those courses placed into their 2025-26 schedule.

Free breakfast and lunch will be served during summer school. All children under 18 can eat for free regardless of whether they attend Washburn Schools or Summer School. All are encouraged to come and eat!
