Certificates of Merit — The Board presented certificates of merit to the following students:

- Fox Chapel Area High School junior **Mira Owens** had her artwork selected for the 2025 National Art Honor Society (NAHS) Juried Exhibition. Mira's piece is titled "Reminiscence," and is a drawing using all the ink in one pen. According to Mira, "I illustrated my dance experience during quarantine. Dance kept me connected to people and music when everything else seemed out of reach. Dancing is like drawing because proper technique takes time; lots of practice must be dedicated to it."

Mira's artwork is being exhibited virtually, along with 129 other selected pieces, on the National Art Education Association (NAEA) website at <https://www.arteducators.org/national-art-honor-societies/articles/2399-2025-nahs-juried-exhibition> from March 11-August 31, 2025. The exhibition showcases the work of talented student artists who are members of NAEA's NAHS/National Junior Art Honor Society programs.

A record-breaking total of 2,587 submissions were received for this year's exhibit representing 72 schools from 31 states and South Korea. The submissions were juried by NAEA arts leaders and were judged on visual communication, execution, formal elements, originality, and artist statement.

The NAHS is designed specifically for high school students in Grades 9-12. In 1978, NAEA began the National Art Honor Society program to inspire and recognize students who have shown an outstanding ability and interest in art. NAHS strives to aid members in attaining the highest standards in art scholarship, character, and service, and to bring art education to the attention of the school and community. Fox Chapel Area High School has an active chapter of the NAHS.

Founded in 1947, NAEA is the leading professional membership organization exclusively for visual arts educators. Members include elementary, middle, and high school visual arts educators; college and university professors; university students preparing to be art educators; researchers and scholars; teaching artists; administrators and supervisors; and art museum educators, as well as more than 29,000 students who are members of the National Art Honor Society.

- Three Fox Chapel Area School District students won first-place awards for their entries in the Pittsburgh Region of the 2025 Scholastic Art Awards.

Gold Key winners were Fox Chapel Area High School juniors **Raina Guzman** and **Mira Owens**, and Dorseyville Middle School seventh-grader **Samuel Ettinger**. The work of the Gold Key winners has been sent to New York for national judging where they will be competing with other regional winners from across the United States for national awards. The winners of the national contest will be part of the Scholastic Art Awards National Exhibit.

Students from 42 schools from across the greater Pittsburgh area participated in the regional competition. The award winners were selected by a panel of distinguished judges which included artists, art educators, and art professionals.

The artwork of the students was on display at Carnegie Mellon University's Hall of Fine Arts February 26-March 9. The students were also honored at a special ceremony March 9 at Carnegie Mellon University's Kresge Theater.

- A Fox Chapel Area High School student won an award as part of the 2025 Youth Art Month (YAM) Exhibit. Junior **Nora Kelley** won a Division Award in the painting and drawing category for her piece titled "Feline's Feast."

Youth Art Month is sponsored by the Council for Art Education and is a celebration of the visual arts. It encourages support for quality school art programs and provides a medium for recognizing skills developed through visual arts experiences. The artwork of more than 300 students from throughout Pennsylvania are exhibited in the virtual show and were celebrated as part of a virtual artists reception and awards ceremony March 14.

- Seven Fox Chapel Area School District students won first-place awards for their submissions in the 2025 Pittsburgh Region Scholastic Writing Awards. Gold Keys were won by Fox Chapel Area High School senior **Gabriella Hample**, sophomore **HanYing Zhang**, and freshman **Eliana Wellman**; and Dorseyville Middle School eighth-graders **Kai Galyardt**, **Celestial Hou**, **Brooke Nalevanko**, and **Carly Phatak**. All seven of these Fox Chapel Area School District students qualified for national judging. Additionally, Gabriella was named an American Voices nominee for the Pittsburgh region, the highest award that can be given in the competition. Her piece, titled, "My Museum," was submitted in the personal essay & memoir category. She was invited to read an excerpt from her winning piece at the regional recognition ceremony.

Hundreds of submissions spanning a variety of different genres of writing were received from students in grades 7-12 from across Allegheny County. The local competition is sponsored by the Point Park University Honors Program, which hosted a regional recognition ceremony for the winners in March at the Pittsburgh Playhouse.

- Eight Fox Chapel Area High School and Dorseyville Middle School students won first-place awards as part of the 2025 Region 7 Meeting of the Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science (PJAS). All eight students qualified for the state competition. Fox Chapel Area first-place winners were seniors **Omar Al-bataineh**, **Anna Delale-O'Connor**, **Etash Jhanji**, and **Rohit Velankar**; sophomores **Heidi Stiger**, **Param Thawani**, and **Rachel Kim**; and eighth-grader **Rishabh Krishnamurthy**. The state PJAS competition was held May 18-20, 2025, at Penn State University, Main Campus.

The participating students (from several schools from Allegheny and Westmoreland counties) researched their science projects for several months. During the competition, each of the students was required to make a presentation in front of a panel of judges. The regional competition was held February 8 at Baldwin High School.

- Six Fox Chapel Area School District students won first-place awards at the 2025 State Meeting of the Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science (PJAS). Fox Chapel Area first-place state winners were seniors **Omar Al-bataineh**, **Anna Delale-O'Connor**, and **Etash Jhanji**; sophomores **Heidi Stiger** and **Param Thawani**; and eighth-grader **Rishabh Krishnamurthy**.

The participating Fox Chapel Area High School and Dorseyville Middle School students were among approximately 2,000 students in grades 7-12 from across Pennsylvania who qualified to participate in the state PJAS competition. The students researched their science projects for several months and were required to give an oral presentation in front of a panel of judges.

The state competition was held at Penn State University, Main Campus, May 18-20. All of the Fox Chapel Area students participating at the state level were named first-place winners at the annual Region 7 Meeting of the PJAS in February

- A Dorseyville Middle School student won a first-place award at the 2025 Pittsburgh Regional Science & Engineering Fair (PRSEF). Eighth-grader **Rishabh Krishnamurthy** was named the first-place winner in the intermediate division of the behavioral and social science category.

The PRSEF is open to students in grades 6-12 from 21 counties in Western Pennsylvania and Garrett County in Maryland. Each year, students from nearly 100 schools spend up to 12 months developing and executing a project and compete for more than \$1 million in cash, scholarships, and trips. All of the students who participated in the fair conducted individual science research and presented their projects to a committee of judges. The judging took place April 1 and 2 at the Carnegie Science Center, a virtual awards ceremony was held April 4, and a showcase for all first place winners was held April 5.

- A total of 110 Fox Chapel Area High School students placed first through fourth at the 2024 Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) Regional Leadership Conference and qualified for the state competition. The FBLA Regional Leadership Conference was held in December 2024. Approximately 450 students from eight high schools participated in the virtual regional competition.

- Several Fox Chapel Area High School and Dorseyville Middle School students placed at the 2025 Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) State Leadership Conference. Senior **Gabriella Hample**; junior **Mikayla Feder**; sophomores **Aiden Drucker, Noelle Fouron, and Ainsley Goode**; and eighth-graders **Dyutit Patro and Anaia Shehzad** won first places. Junior **Michael Costello** and eighth graders **Zoey Liu and Maya Vyas** won second places. Junior **Joanna Li** and eighth-graders **Rishabh Krishnamurthy and Chloe Pick** won third places. Juniors **Zelia Herald, Zinta Jacob, and Joshua Shah** and sophomore **Braxton Bielawski** all won fourth places. All 17 of these students qualified to participate in the FBLA National Leadership Conference that will be held in Anaheim, California, June 29-July 2.

The Dorseyville Middle School state first-place winner in open events (not eligible for the national competition) was eighth-grader **Micah Ramirez**.

The FBLA State Leadership Conference was held in Hershey, Pennsylvania, April 8 and 9. More than 6,200 students from high schools and middle schools across the state participated in the competition.

- A team of Dorseyville Middle School seventh-graders ranked first out of 30 teams in Pennsylvania in the Purple Comet Math Meet. The team members were **Moxley Chiu, Samuel Ettinger, Shengfeng Fei, Akhil Muvvala, Louis Vandapel, and Brian Xu**. In addition to being the first-place team in the state, the group ranked 16th out of 298 teams in the United States and also received an honorable mention designation for being given an overall international rank of 38th out of 1,047 teams.

The Purple Comet Math Meet is an international team mathematics competition designed for middle and high school students that has been conducted annually since 2003. For the 2025 contest, there were 4,613 registered teams from 80 countries.

- A team of Hartwood Elementary School students placed first at the 2025 Children's Choice Awards competition, sponsored by the Allegheny Intermediate Unit and the Allegheny County Library Association. The team consisted of fifth-graders **McKenna Anderson** and **Elizabeth Moudry** and fourth-graders **Eli Holmes** and **Henry Smith**.

The event was held April 9 at Commonwealth Charter Academy in Homestead. Students were asked to read novels and then participate in a trivia event where they answered questions about the books. In addition to the competition, the students also heard a keynote from author Matthew Holm who created (with his sister, Jennifer Holm) a number of graphic novels. They also attended a session with a local graphic artist/storyteller Joe Mruk. The day concluded with a live concert by local duo Josh and Gab, who provided a kindness and bullying awareness musical comedy program.

Approximately 65 students in grades three-six from Allegheny and Washington counties participated in the Children's Choice Awards event.

- Three Fox Chapel Area School District students were named first-place winners in the 2025 WQED Writers Contest. Fairview Elementary School second-grader **Theresa Zigler** was named a first-place winner for her story "The Case of the Missing Guitar," Kerr Elementary School first-grader **Ameena Searight** won first place for her story "Ameena's Silly Future in Paris," and Hartwood Elementary School kindergartner **Laura Phillips** won first place for her story "Doggy Dreams."

Nearly 290 entries were submitted and the Fox Chapel Area winners were five of 16 students who won awards in this year's contest. The students competed against others in their own grade levels, and the contest was open to students in kindergarten-grade three from throughout the country. The winning students were honored at an award ceremony held at WQED studios in Pittsburgh on May 17.

•District Ranks No. 1 in Region and State in Pittsburgh Business Times Guide

For the second consecutive year, the Pittsburgh Business Times has ranked the Fox Chapel Area School District as the No. 1 school district in both Southwestern Pennsylvania and the state.

The rankings, released May 20, 2025, as part of the Guide to Southwestern Pennsylvania Schools, are based on how students performed on standardized Pennsylvania System of School Assessment tests administered to students in grades three through eight and Keystone Exams that high school students were given in 2022, 2023, 2024.

•FCASD Named One of Best Communities for Music Education

The Fox Chapel Area School District has been named among the 2025 Best Communities for Music Education. This is the 14th year that the district has received this designation. Fox Chapel Area is one of 131 in the state of Pennsylvania and one of 935 school districts in the nation chosen for this honor. It recognizes districts that demonstrate outstanding music achievement and that provide an exceptionally high commitment and access to all students to music education.

The districts were selected through a program sponsored by the NAMM (National Association of Music Merchants) Foundation which recognizes and celebrates outstanding efforts by teachers, administrators, parents, students, and community leaders who have made music education part of a well-rounded education for all students.

To qualify for the Best Communities for Music Education designation, Fox Chapel Area music teachers responded to a detailed survey with questions pertaining to funding, graduation requirements, music class participation, instruction time, facilities, support for the music program, and community music-making programs.

A team of Fairview Elementary School students placed second in the 2025 Children’s Choice Awards competition, sponsored by the Allegheny Intermediate Unit and the Allegheny County Library Association.
