Eventually, in 2003, he applied for an open position as a Data Management Specialist with Paterson Public Schools and has since been a supervisor, deputy director, and now director in the District.

"I enjoy all the daily challenges that come with my position, and I will always work towards providing my best service for the Paterson School District."

PASSAIC COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT VISITED SCHOOL NO. 16 & SCHOOL 25 ON SERIOUS TOPICS



SCHOOL NO. 16 6TH-8TH GRADERS

The Passaic County Sheriff's Department visited school No. 16 to speak about Cyberbullying and to present their canine unit to the students. Their presentation on cyberbullying outlined the many negative effects it can impose on a person's life. Some of which can contribute to mental health problems, anxiety and depression. Those who experience cyberbullying are also at higher risk of engaging in self-harm and experiencing suicidal thoughts. The presentation allowed the officers to engage with students and talk about how to deal with cyberbullying and how to find support if it is something that they or someone they know is experiencing it.

The Sheriff's Dept. also introduced their Narcotics Canine Unit. The dogs are trained to detect various illicit substances. The students were excited to meet the canines and learn about them.
