Taniesha Gilbert achieved a major milestone in scoring her 1,000th career point in the JFK Lady Knights' game against the Clifton Lady Mustangs on January 15. Gilbert's 33 points were a great contribution to the team's 52-30 win against Clifton that night. Gilbert, who is a senior at Rosa L. Parks School of the Fine and Performing Arts, said she hopes to continue playing basketball in college. She is interested in a career in criminal justice. PANTHER Student Wins First Place, Team Takes Second in Statewide Math Contest

Nada Aly, an 11th-grader at PANTHER Academy, took first place honors in the 42nd annual Association of Mathematics Teachers of New Jersey (AMTNJ) math contest while the PANTHER team won second place for their division. In addition to Aly, students Amanda Moctezuma Barbosa, Ashley Sanabria, Antonio Williams, and Solomon Wilson competed on the PANTHER Academy team. Moctezuma Barbosa, a senior, won an honorable mention in the contest, along with Sanabria and Williams, who are both juniors.

Aly earned a perfect score in the competition held on Dec. 12, which required students to take a 15-question math test during a 45-minute period, with test topics ranging from algebra to precalculus. In the contest, each question is worth one point. The highest five scores from a school's team constitute the school's score.

The PANTHER Academy team scored 62 out of a possible 75 points to take second place in the Delta Division, which is comprised of schools with fewer than 750 students. Each of the PANTHER students who received an honorable mention scored 12 out of 15 points in the contest.

The students are scheduled to be honored at the regular Paterson Board of Education meeting on February 20.

A Lady Knight to Remember Scheduled to Come Home

Nicole Loudon, Passaic County's all-time top scorer in girls basketball, is scheduled to be honored at a special ceremony on Thursday, February 7 at 6:45 p.m. at the John F. Kennedy Educational Complex gymnasium. The ceremony will precede the Lady Knights' game against Passaic High School. Loudon scored 2,928 career points before graduating from John F. Kennedy High School in 2000.

BTMF Students Shine at NJ DECA Regional Conference

Four students from the School of Business, Technology, Marketing & Finance (BTMF) wowed the judges at the northern regional conference of New Jersey DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America) on January 7. DECA is a national nonprofit organization that prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs for careers in marketing, finance, hospitality and management.



Enequenil Fortunado, Shuhrat Kabir, and Nataly Merino performed well enough in the "Principles of Finance" event to qualify for the competition at the statewide NJ DECA conference in Atlantic City, while Enyeli Galvez shined in the "Professional Selling" event.

A total of 29 BTMF students attended the regional conference, which attracted more than 3,000 participants. Thirty business-themed events were held at the conference. Winners were chosen based on their performance on a 100-question online test, and by role-playing in a problematic business scenario in front of a judge.
