Public School 29 students working with art teacher Jeri Elson recently completed a project that gave them insight into the process of weathering. First, the young artists glued together 30 pieces of colorful construction paper. Then, they used sandpaper to rub away the edges, simulating the way rainwater erodes the edges of rocks over time. After Elson applied a layer of sealant to protect the works of art, the students added magnets. Elson learned about this "Sedimentary STEAM Lesson" from a Woodland Park art teacher while attending the Art Educators of New Jersey conference last fall.

In the midst of a cold winter, the cafetorium at New Roberto Clemente Middle School (NRC) radiated warmth as the renowned Brazilian jazz guitarist, Rodrigo Nassif, made his U.S. performance debut. The event was arranged by NRC music teacher and professional musician, Nathan Webb. Webb first met Nassif at a 2014 trip to the International Society for Music Educators in Porto Alegre, Brazil. The trip was sponsored by William Paterson University. At the NRC concert, Nassif was



accompanied by Webb on drums, and Jacob Webb (Nathan's brother) on bass. Jacob Webb is himself an award-winning producer, bassist, pianist, and multi-instrumentalist. The trio later played at the Shanghai Jazz Restaurant in Madison, N.J., where Nathan Webb frequently performs with his jazz group.
