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FOUR PATERSON PUBLIC SCHOOLS RANKED TOP 20 IN PASSAIC COUNTY

Paterson, NJ (September 12, 2024) - Paterson Public Schools announced that four of its high schools – International High School, Paterson P-Tech High School (formerly School of Earth and Space Science), Rosa L. Parks School of Fine and Performing Arts, and Paterson STEAM High School (formerly School of Health Science) - ranked among the top 20 high schools in Passaic County, according to the latest <u>U.S. News & World Report rankings</u>.

International High School achieved the highest ranking at 9th in the county, followed by P-Tech High School at 14th, Rosa L. Parks School of Fine and Performing Arts at 17th, and STEAM High School at 20th. These rankings reflect the district's ongoing commitment to providing excellent educational opportunities and preparing students for success in higher education and beyond.

<u>U.S. News & World Report</u> evaluates nearly 25,000 public high schools nationwide based on criteria such as the proportion of students passing Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) exams, curriculum breadth, graduation rates, state assessment scores, and performance of Black, Hispanic, and low-income students. The 2024 rankings include nearly 18,000 schools, highlighting those that excel in preparing students for college and career readiness.

"The recognition of our schools as some of the best in Passaic County is a significant accomplishment," added Dr. Newell. "We will continue to strive for excellence and ensure that all of our students have the support and resources they need to reach their full potential."
