Thereafter, NYSED established the New York Charter School Dissemination Grant (“Grant”) for the purpose of awarding funds to charter schools, on a competitive basis, for projects that support the dissemination of effective, evidence-based practices and programs that have been developed, tested, and proven successful in significantly increasing student achievement in New York Charter Schools, and that can be replicated at non-chartered district schools; and

Whereas, in order to satisfy the minimum eligibility requirements of the Grant, the recipient charter school must be in at least its fourth consecutive year of operation and be in “Good Standing” under the State’s accountability system; and

Whereas, for purposed of determining Grant awards, NYSED gives a competitive priority to charter schools that propose to partner with any non-chartered district school, and gives a further competitive priority to charter schools that choose to partner with a non-charter school determined by the State’s accountability system to be “Priority” or “Focus”; and

Whereas, on May 23, 2013, by Resolution No. 2012-13: 695, the Rochester City School District (“District”) Board of Education (“Board”) disaffiliated from the Center On Reinventing Public Education and resolved that any affiliation which results in the District becoming associated or named, symbolically or materially, with an external organization that engages in policy advocacy or supports implementation of products or services according to criteria defined other than by the Board, will require approval by the Board; and

Whereas, on June 20, 2013, by Resolution No. 2012-13: 763, the Board terminated the District’s participation in the District-Charter Compact and resolved that any agreement which commits District resources to charter school operators or their agents, except for statutory requirements, will require approval of the full Board; and

Whereas, on July 6, 2016, Genesee Community Charter School (“GCCS”) was selected to receive an award of up to \$500,000.00 for a three-year project period under the Grant. Whereas, the GCCS has proposed a Grant-funded effort to share the fruit of its experience with hands-on expeditionary learning (the “Project”) whereby GCCS teachers would work with their counterparts at Roberto Clemente School No. 8 to help implement a new early literacy curriculum developed under the expeditionary learning model. Expeditionary learning emphasizes inquiry-based education, where students learn by doing; and

Whereas, under NYSED’s accountability system, Roberto Clemente School No. 8 is currently determined to be a “Priority”; and

Whereas, it is ultimately in the best interest of our students performance for the District to proceed with the Project for dissemination of effective, evidence-based practices and programs that have been developed, tested, and proven successful in significantly increasing student achievement; therefore be it
