HONORS ACADEMY

Stepinac has inducted 34 academically high achieving students into the Honors Academy, the first-of-its-kind, three-year personalized learning program in the region.

This September, the second group of sophomore-year students are pursuing advanced studies in either engineering, health and science, economics and finance or law. To qualify for acceptance into the Honors Academy, students in their freshmen year need a cumulative average of 90% or higher and are required to apply with the knowledge and support of their parents. Each student is assigned a faculty mentor.

"Students will develop and use complex algorithms to explore the major theories and principles associated with each discipline," adding, "A primary goal is to empower students to see the relationship between their academy studies and their application to the real world."

The program will culminate in the senior year with an internship and a final capstone research project and presentation that will be judged

by a panel of faculty members and outside professionals in the fields that correlate with the respective academy.

Carty said that the Honors Academy is the latest initiative that has earned Stepinac leader status in curriculum innovation. "It follows on the heels of the ground-breaking personalized blended learning platform including the first-of-it-kind all digital text book library that has been recognized by educators across the nation and around the world,"

By attending a college lecture series by Andy Serwer, Yahoo's Finance Editor-in-Chief, at the Bard College Manhattan campus, economics and finance students were given a unique perspective by a leading journalist about how technology has impacted the news media.

COLIN SHARKEY REMARKED:

"It was a very exciting experience to hear what this expert had to say about how technology is changing the newspaper and magazine business around the world."

Paul Carty, Principal, said, "Our Honors Academy is designed to help foster the development of skills that the honors students will need to become globally competitive at the college level and beyond."

Frank Portanova, Vice Principal for Academics and Curriculum, noted that Stepinac's Honors Academy better prepares students for their chosen college major as the curriculum framework design is based on undergraduate core courses in the chosen concentrations.

TURKEY BOWL CANCELED..... FOREVER? Citing concerns about the participation of its athletes in fall and winter sports, White Plains High School has decided to end the annual Turkey Bowl rivalry with Stepinac. The Turkey Bowl, which has been played on Thanksgiving since 1971, traditionally drew one of the largest crowds of the season. White Plains and Stepinac have played 43 times since 1971, although last year was their first meeting since 2012. White Plains leads the all-time series 27-16, but Stepinac has won seven of eight, including the last four meetings and will retain the Game trophy forever!

GOLDEN CRUSADERS! The Golden Crusaders Club is designed to facilitate continued alumni participation for those who have celebrated their 50th graduation anniversary and beyond. Presently this would include the 16 classes from 1951 through 1966. hockey highlights





Stepinac's production of "The Hunchback of Notre Dame" took home 4 Metro awards, including "Best Overall Production." Other winners included freshman Jeremy Fuentes '20, who won "Best Lead Actor", senior Anthony Pietroloungo '17, who won "Best Supporting Actor", and faculty member Joe Lore '02 for "Best Scenic Design" Archbishop Stepinac High School's production of "The Hunchback of Notre Dame" was named outstanding overall production at the 19th annual Metropolitan High School Theater Awards at Purchase College's Performing Arts Center.

The production — the regional high-school premiere of the Alan Menken-Stephen Schwartz musical based on the Victor Hugo novel about a hunchback, a gypsy girl and an evil archdeacon — also took home Metros in two top acting categories. When Stepinac won the top award, the room rose to their feet as robed members of the production took the stage. Producer Keith Sunderland met each student at the top of the stairs, welcoming them to the stage. Sunderland congratulated the other nominees. "Every single theater program creates a sanctuary in your schools," he said. "This show is a prayer that everyone who feels as an outcast will be recognized as children of God."

A performance from the musical — about acceptance and creating havens for each other — produced the evening's most powerful moment, when the Stepinac cast opened their long gray robes to reveal T-shirts emblazoned with slogans from social causes.

In addition the shows composer the legendary Alan Menkin attended the last performance and serenaded the cast with an intimate performance of his classic Disney hits. This year the Drama Club was selected as one of five schools in the country to pilot the hit Disney musical Newsies. It premieres in December.



» **THE MATH TEAM** Stepinac's Math Team earned the honor of advancing in the highly competitive Moody Mega Math(M3)) Challenge—one of only 200 high school teams nation-wide that will be vied to cross the finish line and be rewarded with some of the \$150,000 in scholarships. Stepinac was among 1,221 teams comprising more than 5,000 students that competed in the annual Challenge, sponsored by The Moody's Foundation. Stepinac's team of bright mathematicians comprised of Terrence Tunnock '17, Zixiong Feng '17, Thomas Nevin '17 and Rao Fu '18. Faculty members Patricia Murphy and Steve Cupertino '01, respectively, are team coach and Advanced Placement Statistics instructor.

Frank Portanova, Vice Principal for Academics and Curriculum, said:

“When you consider the high caliber of students who entered this competition in the first round, this is an amazing accomplishment for our school and students,” adding. “This shows what happens when we recognize the academic potential of our students...the sky is the limit!”



REVEREND MONSIGNOR PETER A. GELSOMINO

entered into eternal life on February 18, 2017 surrounded by his family. He was born March 14, 1929 in New York City to the late John and Frances Campana Gelsomino. He was raised in New York City graduating from Benjamin Franklin High School in 1946. He then attended St. Jerome College and then graduated from Cathedral College. He entered St. Joseph's Seminary in Dunwoodie and was ordained a priest at St. Patrick's Cathedral on May 28, 1955 by Cardinal Spellman. In 1958 Father Peter became a member of the faculty at Archbishop Stepinac High School in White Plains where he remained until 1993. While there he taught English, Religion and most notably Russian Language. Father Peter was well known for his many trips to Russia with his students as well many other roles at Stepinac. While at Stepinac, Father Peter assisted at many local parishes in Yonkers, Armonk, Rye and Port Chester. In 1994 Father Peter became the pastor at Sacred Heart of Jesus Church in Port Chester where he became a beloved member of the community. On March 4, 2006 Father Peter was elevated to Monsignor at Saint Patrick's Cathedral. He retired as pastor in 2014.



REVEREND VINCENT LANCELLOTTI

entered eternal life on October 27th at Westchester Medical Center, NY. Father Lancellotti was born on February 9th, 1926 in Providence, RI to Anna (Schiavone) Lancellotti and Vincenzo Lancellotti. After graduation from Mt. Pleasant High School, he served in the US Navy. He later studied Stenography and for many years was a court stenographer in Rhode Island. In the early 1960's, he left this profession to join the priesthood. Father Lancellotti was ordained as a Roman Catholic priest in 1968. He served the archdiocese of New York for thirty-three years as a teacher, parish priest and pastor. His first assignment as a newly ordained priest was at St. Mary's Church in Fishkill, NY. He then taught English at Archbishop Stepinac High School in White Plains for nineteen years (1971-1990). Following his teaching ministry, Father Lancellotti became pastor of Our Lady of Mt Carmel Church in Elmsford, NY. He served there until his retirement in 2001. During his years as a teacher and parish priest, Father Lancellotti offered the fruits of his musical gifts to the communities he served. He was an accomplished pianist. He used his talents to produce and direct numerous musical programs for Stepinac, St. Mary's and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.
