



CHOOCH HELPED


THE LAST ZOOKEEPER


HOME IN A LUNCHBOX


THE SPACEMAN

By Corey R. Tabor




When Milo fears a monster is lurking under his bed, his best friend Mel uses American Sign Language to help him fight back—"monster hands!"






PIZZA AND TACO: WRESTLING MANIA!


Zany fun that will appeal to beginner readers presented in a fresh comic format. Easy to read and exciting dialogue between characters encourages a fun read-aloud experience.
