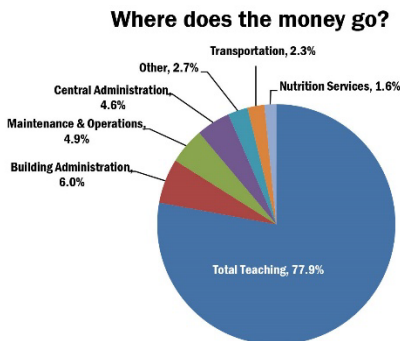
School Description

2023-24 School Goals

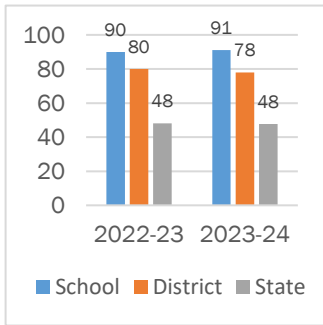
Targeted progress monitoring areas are selected collaboratively based upon data and connect with student growth goals. In addition, our student services team meets three times throughout the year with grade level teams to share practices and strategies specific to student needs. Along with academics, we believe that fitness and arts, regular attendance, and social/emotional health are key factors for success.

- **Social/Emotional Regulation:** Monitoring primary SEL work as part of our 3-year implementation plan: 75% of third grade students will respond favorably in the category of emotional regulation on the 2025 Spring Panorama Survey.
- **Social/Emotional Regulation:** 75% of fifth grade students will respond favorably in the category of emotional regulation on the 2025 Spring Panorama survey.
- **English Language Arts/Literacy:** 80% of students receiving multilingual learner services in grades 2-5 will score in the Low or Minimal Risk on the Spring 2025 FastBridge "aReading" Assessment.

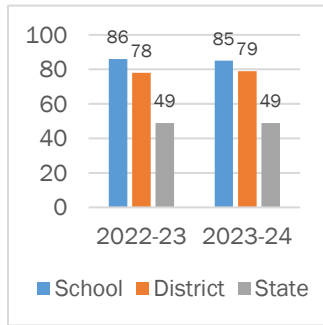

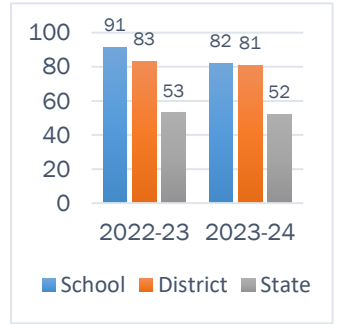
3rd Grade English Language Arts



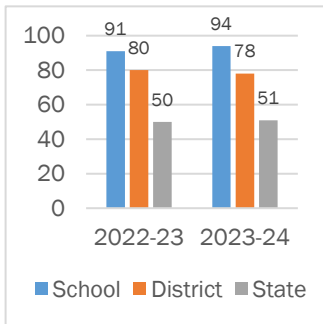
4th Grade English Language Arts



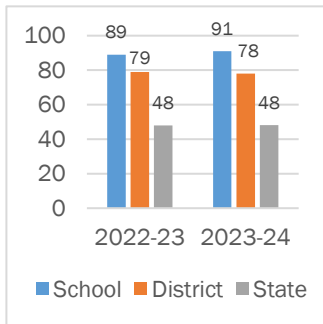
5th Grade English Language Arts



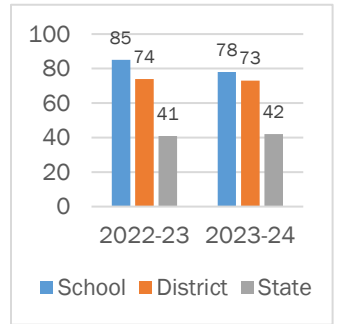
3rd Grade Math



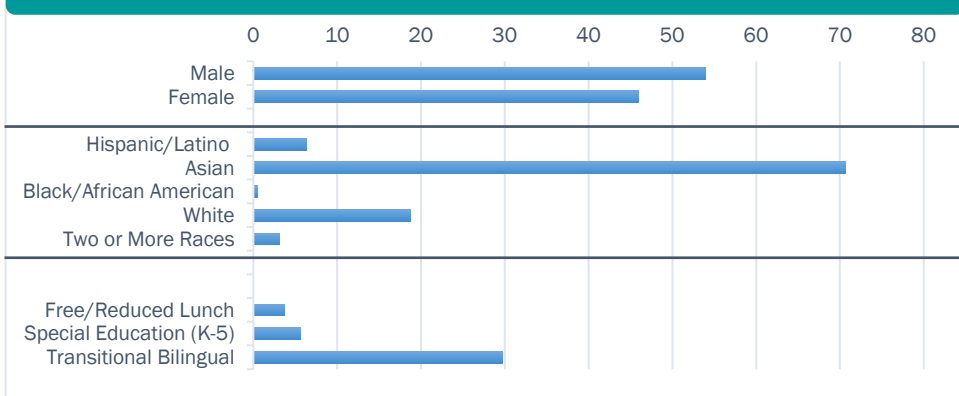
4th Grade Math
